# Warrant for Town Meeting

County of Knox

State of Maine

To H. B. Nevells, a constable of the town of Isle au Haut, Greeting:

In the name of the State of Maine, you are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants of said town of Isle au Haut, qualified by law to vote in town affairs to assemble at Revere Memorial Hall, in said town, on Monday, March 19th. 1934 at nine o'clock in the forenoon, to act on the following articles, to wit:

- Art. 1. To choose a moderator to preside at said meeting.
- Art. 2. To choose a town clerk for ensuing year.
- Art. 3. To choose a board of selectmen for ensuing year.
- Art. 4. To choose assessors of taxes.
- Art. 5. To choose overseer of poor.
- Art. 6. To choose a collector of taxes and excise tax and vote his compensation.
  - Art. 7. To choose a treasurer and vote his compensation.
  - Art. 8. To choose a member of school board for three years.
- Art. 9. To see if the town will vote to elect a road commissioner, one or more, fix his term of office, not to exceed three years, have the selectmen appoint or they themselves, act as commissioners, as provided by Chapter 92 of the Public Laws of 1919, or act anything relating thereto.
  - Art. 10. To choose a sealer of weights and measures.
  - Art. 11. To choose two or more constables.
  - Art. 12. To choose a fire warden and vote his compensation.
  - Art. 13. To choose surveyors of wood and lumber.
- Art. 14. To see what sum of money the town will raise and appropriate for current expenses.
- Art. 15. To see what action the town will take in regard to school for ensuing year.
- Art. 16. To see what sum of money the town will raise and appropriate for schools, including text books, supplies and high school tuition.
- Art. 17. To see what sum of money the town will raise and appropriate for school house repairs.
- Art. 18. To see what sum of money the town will raise and appropriate for the Superintendent of School salary.
- Art. 19. To see if the town will vote "yes" or "no" on the question of raising and appropriating money necessary to entitle the town to State aid as provided in Section 19, Chapter 25, of the Revised Statutes of 1916.

- Art. 20. To see if the town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$300.00 for the section of State Aid roads, as outlined in the report of the state highway commission in addition to amount regularly raised for the care of ways, highways and bridges, the above under the provisions of section 18, chapter 25, of the Revised Statutes of 1916.
- Art. 21. To see what sum of money the town will raise and appropriate for roads and bridges.
- Art. 22. To see what sum of money the town will raise and appropriate for repairs on State Aid roads.
- Art. 23. To see if the town will vote to buy a truck for road work and raise money for same.
- Art. 24. To see if the town will vote to buy a snow plow, and raise money for same.
- Art. 25. To see what sum of money the town will raise and appropriate for roads' snow bills.
- Art. 26. To see what sum of money the town will raise and appropriate for the maintenance of town hall, including repairs and insurance.
- Art. 27. To see if the town will raise and appropriate the sum of fifteen dollars towards the support of county public nursing under the State Department of Health and Welfare to continue work with mothers and children.
- Art. 28. To see if the town will vote for the treasurer to open a checking account in Knox County Trust Co., or act anything relating thereto.
- Art. 29. To see if the town will vote for the treasurer to hire, with the approval of the selectmen, whatever money may be required to defray expenses for ensuing year.
- Art. 30. To see if the town will vote a certain date, on or before which all taxes will be paid, also decide on a rate of interest for all taxes unpaid after that date, or act on anything relating thereto.
- Art. 31. To act on any other business that may come before said meeting.

The selectmen hereby give notice that they will be in session for the purpose of revising and correcting list of voters at Revere Memorial Hall, at nine o'clock in forenoon, on date of said meeting.
