Report of Superintendent of Schools

To Commissioner Peterson, The Board of Selectmen, Superintending School Committee and Citizens of the Town of Van Buren:—

In accordance with the school laws of Maine, I have the pleasure to herewith submit for your consideration the annual report of the condition and progress of the public schools of Van Buren.

The records of our enrollment for the year ending March 1st show approximately the same number as of last year registered in the elementary grades. A slight increase is noticeable in our High Schools, undoubtedly, due to the inability of our young people to find employment.

In the four urban buildings comprising the St. John, Champlain, Sacred Heart and Keegan schools, we have 1364 pupils pursuing the elementary course of study. There are 45 teachers employed in these schools, making an average of 30 pupils per teacher.

There is an enrollment of 110 pupils in six rural schools, making an average of 18 per teacher. In the urban and rural classrooms, there are 1474 pupils enrolled, receiving instruction from 51 teachers, making an average of 29 per-teacher load.

The Boys' High School this year is under the capable Principalship of Mr. James Crowley, a teacher of several years' experience in this type of work. In the short time Mr. Crowley has been with us, he has proven that no strong-arm methods of discipline are necessary in his handling of the various problems pertaining thereto. As an extra activity he has coached successfully a basketball team that is a credit to any such school.

In our High School Department we have 301 pupils, 185 girls and 116 boys. Suffice it to say that these two schools again have qualified for Class A rating from the State Department of Secondary Education, Augusta.

The Home Economics Department, situated over Thomas Michaud's store, under the direction of Sister St. Teresa of Jesus and her assistant Sister St. Emma, has carried on a most satisfactory type of work. Needless to say, the interest of the girls is rarely lacking, the results apparently effective, practical and of good standard, and merits the support of all parents.

Before the opening of schools in October, the Municipal Finance Board, under a law enacted by the last legislature, appointed Mr. Edward Peterson as Commissioner to handle municipal affairs. Only among us a few months, he has demonstrated his executive ability. Practically all school obligations have been honored when presented. The teachers have been paid to date. The Commissioner commands the respect and co-operation of the entire citizenry. May we all work harmoniously together to the end that in a few short years we may emerge from the financial nightmare that has enveloped the entire nation since collapse of 1929.

In closing this, my annual report for the School Department, I earnestly exhort all parents and citizens to visit the schools, and assure them any constructive criticism they may care to offer will be consciously welcomed by the School Committee, the teachers and myself.

Now that the occasion is mine, may I, in deepest sincerity, pay tribute to my loyal co-workers, the teachers. If any satisfaction has been obtained in the past year, it is owing to the kindness, devotedness and valuable help so generously loaned me in my endeavors to supervise the education of our girls and boys.

The schools must help to build a race of men who find their greatest satisfaction in working together for

the common good. All that we can vision of a better society and of a more abundant individual life can be accomplished through the church and school. As of yore, the ability of the community will be measured not merely by our economic resources, but also by the devotion of our citizens to the development of a society in which equality of opportunity and social justice shall prevail.

In closing, I wish to express in a special manner the appreciation of the teachers and myself for the most courteous treatment received from Commissioner Peterson, the Board of Selectmen and the School Committee.

WARRANT

To Vital Cormier, a Constable of the Town of Van Buren,
in the County of Aroostook and State of Maine,

Greeting:—

In the name of the State of Maine, you are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants of said Town of Van Buren, qualified by law to vote in town affairs, to meet and assemble at the Gayety Theater, in the said Town of Van Buren, on Tuesday, the 29th day of March, A. D. 1938, at nine o'clock in the forenoon, to act on the following articles, to wit:—

- Art. 1 To choose a Moderator to preside at said meeting.
- Art. 2 To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$4,700.00 for General Government.
- Art. 3 To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,050.00 for Roads, Sidewalks and Bridges and Winter Roads.
- Art. 4 To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$666.00 for the construction of State-Aid Highways on locations designated by the State Highway Commission.

- Art. 5 To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$433.00 for the maintenance of improved sections of Third-Class Roads, or to be used in conjunction with State funds for the construction of Third-Class Roads as designated by the State Highway Commission.
- Art. 6 To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$750.00 for State Highway Patrol Maintenance.
- Art. 7 To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$936.00 for Police Department Fees.
- Art. 8 To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 for Fire Department Supplies.
- Art. 9 To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$25.00 for Fire Inspector.
- Art. 10 To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,500.00 for Firemen's Fees.
- Art. 11 To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 for Street Lights.
- Art. 12 To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,610.00 for Hydrant Rental.
- Art. 13 To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,000.00 for the Support of Poor.

