CONCLUSION

I wish to call your attention to the following items: The wages of the teachers and janitors have been cut from 25 to 40 per cent in the past two years.

The work of some of the teachers has been greatly increased, especially at West Peru. Another teacher is needed in that district.

The total enrollment of pupils continues to grow. More room must be provided at West Peru.

The attendance the past year has been excellent. Special mention should be made of the fine record of Christine Luce of East Peru.

The amount recommended for repairs may seem too high but more improvements than usual are necessary. The toilets of all the schools except the Knox are in very poor condition and considerable money must be expended to make them suitable for next year.

In closing I thank all citizens of Peru who are assisting in any way to improve the schools.
