SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

Elmer B. Eddy

To the Members of the Superintending School Committee and the Citizens of the Town of Gouldsboro

As a new man in the field, I cannot be expected to show such improvements in our school system as a longer period of time and work will accomplish, I will, however, outtime briefly such changes as we have made, and state to you such further needs and changes as we hope to make in the future.

On my first visits to the schools I found many things which were indicative of the good work of our former superintendent; and I am greatly indebted to him for his choice of excellent teachers.

REPAIRS

I think that every child is entitled to school surroundings, which are clean, wholesome, safe and morally uplifting, and no town has dischared its obligation to its children until all the outbuildings and surroundings meet these specifications.

Believing this, I wish to call your attention to the outbuildings at Prospect Harbor, Birch Harbor, Corea and Gouldsboro. They are in very bad condition and something should be done to improve them, I would suggest that sufficient money be raised to build one each year.

The room at Prospect Harbor is in need of some urgent repairs. The interior of the building should be thoroughly cleaned and painted before another year, and new seats installed.

BOOKS

The text-books in town are in fair condition but as methods and subject matters change it is necessary to make some changes also in the text, I believe every child should have sufficient up-to-date books to carry on his work. In all branches supplementary books are as essential as the basel text, to keep the pupils supplied with proper books at the proper time is a problem which has involved considerable work. However, we have done this as far as possible and all books when not in use have been picked up and deposited in the book closet at West Gouldsboro school.

It is with gratitude to the towns people, town officials and school committee for their co-operation and kind favors that I respectfully submit this report
