



# Report of Superintendent of Schools

To the inhabitants of the town of Isle au Haut:

In accordance with the requirements of law I respectfully submit the following report.

During the past year the schools have been in charge of competent teachers and I believe that all who have been interested, and especially those who have had children attending them, will agree with me that we have had a successful year.

Mrs. Margaret Bowditch has presented to the town to be added to the school fund, twenty-four dollars, which is one dollar per week for the Thoroughfare school for fall and winter terms, which was the amount paid above what the town had previously paid, to secure the services of an experienced teacher, and this offer is now extended to the school at the East side also for the next term, providing it is expended for the same purpose.

A good teacher does much more for the children under her care than teaching them what the text books contain, and the extra training and developing of the pupil is best done by a teacher of experience.

It is very true that whatever the pupil learns and remembers is important, but he should be taught to know how to apply his knowledge to be of value to himself and thus become a useful citizen.

At the beginning of the fall term next September the following law will be in effect: No person shall be employed to teach in any school who does not hold a State certificate, provided, however, that any person not holding a state certificate may be granted a temporary permit for a period

of one year, such permit to be issued upon examination by the superintendent of schools, and the form of such permit shall be prepared by the state superintendent, and no person shall be eligible to a teaching permit unless they are seventeen years of age and have completed a standard high school or academy course.

For recommendations I will refer you to the amounts recommended for the various departments by the school committee.

#### Town Warrant

To Samuel W. Bridges, one of the constables of the town of Isle au Haut, Maine, in the County of Knox, Greeting:

In the name of the State of Maine, you are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants of the said town of Isle au Haut, qualified by law to vote in town affairs, to assemble at Revere hall, in said town, on Monday, March 9, A. D. 1914, at nine o'clock in the forenoon, to act on the following articles, to wit:

- 1. To choose a Moderator to preside at said meeting.
- 2. To choose a Town Clerk for the ensuing year.
- 3. To choose a Board of Selectmen for the ensuing year.
- 4. To choose Assessors of Taxes.
- 5. To choose Overseers of the Poor.
- 6. To choose a Town Treasurer and vote his compensation.
- 7. To choose a Collector of Taxes and vote his compensation.
- 8. To choose a Member of the School Board for three years.
  - 9. To choose a Town Auditor or Auditors.
  - 10. To choose Constables.
  - 11. To choose a Fire Warden and vote his compensation.
  - 12. To choose Surveyors of Wood and Lumber.
  - 13. To choose Truant Officers.
- 14. To see what sum of money the town will raise and appropriate for the support of the poor.
- 15. To see what sum of money the town will raise and appropriate for current expenses.

- 16. To see if the town will vote to continue a school at East side or act anything relating thereto.
- X17. To see if the town will vote to continue a school at Head Harbor or act anything relating thereto.
- 18. To see what sum of money the town will raise and appropriate for the support of the public schools.
- 19. To see what sum of money the town will raise and appropriate for text books and supplies.
- 20. To see what sum of money the town will raise and appropriate for repairs on school buildings.
- 21. To choose a Superintendent of Schools or act anything relating thereto.
- 22. To see what sum of money the town will raise and appropriate for the salary of the Superintendent of Schools.
- 23. To see if the town will vote "yes" or "no" on the question of appropriating and raising money necessary to entitle the town to state aid, as provided in section 20 of chapter 130 of the Public Laws of 1913.
- 24. To see if the town will appropriate and raise the sum of \$300 for the improvement of the section of state aid road as outlined in the report of the state highway commission, in addition to the amounts regularly raised for the care of ways, highways and bridges; the above amount being the maximum which the town is allowed to raise under the provision of section 19 of chapter 130 of the Public Laws of 1913.
- 25. To see if the town will vote to raise money, and what sum, for the maintenance of state aid highways during the ensuing year, within the limits of the town, under the provisions of section 18 of chapter 130 of the Public Laws of 1913.

- × 26. To see what sum of money the town will raise and appropriate for cutting bushes from road limits.
- 27. To see what sum of money the town will raise and appropriate for snow bills.
- 28. To see what sum of money the town will raise and appropriate for repairs on roads and bridges.
- 29. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$248 as interest and payment on town note, or act anything relating thereto.
- 30. To see what sum of money the town will raise and appropriate for the insurance of the new school house.
- 31. To see what sum of money the town will raise and appropriate for the maintenance of town hall or act anything relating thereto.
- ₹ 32. To see what action the town will take in regard to the running of automobiles in the town of Isle au Haut.
- 33. To see if the town will vote to instruct the town treasurer to hire, with the approval of the selectmen, whatever money that may be required to defray town expenses for the ensuing year.
- 34. To see what action the town will take for the protection of clams.
- 35. To act on any other business that may come before said meeting,
