TO THE EMERGENCY MUNICIPAL FINANCE BOARD
AND CITIZENS OF THE TOWN OF VAN BUREN
GREETING:

Attached hereto and becoming a part of this report is an account of the several activities entered into by the Town of Van Buren during the fiscal year ending February 28, 1941.

A thought for serious consideration is a substantial amount of property, both real and personal, being removed from the tax lists. If the question of the future operation of the mill, now held in abeyance, and the possibility of the Robert F. Cyr, property, so-called, being used for a hospital and the possibility that several pieces of property will be used as an airport. all develop to reduce the amount of property taxable then a tax must be levied on the remaining property to maintain the present standard of services rendered. This would result in a big increase in each and everyone's tax.

On December 20, 1940, the Supreme Judicial Court in Equity allowed a bill in answer to a petition filed on February 5, 1940, to determine the legality of obligations of the Town incurred previous to and unpaid on August 11th, 1937, the date when the Emergency Municipal Finance Board assumed control of the affairs of the Town. On January 11, 1941, Arthur J. Nadeau was appointed Special Master in Chancery by Harold H. Murchie, Justice, Supreme Judicial Court, to receive, examine and determine the validity and amount of all claims held against the Town as of August 11, 1937.

As will be found in this report the Emergency Aid Commission expended \$37,225.75 during the year in assisting to care for the indigent poor. Had the Town been required to provide for this expenditure as well as take care of the able-bodied men and women who are working on projects,

it would have caused an oppressive tax beyond the resources of the Town to meet. The Town has received substantial and beneficial consideration and assistance from the Works Progress Administration, the Emergency Commission, the National Youth Administration, the Surplus Commodities Division and the State of Maine.

I wish to take this opportunity to thank those who have been associated with me in the administration of the affairs of the Town for their cooperation and assistance.

REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To Commissioner Jose, Superintending School Committee and citizens of the Town of Van Buren:

In accordance with the school laws of Maine, I have the pleasure to herewith submit for your consideration the annual report of the condition and progress of the public schools of Van Buren.

Again the records of our enrollment up to the present show that we have been consistent in holding our

ground in spite of the agricultural and industrial slump. There are some items of particular interest in connection with the year's work, which, in the interest of economy, may not be touched upon.

The opening of the fall term found very few changes with teaching personnel both in the elementary and secondary divisions. However, the Flu epidemic of December and January, caused many instances of substitution but the results to date, seem to indicate that the right kind of progress is being made in spite of these necessitated replacements.

A new school bus was purchased in the fall, this being necessary owing to the increased numbers in elementary and secondary pupils coming from the rural areas into the urban schools.

Once more we have received a sizable amount from the equalization fund, guaranteeing a minimum educational program

I bespeak the cordial and whole-hearted support of the school board members and citizens interested in education, to acquaint themselves with Legislative Document no. 200, H. P. 462 and Legislative Document no 199, H. P. 461 to contact our representative and senators to use their influence in the successful passage of these two measures. The enactment of these bills would restore \$3.00 for each census child, but because of the reduction in the state school fund, this amount has shrunk to \$1.65 per pupil. In 1940 we lost approximately \$2,500.00 on this item alone and an appreciable amount in the latter bill.

Let us resolve that during the pending world crisis, when our democratic way of life itself is threatened, that whatever may be the exigencies, whatever may be the reasons for drastic reductions in appropriations one thing must not happen. There must be no serious curtailment of educa-

tional facilities. Time lost in preparing the children entrusted to our care to take their places in a world nearly all gone war mad, cannot be made up. There are only certain years in which the great majority of them can attend school, and during that period it is our solemn duty to provide full and complete education.

Fully cognizant of the difficult financial problem, of our particular area during the past year, we, who are entrusted with supervision of your educational system, have made every endeavor to make the burden as light as possible, and still maintain an acceptable program of education. The school committee, on several occasions, has visited all schools, spending some little time in each classroom, observing teacher and pupil at work, thereby, gaining a clear knowledge of any and all problems pertaining thereto.

At Sacred Heart High School the number registering in Home Economics is increasing yearly and we have reached a condition where considerable expense will be necessary in the near future for equipment etc. and the employment of an extra teacher.

The same condition as to the Agricultural Course offered at the Boys High School holds true. These suggestions are being offered for your worthy consideration and must await a more opportune moment of fulfillment.

I am pleased to state that all preliminary steps are completed, the necessary documents signed in my office as of March 4th, and forwarded to Mr. Patrick, State Supervisor of Vocational Subjects for the Defense Training Program for out of school youth between the ages of 17 to 25. This course will soon get under way and will be supervised by Mr. George Findlen, Agricultural teacher.

In closing this brief report allow me to thank the teachers once more for their kindness, devotedness and

valuable assistance so generously loaned me in my endeavors to supervise the work of education. I desire to express my personal appreciation to the members of the Van Buren School Committee for their valued assistance on all school matters. I wish to acknowledge, at this time, my thanks and those of the teachers and all connected with the schools to Mr. Jose, for his promptness in paying school bills and his interest and kindly assistance.

- Art. 32 To see if the Town will authorize the Town Treasurer, under the direction of the Selectmen, to sell and dispose of any real estate acquired by the Town for non-payment of taxes theeon, or otherwise, on such terms as they may deem advisable and to sign and execute quit-claim deeds for such property.
- Art. 33 To see if the Town will vote to adopt Daylight Saving Time, starting the last Sunday in April and extending to the last Sunday in September.

- Art. 34 To see if the Town will accept the Municipal Officers' Report as printed.
- Art. 35 To choose a Member of the School Committee for three years.
- Art. 36 To transact all other necessary business that may properly come before said meeting.
