To Samuel Drew:- a constable in the town of Glenburn, in said county.

Greeting:

In the name of the State of Maine you are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants of the said town of Glenburn, qualified by law to vote in town affairs to assemble at the Town Hall in said town on the 8th day of March, 1937, at 10:00 o'clock in the forenoon, to act on the following articles, to wit:

- Art. 1 To choose a Moderator to preside at said meeting.
 - Art. 2. To choose a Town Clerk for the ensuing year.
- Art. 3 To act on report of Town Officers for the past year.
- Art. 5 To choose Selectmen, Assessors and Overseers of the Poor for the ensuing year.
- Art. 6 To choose one or more Road Commissioners for the ensuing year.
- Art. 7 To choose a member of the School Board to serve for three years.
 - Art. 8 To choose all other necessary town officers.

- Art. 9 To see what sums of money the town will vote to raise for Common Schools, High School Tuition, School House repairs, and School Appliances.
- Art. 10 To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for Highways and Bridges.
- Art. 11 To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for snow removal on State Aid, Third Class and Town Highways.
- Art. 12 To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of \$250.00 for Maintenance State Aid Patrol.
- Art. 13 To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of \$250.00 for Third Class Highway Maintenance.
- Art. 14 To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the purpose of purchasing material for the construction of a section of Special Resolve Road, on the Orono Road so-called.
- Art. 15 To see what sum the town will vote to raise for improvement of Kelley Road.
- Art. 16 To see what sum the town will appropriate for State Aid road construction (in addition to the amounts regularly raised for the care of ways, highways and bridges under the provisions of Sec. 19, Chap. 28, Revised Statutes of 1930, or under the provisions of Section 3, Chapter 173, Public Laws of 1935.)
- Art. 17 To see what sum the town will vote to appropriate to buy snow fences.
- Art. 18 To see what sum, if any, the town would recommend to take from the joint State and account for the purpose of applying bituminous surface treatment to State Aid roads, in excess of the requirements of Section 2, Chapter 132, P. L. 1935.

- Art. 19 To establish wages for men and teams on the town roads.
- Art. 20 To see if the town will authorize the Town Treasurer and board of Selectmen to sell and convey, in the name of the inhabitants of the town, the interest in any real estate which the town may have acquired by virtue of proceedings for the collection of taxes.
- Art. 21 To see what sum the town will appropriate for health and sanitation.
- Art. 22 To see what sum the town will appropriate for protection of persons and property.
- Art. 23 To see what sum the town will appropriate for charities and corrections.
- Art. 24 To see what sum the town will appropriate for General Government.
- Art. 25 To see what sum the town will appropriate to enable the schools and citizens to have the use of the Bangor Public Library.
- Art. 26 To see what sum the town will appropriate to burn brush on town roads and to appropriate the sum of \$363.00, which was expended in the year 1936 for cutting bushes on town ways.
- Art. 27 To see what action the town will vote to take in regard to repairing the Town Hall and appropriate or hire money for the purpose.
- Art. 28 To see what sum the town will appropriate to pay on Rena M. Leighton's note.
- Art. 29 To see what sum the town will appropriate to pay interest.

- Art. 30 To see if the sum of \$28.00 or more, will be raised for school nursing in the town under the auspices of the Bureau of Health of the State Department of Health and Welfare.
- Art. 31 To see if the town will authorize the treasurer, with the consent of the selectmen, to hire money necessary to meet bills during the municipal year, in anticipation of, and to be paid out of, the current year's taxes, and to execute and deliver the negotiable promisory note or notes of the town therefor.
- Art. 32 To see what action the town will take relating to the collection of taxes.
- Art. 33 To see what action the town will take in regard to mowing graves in the unnamed cemetery on the land of W. A. Simmons to the addition to Lakeview Cemetery.
- Art. 34 To see what action the town will take in regard to improving and laying out the addition to Lakeview Cemetery.
- Art. 35 To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.

The selectmen give notice that they shall be in session for the purpose of revising and correcting the list of voters at the town hall at 9:00 o'clock in the forenoon, on the day of said meeting.

Hereof fail not and make due return of this warrant with your doings thereon not later that 10:00 o'clock in the forenoon of the day of the meeting.
