Since the opening of the school year Elwin Child, Leon Child and Donald Lane have withdrawn from Stephens High. Carl Putnam has withdrawn from Dixfield High. At present we have 35 pupils in high school. Next year the approximate number will be 47.

# NEW SCHOOL BUILDING

On December 17 the New School Building was dedicated. Large delegations from all the districts of the town were present and considerable interest was manifested in the program. Mrs Hilda Dragoon, Chairman of the

School Board, was unable to be present on account of illness, so she invited Mrs Clementine Walker, the second member of the Board, to preside at the meeting. Mrs Stella Wiken, the third member of the Board, was present, and attended to many duties that helped to make the dedication a success.

Rev. Ernest M. Jones, Pastor of the West Peru Church, offered the dedication prayer. The speakers of the evening were R, J. Libby and E. E. Roderick of the State Department of Education, and Frank McGoudrick, Superintendent of schools. Each school in town furnished a number for the program. Music for the exercises was furnished by the West Peru Orchestra.

During the evening an opportunity was given the visitors to inspect the building, and they agreed that Mr. Libby was right when he stated in his address that "Peru now has a school building that is a school building."

The first term in this building opened Wednesday, January 6th, 1937; all West Peru pupils, Dickvale, and the children in the Union and Knox districts are now enrolled in the new school.
