This list contains thirty-five names. Approximately eight of these students will be removed from the list by High School graduation in June, and about sixteen will be added as Freshmen next Fall, making the total number of pupils in High Schools forty-three.

REPAIRS AND EQUIPMENT

The sum of \$300.00 was raised for Repairs and Equipment, and there was a balance of \$50.03, making the amount of \$350.03 available.

The expenditures were as follows: \$44.70 for new grates for the furnace; \$3.50 for tuning the piano; \$94.63 for labor and material for interior painting; \$7.44 for lumber; \$50.00 for repairs in toilet rooms and other parts of the basement; \$16.25 for labor and material for minor repairs. Total amount, \$216.52. Subtracting this sum from \$350.03 leaves a balance of \$133.52 on hand.

CHARLES GAMMON GIFT FOR BOOKS

By the will of Charles Gammon the sum of \$500.00 was left to the Peru School Department for the purchase of books. The Superintending School Committee voted to use the money for books for the school library. We have expended \$194.51 to date for reference books and will use the remainder of the account as needed.

I am sure the citizens of Peru join with the school officials in an expression of appreciation for such a useful gift for the boys and girls Mr. Gammon liked so much. It was very kind and thoughtful of him to remember them in his will.

FINANCES

The receipts in the school department are \$15,510.49 and the expenditures, \$12,216.54. There is a balance of \$983.19 in the Common School Account; in the High School Tuition, \$1,853.25; in Repairs and Equipment, \$133.52; in Superintendence, \$18.50; and in the Gammon Account, \$305.49; making the total unexpended, \$3,293.95. There are no overdrafts.

All items in the budget are the same as last year with the exception of the one for High School Tuition which is \$300.00 less. As we have a large balance on hand in this account it may seem that we might reduce the appropriation for next year by more than \$300.00, but it would not be advisable to do so as the high schools are finding it necessary to raise the charge for tuition about thirty per cent.

CONLUSIONS

The big job these days is to do all we can to help WIN THE WAR, and the boys and girls of Peru are doing that by buying more and more War Bonds and Stamps. For the last 25 weeks of the school year ending June, 1944, they purchased \$2,408.25 worth of Bonds and Stamps. In 15 weeks of the present school year they bought enough to amount to \$1,474.25. Much credit is due the West Peru Mother's Club for this splendid sale because it has been sponsored and conducted by that organization.

I cannot close this report as Superintendent of the Peru Schools without expressing my deep appreciation of the whole-hearted support that has been accorded me by the Superintending School Committee, the other town officials and the teaching staff, as well as the pupils and their parents.

REPORT OF THE PUBLIC HEALTH NURSE—1944 PERU

The past year has marked considerable progress in the acceptance of rules for healthful living by the citizens of your community. This has been evidenced by the fact that communicable disease was reasonably well controlled in the schools, and by the excellent response to the school immunization program. Ninety-four children received the school test for Diphtheria with the necessary Diphtheria immunization following, and fifteen children were vaccinated for Smallpox. The school program also included examination by audiometer of all children from the 4th grade.

The success of health teaching in the home is indicated somewhat by the very fine attendance of thirty-two children of infant or pre-school age at the two Child Health Conferences. Besides receiving immunizations, several defects were found in the children which have since been corrected. The cooperation of local organizations has aided this function of the Public Health Nurse most effectively.

A total of sixty-eight visits were made to individual homes. Not only principles of health living were taught, but several vision corrections and tonsillectomies were obtained. It is heart warming to realize that five children in the community with some type of crippling condition have received benefit of the Crippled Children's Service, with home supervision by the Public Health Nurse.

The very excellent cooperation of the people of Peru has made the long road of Public Health a little less rough and long. It is hoped that your nurse, in turn, can make the road to individual health more accessible to you.

WARRANT FOR ANNUAL TOWN MEETING

State of Maine

To Esbjorn Wiken, a Constable of the Town of Peru in the County of Oxford,

Greeting:

You are hereby required, in the name of the State of Maine, to notify and warn the inhabitants of the Town of Peru, qualified to vote in town affairs to assemble at the Town Hall, in said Town, on Monday, the fifth day of March A. D. 1945, at 10 o'clock in the forenoon, to act on the following articles, to wit:

- Art. 1. To choose a Moderator to preside at said meeting.
- Art. 2. To choose a Clerk for the ensuing year.
- Art. 3. To see if the Town will vote to accept the report of the several Town Officers.
- Art. 4. To see if the Town will vote to instruct the Selectmen to appoint one or more Road Commissioners for the ensuing year.
- Art. 5. To see if the Town will vote to elect one or more Road Commissioners.
 - Art. 6. To choose all other necessary Town Officers.
- Art. 7. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the maintenance and support of Schools, the Poor Maintenance, the Repair and Maintenance of Roads and Bridges, the Maintenance of State and State Aid, and Third Class Roads, and to defray all other necessary Town charges.
- Art. 8. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate \$100.00 for public health nursing, said sum to be expended by the State Bureau of Health, for local service.

- Art. 9. To see if the Town will vote to instruct the committee of the Peru Center Baptist Church account to continue with the unexpended balance of 1944.
- Art. 10. To see if the Town will vote to instruct its Superintending School Committee to open and maintain a school at the East Peru School house.
- Art. 11. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the purchase of Tar for Third Class and Resolve Roads.
- Art. 12. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate to buy a Trail Blazer Blade for Tractor.
- Art. 13. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Town Owned Buildings Repairs.
- Art. 14. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate to build a Fire Proof Vault in Town Hall for Town Records.
- Art. 15. To see if the Town will vote to buy a Walter's four wheel drive truck and plow, or take any action thereto.
- Art. 16. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Walter's truck.
 - Art. 17. To fix compensation of the Collector of Taxes.
- Art. 18. To see if the Town will vote to allow the Selectmen to sell and convey by quit claim deed any or all property acquired under tax liens.
- Art. 19. To see if the Town will vote to allow the Selectmen to sell and convey the Burchard Malone lot, and the William Gross lot, should they receive an advantageous offer for either of them.
- Art. 20. To see if the Town will authorize the Town Treasurer with the approval of the Selectmen to hire such sums of money as may be necessary to pay Town charges and Town debts, in anticipation of the collection of taxes and to issue and

negotiate the notes of the Town for the money so borrowed to an amount not exceeding in the aggregate the total tax levy for the preceding municipal year as temporary loans to be paid during the year 1945 out of money raised during said year 1945 by taxes.

Art. 21. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

The Selectmen give notice that they will be in session at the Town Hall, in Peru, at 9 o'clock in the forenoon, on the fifth day of March, A. D. 1945, for the purpose of correcting the list of voters.