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- Art. 14 To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,180.00 for State Mothers' Aid.
- Art. 15 To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,950.00 for Dependent Children.
- Art. 16 To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$400.00 for Board at State Institutions.
- Art. 17 To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,500.00 for W. P. A. materials, to be used in conjunction with Federal funds on work projects.
- Art. 18 To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$37,500.00 for Education.
- Art. 19 To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$10,000.00 to be set apart in a Sinking Fund to apply on Town Indebtedness at such time that is determined by the Board of Emergency Municipal Finance.
- Art. 20 To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$300.00 for maintenance of Public Property, not including School Property.
- Art. 21 To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$400.00 for Insurance on Public Buildings, not including School Property.
- Art. 22 To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$25.00 for Health Officer and Supplies.

- Art. 23 To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 for Vital Statistics.
- Art. 24 To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 for Election Expense.
- Art. 25 To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1000.00 for Discounts and Abatements.
- Art. 26 To see if the Town will vote to fix a time when taxes shall become due and payable; and will vote to make any discount upon taxes paid at such time or times as it may determine, and, if so, what per cent; also, to fix a time and rate of interest to be added to taxes unpaid.
- Art. 27 To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen and Treasurer to execute and negotiate Town of Van Buren notes for a sum not greater than \$25,000.00; payable during the year within which same are made out of money raised during such current year by taxation, and bearing such rate of interest as said Selectmen and Treasurer may determine, subject to confirmation by the Board of Emergency Municipal Finance.
- Art. 28 To see if the Town will vote to lease to the Van Buren Tennis Club for the ensuing year, at the rate of \$10.00 per year, part of lots two and four and lots twenty-one and twenty-three on the College tract, so called, with the exception of the parcel now occupied by a warehouse.

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- Art. 29 To see if the Town will authorize the Town Treasurer, under the direction of the Selectmen, to sell and dispose of any Real Estate acquired by the Town for non-payment of taxes thereon, on such terms as they deem advisable, and to sign and execute for and in behalf of the Inhabitants of the Town of Van Buren quit-claim deeds for such property.
- Art. 30 To see if the Town will vote to accept the Municipal Officers' Report as printed.
- Art. 31 To see if the Town will vote to adopt Daylight-Saving Time, starting the last Sunday in April and extending to the last Sunday in September.
- Art. 32 To see if the Town will vote to rescind the vote in Article 37 of Warrant for Annual Town-Meeting dated the ninth of March, 1936, reading as follows:
- “Motion made by George J. Keegan, seconded by C. A. Richards, to adopt the Australian or Secret Ballot, and to have Selectmen, Assessors and Overseers of the Poor under the same heading. Motion carried by show of hands.
- Motion made by George J. Keegan, seconded by C. A. Richards, that all Town Officials required to be elected by ballot, according to the Statutes, be placed on the Australian ballot. Motion carried by show of hands.”
- Art. 33 To choose a member of the School Committee for three years.

- Art. 34 To see what sum of money the Town will vote to grant and raise for the payment of Insurance Premiums and Workmen's Compensation Insurance.
- Art. 35 To see what action the town will take in regard to the adoption of the following resolution:—
“WHEREAS Aroostook County, Maine, is the greatest single potato area in the United States raising approximately one-sixth of the total production in our country, and
“WHEREAS Aroostook County, Maine, has for years produced a premium table potato in American markets, and
WHEREAS Aroostook County, Maine, has won through steadfast effort the reputation of most excellent seed potatoes, and
WHEREAS, notwithstanding the excellent qualities of both table and seed potatoes, the market price for potatoes in four of the last five years has been below the cost of production, resulting in the financial prostration of the farmers within the industry, seriously damaging all business and social institutions within Aroostook County and forcing these interests to demand and resort to various forms of federal aid, and
“WHEREAS, notwithstanding the sad plight of the potato industry in the United States during the past five years, the industry was further depressed by the lowering of the tariff rate on seed potatoes in the Canadian trade agreement of 1936, and
“WHEREAS potatoes are again listed for consideration in the pending agreement with Canada,

“BE IT RESOLVED by the Town of Van Buren that further reductions on seed potatoes, or any reduction on table potatoes in the new and now pending agreements with Canada, will put additional burdens on the already overburdened and sadly depressed potato industry in the United States and further open the United States potato markets to importation of foreign potatoes amid existing conditions of over supply, with the result in continued and additional price reduction to the point of ruination of the potato industry and potato-growers in the United States, and

“BE IT RESOLVED, That a copy of these resolutions be forwarded to the Committee on Reciprocal Information at Washington, D. C., with the earnest plea that there can be no downward revision of the present tariff rates, nor an increase in any quota of importations, which are far too low to properly protect Maine and United States farmers producing potatoes.”

Art. 35 To transact all other necessary business that may properly come before said meeting.

The Selectmen will be in session at the Town Office of Van Buren on the 25th, 26th and 28th days of March, from ten o'clock in the forenoon to five o'clock in the afternoon, for the purpose of revising the lists of voters.
