

#### FREE HIGH SCHOOLS.

Two Free High schools closed in town Apr. 9, 1897, under the superintendency of Mr. David Atkins. East Peru school taught by Ada E. Gerrish; attendance, 35; average attendance, 27; cost of instruction, \$90. West Peru, taught by Joseph A. Putnam, attendance, 41; average attendance, 35; cost for instruction, \$100. Both of the above schools were reported by Mr. Atkins as successful.
