Report of Superintendent of Schools

To the Superintending School Committee and Citizens of Isle au Haut:

I herewith submit my second annual report as superintendent of schools for Isle au Haut.

Your school committee decided to have the school at the East side during the year, because most of the scholars came from that section. We have maintained a school year of thirty-two weeks since last town meeting, eleven weeks in the spring, eleven last fall and ten this winter. We plan to have twelve weeks this spring so that we shall get in thirty-three weeks for the school year.

On the whole, the school is making progress. Miss Cousins is doing good work, she is very conscientious and is trying to give the scholars work that will fit them for our high school. I want to appeal to the parents to assist in the matter of discipline, there has been occasions when a teacher would get discouraged because of the attitude of some of the older boys, and I hope I will not have to report anything of the kind to the school committee. I am firmly convinced that when a boy will not obey the teacher, he should be sent where he will have to obey. This is a matter that is wholly within the power of the school committee.

The financial condition of the schools is very good. We have balances on hand in all departments but text books and superintendence accounts. I felt it to be wise to get the new text books we now have so that we can do the same work at Isle au Haut that we are doing in the other schools of this Union.

Because of the new state law in distributing the school money for the next year. I think with the balances on hand, we can get along with one appropriation for common schools, high school tuition and text books and supplies for the sum of \$600.00. The amounts for the other two accounts will be in the hands of the school committee.

County of Knox

State of Maine

To Wm. E. Robinson, a constable in the town of Isle au Haut, County of Knox,

GREETING:

In the name of the State of Maine, you are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants of the said Town of Isle au Haut qualified by law to vote in town affairs, to assemble at Revere Hall, in said town, on Monday, March 13, A. D. 1922, at nine o'clock in the forenoon, to act on the following articles to wit:

- 1 To choose a Moderator to preside at said meeting.
- 2 To choose a Town Clerk for the ensuing year.
- 3 To choose a Board of Selectmen for the ensuing year.
- 4 To choose Assessors of Taxes.
- 5 To choose Overseers of Poor.
- 6 To choose a Town Treasurer and vote his compensation.
- 7 To choose a Collector of Taxes and vote his compensation.
- 8 To choose a member of the School Board for three years.
- 9 To see if the town will vote to elect a Road Commissioner, one or more, fix his term of office, not to exceed three years, have the Selectmen appoint or they

themselves act as Commissioners,, as is provided by Chapter 92 of the Public Laws of 1919, or act anything relating thereto.

10 To choose two or more Constables.

11 To choose a Town Auditor.

12 To choose a Fire Warden and vote his compensation.

13 To choose Surveyors of Wood and Lumber.

14 To see what sum of money the town will raise and appropriate for support of poor.

15 To see what sum of money the town will raise and appropriate for current expenses.

16 To see if the town will vote to act on the written recommendation of the School Board in regard to the location of the school the coming year, or act anything relating thereto.

17 To see what sum of money the town will raise and appropriate for Common Schools.

18 To see what sum of money the town will raise and appropriate for Text Books and Supplies.

19 To see what sum of money the town will raise and appropriate for repairs on School Buildings.

20 To see what sum of money the town will raise and appropriate for High School Tuition.

21 To see what sum of money the town will raise and appropriate for the salary of Superintendent of Schools.

22 To see if the town will vote to buy a tractor, and to raise or hire money for the same or act anything relating thereto.

23 To see if the town will vote "Yes" or "No" on

the question of appropriating and raising money necessary to entitle the town to state aid, as provided in Section 19 of Chapter 25 of the Revised Statutes of 1916.

24 To see if the town will appropriate and raise the sum of \$300.00 for the improvement of the section of state aid road as outlined in the report of the State Highway Commission, in addition to the amounts regularly raised for the care of ways, highways and bridges the above being the maximum which the town is allowed to raise under the provisions of Section 18, Chapter 25 of the Revised Statutes of 1916.

25 To see what sum of money the town will raise and appropriate for repairs on State Aid Roads.

26 To see what sum of money the town will raise and appropriate for repairs on Roads and Bridges.

27 To see what sum of money the town will raise and appropriate for the Maintenance of Town Hall.

28 To see what action the town will take for the better protection of deer on Isle au Haut, or act anything relating thereto.

29 To see if the town will vote for the treasurer to hire, with the approval of the selectmen, whatever money may be required to defray town expenses for the ensuing year.

30 To see if the town will vote a certain date on which all taxes shall be paid also decide on a rate of interest for all taxes unpaid after that date.

31 To see if the town will vote to accept the list of jurors as prepared by the selectmen, treasurer and town clerk.

32 To act on any other business that may come before said meeting.

The selectmen hereby give notice that they will be in session for the purpose of revising and correcting the list of voters at Revere Memorial Hall, at nine o'clock in the forenoon, on the dah of said meeting.
