REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS For the year ending February 15, 1909.

Gentlemen of the School Committee and Citizens of the town of Gouldsboro.

I have the honor to submit the following report of the condition of the schools and expenditures for the past year.

We have had schools in every district in the town a part of the year, making twelve schools in the town. The school at Gouldsboro, by a vote of the town was graded. The school committee made a contract and the schoolhouse was enlarged to make another room which was done to the satisfaction of the committee, and I think to the district. Now they have a good school building, of which the town should be pleased, with the usual repairs that they will need from time to time. Our school buildings are very satisfactory. The school league in several districts are procuring every year many things that are useful to the scholars, ornamental to the school room. We had on April first, nineteen hundred eight, three hundred and forty-eight scholars, a gain from the year previous. Your school board have done the best they could to procure teachers that would prove satisfactory. have failed, many things must be taken into the matter, some personal things may come up when the teacher may be all right upon investigating. The number of schools we are supporting, the wages we are obliged to pay. town does not raise money enough to give us the number of school weeks we should have. We have several scholars that are taking an advance course of study in our best preparatory schools that are doing good work,



and are in hopes another school year there will be more. We think it advisable to exchange our readers, they have been in use for many years, are very much worn. New books that are now published are preferable to those we, are using. We have a bill to pay the town of Sullivan, also one to collect from the town of Winter Harbor, so the finances of the school fund will remain very much the same. We have had in the most of our schools, the winter terms, sickness that has been very prevalent, so the average attendance will be much less than at many terms.
