CONCLUSION

The attendance in the schools the past year has been better than usual, as there have been fewer interruptions in the work on account of illness. The number of pupils not absent continues to increase from year to year, and many pupils have records that are a great credit to them and to their parents. I mention parents, because they can do much in making good attendance records.

No school has been maintained in the Knox District since last June. The number of children accommodated by a school in that part of the town is so small that it is not profitable to continue it.

There is an extra teacher at West Peru this year; as there are only two school rooms in the building it was decided to have a long forenoon session for the primary grades and a long afternoon session for the intermediate grades. This arrangement seems to be satisfactory to a big majority of the parents and pupils, because they can see that better work is accomplished in the short day with fewer pupils in the room than under the crowded conditions that existed last year when all the children were required to remain at the building all day.

Again I wish to call attention to the necessity for improvement in toilet accommodations in all the schools. Something must be done before another school year. For this purpose we are asking for an increase of \$400.00 in the appropriation for Repairs and Equipment.

In closing I take this opportunity to thank all the citizens of Peru who have rendered any assistance to the schools during the past year.
