Town Warrant

SAGADAHOC SS.

To Wilder F. Hagan, a Constable of Arrowsic, County of
Sagadahoc, Greeting:

In the name of the State of Maine, you are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants of said town of Arrowsic, qualified by law to vote in town affairs, to meet at the town house in said town on the sixth day of March A. D. 1916, at 10 a. m., to act on the following articles, to wit:

Art. 1. To choose by ballot a moderator to preside at said meeting.

Art. 2. To choose by ballot a town clerk for the ensuing year.

Art. 3. To see if the town will vote to accept the report of the town officers.

Art. 4. To choose selectmen, assessors and overseers of the poor and all other necessary town officers.

Art. 5. To see if the town will vote to allow the use of the schoolhouse for religious meetings for the ensuing year.

Art. 6. To fix a date when taxes for the ensuing year shall be due and payable.

Art. 7. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the purchase of free text-booke for the ensuing year.

Art. 8. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the repair of schoolhouses for the ensuing year.

Art. 9 To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for contingent expenses for the ensuing year.

Art. 10. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the support of schools for the ensuing year.

Art. 11. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the support of poor for the ensuing year.

Art. 12. To see if the town will vote "yes" or "no" on the question of appropriating and raising money necessary to entitle the town to state aid, as provided in Section 20 of Chapter 130 of the Public Laws of 1913.

Art. 13. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the improvement of the section of state aid road as outlined in the report of the State Highway Commissioner, in addition to the amounts regularly raised for ways, highways and bridges, under the provisions of section 19 of Chapter 130 of the Public Laws of 1913.

Art. 14. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the repair of highways and bridges for the ensuing year.

Art. 15. To see what sum of money the town will vote to pay on town debt and interest for the ensuing year.

Art. 16. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to destroy brown-tail moth nests for the ensuing year.

Art. 17. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for high school tuition for the ensuing year.

Art. 18. To see whether the town will vote to raise money and what sum for the maintenance of state aid highways during the ensuing year within the limits of the town under the provisions of Section 18 of Chapter 130 of the Public Laws of 1913.

Art. 19. To see if the town will authorize the Treasurer with the approval of the selectmen, to procure loan or loans of such sums of money as may be necessary to pay demands against the town for the ensuing year.

Art. 20. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to act as agents for Arrowsic bridge for the ensuing year.

Art. 21. To provide a pound for the ensuing year.

Art. 22. To see if the town will vote to maintain a school at the North schoolhouse the ensuing year.

Art. 23. To see if the town will vote to maintain a school at the South schoolhouse the ensuing year.

Art. 24. To see if the town will vote to accept the list of jurors as prepared by the town officers.

Art. 26. To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.

The selectmen will be in session at the Town House one half hour before the appointed time of said meeting for the purpose of correcting the list of voters.

Hercof fail not and make due returns of this warrant with your doings to the town clerk at the time and place of holding said meeting.

To the Superintending School Committee and Citizens of Arrowsic:

The report of the schools for the past year is herewith submitted.

Whole number of scholars attending spring term	18
Average attendance of spring term	16
Whole number of scholars attending fall term	17
Average attendance of fall term	16
Whole number of scholars attending winter term	16

NORTH SCHOOL

Three terms. Taught by Florence M. Jones. Spring term. Whole number of scholars attending, 8; average attendance 7.5; not absent one-half day, 3. Fall term. Whole number attending, 8; average attendance, 7.5; not absent one-half day, 4. Winter term. Whole number attending, 7.

SOUTH SCHOOL

Three terms. Taught by Laura E. Harding. Spring term. Whole number of scholars attending, 10; average attendance, 8.7; not absent one-half day, 3. Fall term. Whole number attending, 9. Average attendance, 8.5; not absent one-half day, 2. Winter term. Whole number attending, 9.

Reviewing the work of the schools for the past year it may be said that the attendance has been generally good. The progress and proficiency of the scholars in their studies very gratifying. It is only just to express appreciation of the untiring efforts of the teachers to whom chiefly is due what measure of success has been attained in the schools during the year. They have done their best and have given honest and earnest endeavor to instruct and encourage the children in their school work, for which they deserve the commendation of our citizens. The children who have attended regularly have done very well and show a distinct advancement, which should be, to them, a source of satisfaction. The schools have been graded and equipped with charts, maps and globes.

The school year consisted of 34 weeks divided into three terms, 10, 14, 10 weeks respectively.
