*To the Members of the Superintending School Committee and the Citizens of the Town of Gouldsboro:*

I think I am justified in stating at the outset that we have enjoyed a year of prosperity. A corps of efficient teachers working energetically and systematically can bring good results. We were indeed fortunate in retaining the most of our teachers throughout the year, so that the scholars were enabled to begin work promptly at the opening of each term without having to go through the laborious process of becoming accustomed to the individual characteristics of a new instructor. The teachers, likewise, were able to do more rapid and efficient work.

I believe that parents and citizens should make it their duty and obligation to visit the schools and note the condition of the schoolrooms and surroundings. I maintain that the school should be a model home for children, that an artistic room, proper heating, sanitation, pure air and water, proper light and, above all, cleanliness, are vital points in the education of the youth. There is no better way of knowing these conditions than by visiting school and talking matters over with the teachers and the school officials.

## REPAIRS.

With our appropriation this year a modern outbuilding, with sanitary closets, was erected at Corea, the building at Prospect Harbor painted, a new belfry built at Birch Harbor, the schoolhouse at Bunker's Harbor remodeled and the matter of lighting has been brought into accordance with approved plans.

I would suggest that an appropriation be made to cover the expense of a new floor in the upper room at Corea. The outbuildings at Prospect and Birch Harbor are in very bad condition and should be given special attention this year.

In conclusion, I wish to thank the teachers for their honest endeavors and hearty support. To the school committee and citizens I wish to express my gratitude for their advice and co-operation in everything pertaining to the good of the schools.
