



The total budget is \$695.71 more than last year. On account of increase in teachers' salaries and conveyance of pupils it is necessary to have \$500 more for Common Schools. High School Tuition will require at least \$300 more to take care of the increase in high school enrollment. Superintendence calls for \$38 more as the joint committee of the four towns in the school union voted to restore a part of the decrease made in the salary at the time of the depression. During that period the total salary was cut \$285. The amount for Repairs and Equipment is \$50 less. No appropriation is needed from the school department for Insurance. The other items in the budget call for the same amounts as last year.

CONCLUSION

In closing this report I wish to thank the School Committee and other Town Officials for their kind cooperation and many favors. To the Citizens, I wish to express my appreciation for the support they have given me during my administration of the schools.

WARRANT FOR ANNUAL TOWN MEETING.

STATE OF MAINE COUNTY OF OXFORD, ss.

To Esbjorn Wiken, a Constable of the Town of Peru in the County of Oxford, Greeting:

You are hereby required, in the name of the State of Maine, to notify and warn the inhabitants of the Town of Peru, qualified to vote in Town affairs to assemble at the Town Hall, in said Town, on Monday, the second day of March, A. D. 1942, at ten o'clock in the forenoon, to act on the following articles, to wit:

Art. 1. To choose a Moderator to preside at said meeting.

Art. 2. To choose a Clerk for the ensuing year.

Art. 3. To see if the Town will vote to accept the report of the several Town Officers.

Art. 4. To see if the Town will vote to instruct the Selectmen to appoint one or more Road Commissioners for the ensuing year.

Art. 5. To see if the Town will vote to elect one or more Road Commissioners.

Art. 6. To choose all necessary Town Officers.

Art 7. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the maintenance and support of Schools, the Poor Maintenance, the Repair of Roads and Bridges, the Maintenance of State and State Aid, and Third Class Roads, and to defray all other necessary Town charges.

Art. 8. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for State Aid Road Construction in addition to the amounts regularly raised for the care of ways, highways and bridges under the provisions of Section 19, Chapter 28, Revised Statutes of 1930, or under the provisions of Section 3, Chapter 229, Public Laws of 1937.

Art. 9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$62.00 for Public Health Nursing to be expended under the auspices of the Bureau of Health of the State Dept. of Health and Welfare.

Art. 10. To see if the Town will vote to take over the Peru Fire Department of the P. F. P. A.

Art. 11. To see if the Town will vote to raise money, and how much, for Maintenance and buying Equipment for Fire Dept.

Art. 12. To see if the Town will vote to elect a Fire Chief, or leave in hands of the Selectmen to appoint one.

Art. 13. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate toward the Maintenance of the P.

F. P. A.

Art. 14. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for payment on Long Time Loans.

Art. 15. To see whether or not the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 for advertising our natural resources, said money to be expended through the State of Maine Publicity Bureau.

Art. 16. To see whether or not the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200.00 for control of White Pine Blister, said money to be expended through the State of Maine Forest Service.

Art. 17. To see if the Town will vote to accept the Cemetery Trust Fund of Gusta Williams Lovejoy.

Art. 18. To fix the compensation of the Collector of Taxes.

Art. 19. To see if the Town will vote to allow the Selectmen to sell and convey by quit claim deed any or all property acquired under tax liens.

Art. 20. To see if the Town will vote to allow the Selectmen to sell and convey the Union School Lot, the Burchard Malone Lot, and the William Gross Lot, should they receive an advantageous offer for any of them.

Art. 21. To see if the Town will vote to instruct the Selectmen to transfer the unexpended balances of the different accounts in 1941 to the same accounts in 1942.

Art. 22. To see if the Town will authorize the Town Treasurer with the approval of the Selectmen to hire such sums of money as may be necessary to pay Town charges and Town Debts, in anticipation of the collection of taxes and to issue and negotiate the notes of the Town for the money so borrowed to an amount not exceeding in the aggregate the total tax levy for the preceding municipal year as temporary loans to be paid during the year 1942 out of money raised during

said year 1942 by taxes.

Art. 23. To see if the Town will vote to raise money, and how much, to get more water for the West Peru School, or take any action relative thereto.

Art. 24. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

The Selectmen give notice that they will be in session at the Town Hall, in Peru, at 9 o'clock in the forenoon, on the 2nd day of March, A. D. 1942, for the purpose of correcting the list of voters.
