SAGADAHOC COUNTY :

To CORNELIUS T. WILLIS, Esq., a Constable of Arrowsic, County Sagadahoc.

In the name of the State of Maine, you are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants of the said Arrowsic, qualified by law to vote in town affairs, to meet at the Town House in said town on Monday, the third day of March, 1902 at ten o'clock in the forenoon to act on the following articles, to wit:—

ART. I To choose a moderator to preside at said meeting.

ART. 2 To choose a clerk for the ensuing year.

ART. 3 To see if the town will accept the reports of Selectmen, Assessors, Superindent and School Committee.

ART. 4 To choose Selectmen, Assessors and Overseers of the Poor.

ART. 5 To choose Treasurer and Collector.

ART. 6 To choose a road Commissioner for the ensuing year.

ART. 7 To choose one member of School Committee.

ART. 8 To choose a Superintendent of Schools.

ART. 9 To choose all other necessary town officers for the year ensuing.

ART. 10 To fix a date when taxes for the year ensuing shall become due and payable.

ART. 11 To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to regulate the tolls on Arrowsic Bridge for the ensuing year.

ART. 12 To see what amount the town will vote to raise for the purchase of free text books for the school.

ART. 13 To see what amount the town will vote to raise for repairs of school houses.

ART. 14 To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for contingent expenses for the ensuing year.

ART. 15 To see what sum of money the town will vote and raise for the support of the poor for the ensuing year.

ART. 16 So see what sum of money the town will vote and raise for the support of schools for the ensuing year

ART. 17 To see what sum of money the town will vote and raise for the repairs of highways for the ensuing year.

ART. 18 To see what sum of money the town will vote and raise for the payment of town debt and interest.

ART. 19 To see if the town will vote to accept the list of jurors as prepared by the Selectmen.

The Selectmen will be in session at the town house one half hour before the time of said meeting for the porpose of correcting the list of voters. Hereof fail not and make due returns of this warrant with your doings to the Town Clerk at the time and place of holding said meeting.
