I hereby submit my eighth annual report as superintendent of schools, for the fiscal year ending Feb. 20, 1931.

Mrs. Evelyn Morse resigned as teacher at the end of the fall term. We regretted very much to have her leave. Miss Harriet E. Niles of Oakland was elected to fill the vacancy. Miss Niles has had considerable experience and is a capable teacher. I feel sure that the school will make rapid progress under her management.

Warrant for Town Meeting

County of Knox

State of Maine

To Llewellyn Rich, a constable of the Town of Isle au Haut, Greeting:

In the name of the State of Maine, you are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants of the said town of Isle au Haut qualified by the law to vote in town affairs, to assemble at Revere Hall in said town on Monday, March 16, A. D. 1931, at nine o'clock in the forenoon, to act on the following articles, to wit:

- Art. 1. To choose a moderator to preside at said meeting.
- Art. 2. To choose a town clerk for ensuing year.
- Art. 3. To choose a board of selectmen for the ensuing year.
- Art. 4. To choose assessors of taxes.
- Art. 5. To choose overseers of poor.
- Art. 6. To choose a collector of taxes and excise tax and vote his compensation.
 - Art. 7. To choose a treasurer and vote his compensation.
 - Art. 8. To choose a member of school board for three years.
- Art. 9. To see if the town will vote to elect a road commissioner, one or more, fix his term of office, not to exceed three years; have the selectmen appoint, or they themselves, act as commissioner as is provided by Chapter 92 of the Public Laws of 1919 or act on anything relating thereto.
 - Art. 10. To choose a sealer of weights and measures.
 - Art. 11. To choose two or more constables.
 - Art. 12. To choose a fire warden and vote his compensation.
 - Art. 13. To choose surveyors of wood and lumber.
- Art. 14. To see what sum of money the town will raise and appropriate for current expenses.
- Art. 15. To see what sum of money the town will raise and appropriate for schools, including text books and supplies and high school tuition.

- Art. 16. To see what sum of money the town will raise and appropriate for schoolhouse repairs.
- Art. 17. To see what sum of money the town will raise and appropriate for the superintendent of schools' salary.
- Art. 18. To see if the town will vote "yes" or "no" on the question of raising and appropriating money necessary to entitle the town to state aid, as provided in Section 19, Chapter 25, of the Revised Statutes of 1916.
- Art. 19. To see if the town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$300.00 for the section of State aid road, as outlined in the report of the state highway commission, in addition to amounts regularly raised for the care of ways, highways and bridges, the above under the provisions of Section 18, Chapter 25, of the Revised Statutes of 1916.
- Art. 20. To see what sum of money the town will raise and appropriate for repairs on roads and bridges.
- Art. 21. To see what sum of money the town will raise and appropriate for repairs of the state aid roads.
- Art. 22. To see what sum of money the town will raise and appropriate for roads, snow bills.
- Art. 23. To see what sum of money the town will raise and appropriate to pay the men on state road, difference in wages between state wages and town wages.
- Art. 24. To see what sum of money the town will raise and appropriate for the maintenance of Town Hall, including repairs and insurance.
- Art. 25. To see what sum of money the town will raise and appropriate for the Mothers' Aid fund.
- Art. 26. To see what action the town will take relative to the purchase of an adding machine for the town officers' use, and how much money it will raise for same.
- Art. 27. To see if the town will raise and appropriate the sum of ten dollars towards the support of county public nursing under the state department of health, to continue work with mothers and children.
- Art. 28. To see if the town will vote for the treasurer to hire, with the approval of the selectmen, whatever money may be required to defray town expense for the ensuing year.
- Art. 29. To see if the town will vote a certain date, on or before which all taxes will be paid, also decide on a rate of interest for all taxes unpaid after that date, or act anything relating thereto.

Art. 30. To act on any other business that may come before said meeting.

The selectmen hereby give notice that they will be in session for the purpose of revising and correcting the list of voters, at Revere Memorial Hall, at nine oclock in the forenoon on date of said meeting.
