REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS For the Year Ending, February 17, 1908.

Gentlemen of the School Committee and Citizens of the Town of Gouldsboro.

I have the honor to submit the following report of the condition of the schools and expenditures for the past year.

Our schools for the past year have been very satisfactory. It has been the intention to procure good teachers that were known, or who had references and recommendations that were satisfactory, but in some schools there may be some that find fault, in other districts the same teacher We have had schools in all our districts will be a success. for the past year. In our smaller schools the terms have had more weeks as they have had but two terms a year, We have had some of our teachers for the year in the same school. It is much better where the term has been a success. The school league has done a good work. Some books have been purchased and other things to make the school room more attractive. Our scholars that are away to take an advanced course of study are meeting with good success and some of them will graduate this year. The interest taken in the schools for the past year has been better than formerly. There has been some work for the truant officers, but in our town it seems to be hard to execute the law as in other places. We have made no changes in the text-books, but it may be desirable or better to make an exchange this year in some of them that we had for some years and are much worn. The school buildings are in very good condition; the school rooms have good seats; everything is

arranged so as to be comfortable tor the teachers and scholars,
