REPORT OF THE SCHOOL DEPARTMENT

To the Superintending School Committee and Citizens of Isle au Haut:

I herewith submit my fourth annual report as Superintendent of Schools for the fiscal year ending February 1, 1947:

The school enrollment was 14. The enrollment by grades was as follows: Sub-primary 2, grade one 2, grade two 3, grade four 2, grade six 2, grade seven 2, grade eight 1.

We were very fortunate to secure Mrs. Blanche Ogden as teacher for the Isle au Haut school. Under her efficient direction the school is making excellent progress.

The problem of conveyance for the school children has been a very difficult one to solve. Last fall it was necessary to find a new way of conveying the children as Mrs. Turner was no longer able to transport them. As there was no one else with a car, it was recommended that the town raise a sufficient sum to purchase their own school bus. A sum of \$1500.00 was raised at a special town meeting, but it was found impossible to purchase either a new or second-hand beach wagon which would have answered the purpose. The emergency was met through the kindness of Mrs. Eustis of the Isle au Haut Land Company, who volunteered the use of their beach wagon until March 1st of this year. Through the help of Mr. Neal Bousfield of The Maine Sea Coast Mission, we have been promised a new Jeep beach wagon before the first day of March. However, the cost will probably be at least \$150.00 more than the amount raised.

The state is recommending this year that a minimum salary of \$1500.00 be paid all teachers. Surely this is little enough under present living conditions. If this bill is passed, it will necessitate raising more money for your teacher, though part of it will be met by the state.

I would recommend that storm windows be purchased for the schoolhouse. With this improvement, I feel that the new oil heater would satisfactorily heat the school building.

It will be necessary to increase your school budget by at least \$600.00 this year. Not only will you have two students attending high school, but all school costs have increased considerably.

I wish to thank the school committee, teachers and people of Isle au Haut for their kindness and understanding shown throughout the four years I have been their superintendent.

COMMENTS

Re: Audit of the Town of Isle au Haut
February 1, 1945 to February 1, 1946

The financial status of the town is presented on the Balance Sheet and comments regarding the various items are as follows:

CASH—\$2,785.78:

The cash balance at the close of the year was on deposit with the Knox County Trust Company. The check book balance was reconciled with the bank statement as of February 26, 1946, and found to be in agreement.

TAXES—\$74.59:

The records of the Tax Collector were examined and the warrant of commitment was found in agreement with the Assessors' records. The commitment was accounted for by cash paid to the Treasurer in the amount of \$3,496.24, and taxes remaining uncollected as of February 1, 1946 in the amount of \$68.62. Prior years' taxes still outstanding amount to \$5.97.

ACCOUNTS RECEIVABLE—\$1,622.78:

This receivable consists entirely of accounts due from the State, Registration Money in the amount of \$1,551.00 and Snow Removal \$71.78.

NET SURPLUS—\$4,237.15:

At the close of the municipal year, the Town had a Net Surplus of \$4,237.15. Of this amount \$2,338.88 has been set aside for definite purposes leaving only \$1,898.27 unappropriated for any specific use. A summary of the items which make up that portion which is appropriated may be found on Exhibit B. An analysis of the change in Net Surplus for the year under examination is presented on Exhibit E.

GENERAL:

The fidelity bonds of the various town officials were examined and found in order, and properly recorded.

Revenue obtained from Excise Taxes was checked and found to be accounted for and properly recorded. All revenue from this source was applied to the Administration account.

All unexpended balances required by law to be carried forward have been carried forward to the 1946 year.

Vouchers and payrolls were examined in part and those examined appeared to be proper charges to the accounts involved.

WARRANT FOR TOWN MEETING

County of Knox

State of Maine

To Hollis B. Nevells, a Constable in the Town of Isle au Haut:

GREETINGS:

In the name of the State of Maine, you are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants of said Town of Isle au Haut, qualified to vote in town affairs, to assemble at Revere Memorial Hall in said town on Monday, March 3, 1947, at nine o'clock in the forenoon, to act on the following articles, to wit:

- Art. 1. To choose a Moderator to preside at said meeting.
- Art. 2. To choose a Town Clerk for the ensuing year.
- Art. 3. To choose a Board of Selectmen for the ensuing year and vote their compensation.
- Art. 4. To choose Assessors of Taxes for the ensuing year.
- Art. 5. To choose Overseers of Poor for the ensuing year.
- Art. 6. To choose a Collector of Taxes and Excise Tax and vote his compensation.
- Art. 7. To choose a Treasurer and vote his compensation.
- Art. 8. To choose a member of the School Board for three years.
- Art. 9. To see if the town will vote to elect a Road Commissioner, one or more, fix his term of office, not to exceed three years; have the Selectmen appoint, or they themselves act as commissioners, as provided by Chapter 40 of the Public Laws of 1933, or act anything relating thereto.
- Art. 10. To choose a Sealer of Weights and Measures.

- Art. 11. To choose two or more Constables.
- Art. 12. To choose a Fire Warden and vote his compensation.
- Art. 13. To choose Surveyors of Wood and Lumber.
- Art. 14. To see what sum of money the town will appropriate and raise for Miscellaneous Expenses.
- Art. 15. To see what sum of money the town will appropriate and raise for Schools, including textbooks, supplies and high school tuition and board.
- Art. 16. To see what sum of money the town will appropriate and raise for Schoolhouse Repairs.
- Art. 17. To see what action the town will take in regard to hiring a graduate nurse during two winter months, raise money for the same or act anything relating thereto.
- Art. 18. To see what sum of money the town will appropriate and raise for the salary of Superintendent of Schools.
- Art. 19. To see if the town will vote to give the Selectmen authority to sell property taken for taxes or act anything relating thereto.
- Art. 20. To see what sum of money the town will appropriate and raise for Aid to Dependent Children.
- Art. 21. To see what sum the town will raise and appropriate for State Aid Construction (in addition to the amounts regularly raised for the care of ways, highways and bridges) under the provisions of Sections 25 and 29, Chapter 20, R. S. 1944 as amended.
- Art. 22. To see what sum of money the town will appropriate and raise for the maintenance of Town Roads and Bridges.
- Art. 23. To see what sum of money the town will appropriate and raise for Repairs on State Aid Roads.
- Art. 24. To see what sum of money the town will appropriate and raise for Snow Removal.
- Art. 25. To see what sum of money the town will appropriate and

raise for maintenance of Revere Memorial Hall.

Art. 26. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to issue notes for temporary loans, and what rate of interest to pay.

Art. 27. To see if the town will vote a certain date on or before which all taxes should be paid; to decide on a rate of interest for all taxes unpaid after that date; also to decide on a date before which all tax bills shall be issued.

Art. 28. To see what sum of money the town will raise and appropriate to pay on town note, including interest, or act anything relating thereto.

Art. 29. To act on any other business that may come before said meeting.

The Selectmen hereby give notice that they will be in session for the purpose of revising and correcting the list of voters at Selectmen's Room, Revere Memorial Hall, at 9 o'clock in the forenoon on the date of said meeting.
