## REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the Superintending School Committee and Citizens of Isle au Haut:

I herewith submit my third annual report as Superintendent of Schools for the fiscal year ending February, 1926.

The number of pupils attending school in town has been about twenty during the fall and spring terms, and seven during the winter term. This number can be taken care of by one teacher, and our problem would be comparatively easy if the pupils lived near the schoolhouse. As you know, this is not the case. Families living far from schools cannot expect the same advantages and conveniences as those living in a village or near a school. Every parent must assume part of the burden in getting his children to school. However, with your co-operation, I think the School Committee will be able to make arrangements satisfactory to all.

Miss Roxene Nichols, the present teacher, has had considerable experience and is an efficient teacher. I hope she will remain with us.

## TOWN WARRANT

County of Knox

State of Maine

To Elmer C. Lufkin, a Constable in the town of  
Isle au Haut:

Greeting:

In the name of the State of Maine you are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants of the said town of Isle au Haut, qualified by law to vote in town affairs, to assemble at Revere Hall, in said town, on March 15, A. D. 1926 at nine o'clock in the forenoon, to act on the following articles, to wit:

Article 1. To choose a Moderator to preside at said meeting.

Art. 2. To choose a Town Clerk for the ensuing year.

Art. 3. To choose a Board of Selectmen for the ensuing year.

Art. 4. To choose Assessors of Taxes.

Art. 5. To choose Overseers of Poor.

Art. 6. To choose a Town Treasurer and vote his compensation.

Art. 7. To choose a Collector of Taxes and vote his compensation.

Art. 8. To choose a member of the School Board.

Art. 9. To see if the town will vote to elect a Road Commissioner, one or more, fix his term of office, not to exceed three years, have the Selectmen appoint, or they themselves act as Commissioners, as is provided by Chapter 92 of the Public Laws of 1919, or act anything relating thereto.

Art. 10. To choose two or more Constables.

Art. 11. To choose a Fire Warden and vote his compensation.

Art. 12. To choose Surveyors of Wood and Lumber.

Art. 13. To see what sum of money the town will raise and appropriate for the support of poor.

Art. 14. To see what sum of money the town will raise and appropriate for current expenses.

Art. 15. To see if the town will vote to act on the written recommendation of the School Board, in regard to the location of schools, the coming year, or act anything relating thereto.

Art. 16. To see what sum of money the town will raise and appropriate for schools, including high school tuition and textbooks and supplies.

Art. 17. To see what sum of money the town will raise and appropriate for schoolhouse repairs.

Art. 18. To see what sum of money the town will raise and appropriate for salary of Superintendent of Schools.

Art. 19. To see if the town will vote "Yes" or "No" on the question of raising and appropriating money necessary to entitle the town to State Aid as provided in Section 19 of Chapter 25 of the Revised Statutes of 1916.

Art. 20. To see if the town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$300.00 for the improvement of the section of State Aid road as outlined in the report of the State Highway Commission, in addition to the amounts regularly raised for the care of ways, highways and bridges, the above amount being the maximum which the town is allowed to raise under the provisions of Section 18, Chapter 25 of the Revised Statutes of 1916.

Art. 21. To see what sum of money the town will raise and appropriate for repairs on State Aid road.

Art. 22. To see what sum of money the town will raise and appropriate for repairs on roads and bridges.

Art. 23. To see what sum of money the town will raise and appropriate for roads—snow bills.

Art. 24. To see what sum of money the town will raise and appropriate for maintenance of town hall.

Art. 25. To see what sum of money the town will raise and appropriate for Mothers' Aid fund.

Art. 26. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for advertising our natural resources, advantages and attractions, under the provisions of Chapter 4, Section 59 of the Revised Statutes of Maine, the same to be expended by the Maine Development Association.

Art. 27. To see if the town will vote for the Treasurer to hire, with the approval of the Selectmen, whatever money may be required to defray town expenses for the ensuing year.

Art. 28. To see if the town will vote a certain date, on or before which, all taxes shall be paid, also to decide on a rate of interest for all taxes unpaid after that date, or act anything relating thereto.

Art. 29. To see what action the town will take for the better protection of deer on Isle au Haut, or act anything relating thereto.

Art. 30. To act on any other business that may come before said meeting.

The selectmen hereby give notice that they will be in session for the purpose of revising and correcting the list of voters, at Revere Memorial Hall, at nine o'clock in the forenoon, on the date of said meeting.
