Report of Superintendent of Schools

To the inhabitants of the town of Isle au Haut:

I respectfully submit the following report of the conditions of the schools, the receipts and expenditures of this department for the year closing March, 1911.

The advancement of the schools will compare favorably with any previous year, as we have had the services of competent teachers who have shown an interest to do their best for the good and advancement of their schools.

The schools at East Side and Head Harbor have each averaged less than the number required by law to be continued unless the school committee recommend that they be continued, and that the town then vote to continue them.

The work of the scholars who are attending schools out of town is reported very favorable, and it is pleasing to know that they compare favorably with those who have been fitted in the larger towns and cities.

There are several things needed for the new school building in the line of supplies such as maps, charts, etc., which are taken into consideration in the appropriations recommended for text books and repairs.

Town Warrant

To John K. Collins, one of the Constables of the Town of Isle au Haut, Maine, in the County of Hancock. Greeting:

In the name of the State of Maine, you are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants of the said town of Isle au Haut, qualified by law to vote in town affairs, to assemble at Revere Hall, in said town, on Monday, March 13, A. D. 1911, at nine o'clock in the forenoon, to act on the following articles, to wit:

- Article 1 To choose a Moderator to preside at said meeting.
- Article 2 To choose a Town Clerk for the ensuing year.
- Article 3 To choose a Board of Selectmen.
- Article 4 To choose Assessors of Taxes.
- Article 5 To choose Overseers of the Poor.
- Article 6 To choose a Town Treasurer and vote his compensation.
- Article 7 To choose a Collector of Taxes and vote his compensation.
- Article 8 To choose a Member of the School Board.
- Article 9 To choose a Town Auditor.
- Article 10 To choose Constables.
- Article 11 To choose a Road Commissioner or Commissioners.
- Article 12 To choose Surveyors of Wood and Lumber.
- Article 13 To choose Truant Officers.
- Article 14 To see what sum of money the town will raise and appropriate for the support of the poor.
- Article 15 To see what sum of money the town will raise and appropriate for current expenses.
- Article 16 To see if the town will vote to continue a school at the East Side, or act anything relating thereto.

Article 17 To see if the town will vote to continue a school at Head Harbor or act anything relating thereto.

Article 18 To see what sum of money the town will raise and appropriate for the support of the public schools.

Article 19 To see what sum of money the town will raise and appropriate for text books and supplies.

Article 20 To see what sum of money the town will raise and appropriate for repairs on school buildings.

Article 21 To see what sum of money the town will raise and appropriate for the tuition of High School scholars.

Article 22 To see if the town will vote to unite with other towns in employing a Superintendent of Schools, providing a satisfactory arrangement can be made for such a union.

Article 23 To see what sum of money the town will raise and appropriate for the salary of the Superintendent of Schools.

Article 24 To see if the town will vote "yes" or "no" upon the adoption of the provisions of Chapter 112 of the Public Laws of Maine for the year 1907 as amended by Chapter 69, Public Laws of 1909, relating to the appropriation of money necessary to entitle the town to state aid for highways for the year 1911.

Article 25 To see if the town will raise and appropriate in addition to the amounts regularly raised and appropriated for the care of ways, highways and bridges, the sum of \$200.00 being the maximum amount which this town is allowed to raise under the provisions of Chapter 112 of the Public Laws of Maine for the year 1907 as amended by Chapter 69, Public Laws 1909.

Article 26 To see what sum of money the town will raise and appropriate for repairs on roads and bridges.

Article 27 To see what sum of money the town will raise and appropriate for snow bills.

Article 28 To see what sum of money the town will raise and appropriate for cutting bushes from the road limit.

Article 29 To see what sum of money the town will raise and appropriate on town debt and interest on same or act anything relating thereto.

Article 30 To see if the town will vote to accept the town way as laid out by the selectmen, beginning at the junction of the South Side Road with the West Side Road, thence southerly, westerly and northerly around the Cove known as Duck Harbor, to its intersection with the so called Old Wood Road as per minutes to be presented.

Article 31 To see if the town will vote to accept the private way as laid out by the selectmen beginning at the West Side Road, at the Yeaton line, so called, thence running southerly and westerly to land of the Isle au Haut Company as per minutes to be presented.

Article 32 To see what action the town will take for the protection of clams.

Article 33 To act on any other business that may come before said meeting.
