

I herewith submit the following report of your schools for the fiscal year ending Feb 23, 1935.

Warrant for Town Meeting.

County of Knox

State of Maine

To H. B. Nevells, a constable of the town of Isle au Haut, Greetings:

In the name of the State of Maine, you are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants of said town of Isle au Haut, qualified to vote in town affairs, to assemble at Revere Memorial Hall in said town, on Monday. March 18, 1935, at nine o'clock in the forenoon, to act on the fellowing articles, to wit:

- Art. 1. To choose a moderator to preside at said meeting.
 - Art. 2. To choose a town clerk for the ensuing year
- Art. 3. To choose a board of selectmen for the ensuing year.
 - Art. 4. To choose assessors of taxes.
 - Art. 5. To choose overseers of poor.
- Art. 6. To choose a collector of taxes and excise tax and vote his compensation.
- Art. 7. To choose a treasurer and vote his compensation.
- Art. 8. To choose a member of school board for three years.
- Art. 9. To see if the town will vote to elect a road commissioner, one or more, fix his term of office, not to exceed three years, have the selectmen appoint, or they themselves act as commissioners, as provided by Chapter 40 of the Public Laws of 1932, or act anything relating thereto.
 - Art. 10 To choose a sealer of weights and measures.
 - Art. 11. To choose two or more constables.
- Art. 12. To choose a fire warden and vote his compensation.
 - Art. 13. To choose surveyors of wood and lumber.
- Art. 14. To see what sum of money the town will raise and appropriate for current expenses.

- Art. 15.- To see what action the town will take in regard to school for the ensuing year.
- Art. 16. To see what sum of money the town will raise and appropriate for schools, including text-books, supplies and high school tuition.
- Art. 17. To see what sum of money the town will raise and appropriate for schoolhouse repairs.
- Art. 18. To see what sum of money the town will raise and appropriate for Sup't. of Schools salary.
- Art. 19. To see if the town will vote "Yes" or "No" on the question of appropriating and raising money necessary to entitle the town to State Aid, as provided in Sect 20, Chap. 28, Revised Statutes of 1930.
- Art. 20. To see what sum of money the town will appropriate and raise for the improven ent of the section of State Aid road as outlined in the report of the State Highway Commission (in addition to the amounts regularly raised for the care of ways, highways and bridges) under the provisions of Sec. 19, Chap. 28, Revised Statutes of 1930, or under the provisions of Sec. 3, Chap. 175, Public Laws of 1933.
- Art. 21. To see if the town will vote to accept and maintain as a town way, the private road leading from the Yeaton line to the Jones driveway at Moore's Harbor, the same to be three rods wide.
- Art. 22. To see what sum of money the town will appropriate and raise for the maintenance of roads and bridges.
- Art. 23. To see what sum of money the town will appropriate and raise for the repairs on State Aid Roads.
- Art. 24. To see what sum of money the town will appropriate and raise for the removal of snow.
- Art. 25. To see what sum of money the town will appropriate and raise to buy or lease a lot for a town garage.
- Art. 26. To see if the town will vote to build a town garage of sufficient size to house all the town macninery, raise money for the same, or act anything relating thereto.
- Art. 27. To see what sum of money the town will appropriate and raise for the maintenance of Revere Memorial Hall.

Art. 28. To see what sum of money the town will appropriate and raise to pay the debt on the new truck or act anything relating thereto.

Art. 29. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to issue notes for temporary loans.

Art. 30 To see if the town will vote a certain date, on or before which all taxes will be paid, also decide on a rate of interest for all taxes unpaid after that date, or act anything relating thereto.

Art. 31 To act on any other business that may come before said meeting.

The Selectmen hereby give notice that they will be in session for the purpose of revising and correcting the list of voters at Revere Memorial Hall, at nine o'clock in the forenoon, on date of said meeting.
