To George H. Cookson:-a constable in the town of Glenburn in said county.

Greeting:

In the name of the State of Maine, you are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants of the said town of Glenburn, qualified by law to vote in town affairs, to assemble at the Town Hall in said town on the 14th day of March, 1938, at 10:00 o'clock in the forenoon, to act on the following articles, to wit:

- Art. 1. To choose a Moderator to preside at said meeting
- Art. 2. To choose a Town Clerk for the ensuing year.
- Art. 3. To act on reports of town officers for the past year.
- Art. 4. To choose a Town Treasurer for the ensuing year.
- Art. 5. To choose Selectmen, Assessors and Overseers of Poor for the ensuing year.
- Art. 6. To choose one or more Road Commissioners for the ensuing year.

- Art. 7. To choose a member of the School Board for three years.
- Art. 8. To choose all other necessary town officers.
- Art. 9. To see if the town will elect a Cemetery Board of three members (not sextons) to have general supervision of cemeteries.
- Art. 10. To see what sums of money the town will vote to raise for Common Schools, High School Tuition, School House Repairs and School Appliances.
- Art. 11. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for Highways and Bridges.
- Art. 12. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for snow removal on State Highways, State Aid, Third Class and Town Highways.
- Art. 13. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for Patrol Maintenance on State Aid Highways.
- Art. 14. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for maintenance of Third Class Highway.
- Art. 15. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to purchase material for the construction of a section of Special Legislative Aid Road on the Orono Road.
- Art. 16. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for Health and Sanitation.
- Art. 17. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for protection of persons and property.
- Art. 18. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for charities and corrections.

- Art. 19. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for General Government.
- Art. 20. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to pay interest.
- Art. 21. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of \$29.00 to be expended for school nursing under supervision of the Bureau of Health of the State Department of Health and Welfare.
- Art. 22. To see what sum the town will appropriate for State Aid Construction (in addition to the amounts regularly raised for the care of ways, highways and bridges) under the provisions of Section 3, Chapter 229, Public Laws of 1937.
- Art. 23. To see what sum, if any, the town would recommend to take from the joint State aid account for the purpose of applying bituminous surface treatment to state aid roads in excess of the requirements of Section 2, Chapter 132, Public Laws of 1935.
- Art. 24. To see if the town will authorize the Town Treasurer and Board of Selectmen to sell and convey, in the name of the inhabitants of the town, the interest in any real estate which the town may have acquired by virtue of proceedings for the collection of taxes.
- Art. 25. To see if the town will authorize the Treasurer, with the consent of the Selectmen, to hire money necessary to meet bills during the municipal year, in anticipation of and to be paid out of the current year's taxes and to execute and deliver the negotiable promissory note or notes of the town therefor.
- Art. 26. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to enable the school to have the use of the Bangor Public Library.

- Art. 27. To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money and what amount to cut and burn bush on town highways.
- Art. 28. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of \$1,550.00 to pay overdrawn accounts.
- Art. 29. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of \$230.00 to pay for the vault door.
- Art. 30. To see what action the town will take in relation to collection of taxes.
- Art. 31. To see what sum of money the town will vote to pay on town debt.
- Art. 32. To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.

The selectmen give notice that they will be in session for the purpose of revising and correcting the list of voters, at the town hall at 9:00 o'clock in the forenoon on the day of the meeting.

Hereof fail not and make due return of this warrant with your doings thereon not later than 10:00 o'clock in the forenoon of the day of the meeting.
