STATE OF MAINE.

SOMERSET SS.

To A. F. Buker, Constable of the Town of Hartland.

GREETING :

In the name of the State of Maine you are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants of said town of Hartland, qualified by law to vote in town affairs, to assemble at Association Hall in said town on the ninth day of March, 1903, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon following articles, to wit :

ART. 1.—To choose a Moderator to preside in said meeting.

ART. 2.—To choose a Town Clerk for the year ensuing.

ART. 3.—To hear all reports to be made at said meeting.

ART. 4.—To choose three or more Selectmen.

ART. 5.—To choose three or more Assessors.

ART. 6.—To choose all other necessary town officers for the ensuing year and fix their compensation.

ART. 7.—To see if the town will vote to have a Road Commissioner.

ART. 8.—To see if the town will elect a Superintendent of Schools or authorize the superintending school committee to elect the same.

ART. 9.—To see how much money the town will vote to pay the town charges.

ART. 10.—To see how much money the town will vote to raise for the support of common schools.

ART. 11.—To see how much money the town will vote to raise for the purchase of school books.

ART. 12.—To see how much money the town will vote to raise for the repair of school buildings and the purchase of school supplies for the ensuing year.

ART. 13.—To see how much money the town will vote to raise for the support of a Free High School.

ART. 14.—To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the support of the poor for the ensuing year.

ART. 15.—To see how much money the town will vote to raise to pay town debts for the ensuing year.

ART. 16.—To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money with which to pay one or more of the S. & M. R. R. bonds, or take any action relating thereto.

ART. 17.—To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to be expended upon roads and bridges or act upon anything relating thereto.

ART. 18.—To see how much money the town will vote to raise to be expended upon sidewalks.

ART. 19.—To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to refund the interest bearing debt of the town when the same can be done at a lower rate of interest.

ART. 20.—To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to hire money with which to pay town debts.

ART. 21.—To see how much money the town will vote to raise to supply deficiencies in consequence of abatements and discounts.

ART. 22.—To see what action the town will vote to take in relation to the collection of taxes for the ensuing year.

ART. 23.—To see how much money the town will raise to pay for electric lights for the streets and act upon anything relating to the same.

ART. 24.—To see if the town will vote to authorize the S. S. committee to make arrangements with the trustees of Hartland Academy for the instruction of our Free High and Grammar school pupils.

ART. 25.—To choose one or more superintending school committee.

ART. 26.—To see if the town will vote to approve of the purchase of a portion of the B. F. Fairbrother pasture, by the selectmen.

ART. 27.—To see if the town will vote to accept the Public Way commencing on the east side of Commercial street, south of the M. E. church lot and extending easterly to the west line of

Blake street in Hartland village, as laid out by the selectmen, and determine the amount of land damages.

ART. 28.—To see what further action the town will vote to take or what further instruction give in relation to the collection of the amount of damage done to the highway by the washouts of 1899 and 1900 A. D.

ART. 29.—To see what action the town will vote to take in relation to the exemption from, or abatement of taxes.

ART. 30.—To see if the town will vote to abate any portion of the tax of 1902 against the estate of Sylvester Ham, destroyed by fire.

ART. 31.—To see what further action the town will take in relation to the extension of the Sewer System and the Hydrant System in Hartland village.

ART. 32.—To see what sum of money the town will vote to give to the Hartland Free Library and to accept any contributions that any parties may desire to make for the same.

ART. 33.—To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for Memorial day services.

ART. 34.—To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to repair cemetery fences. Parties having motion to offer upon any of the above articles are requested to put the same in writing.

"The Ladies' Aid" will furnish a warm dinner in basement of hall for 15 cents each. All are invited.

The selectmen will be in session at the above named hall one hour before the time of said meeting for the purpose of correcting the list of voters.

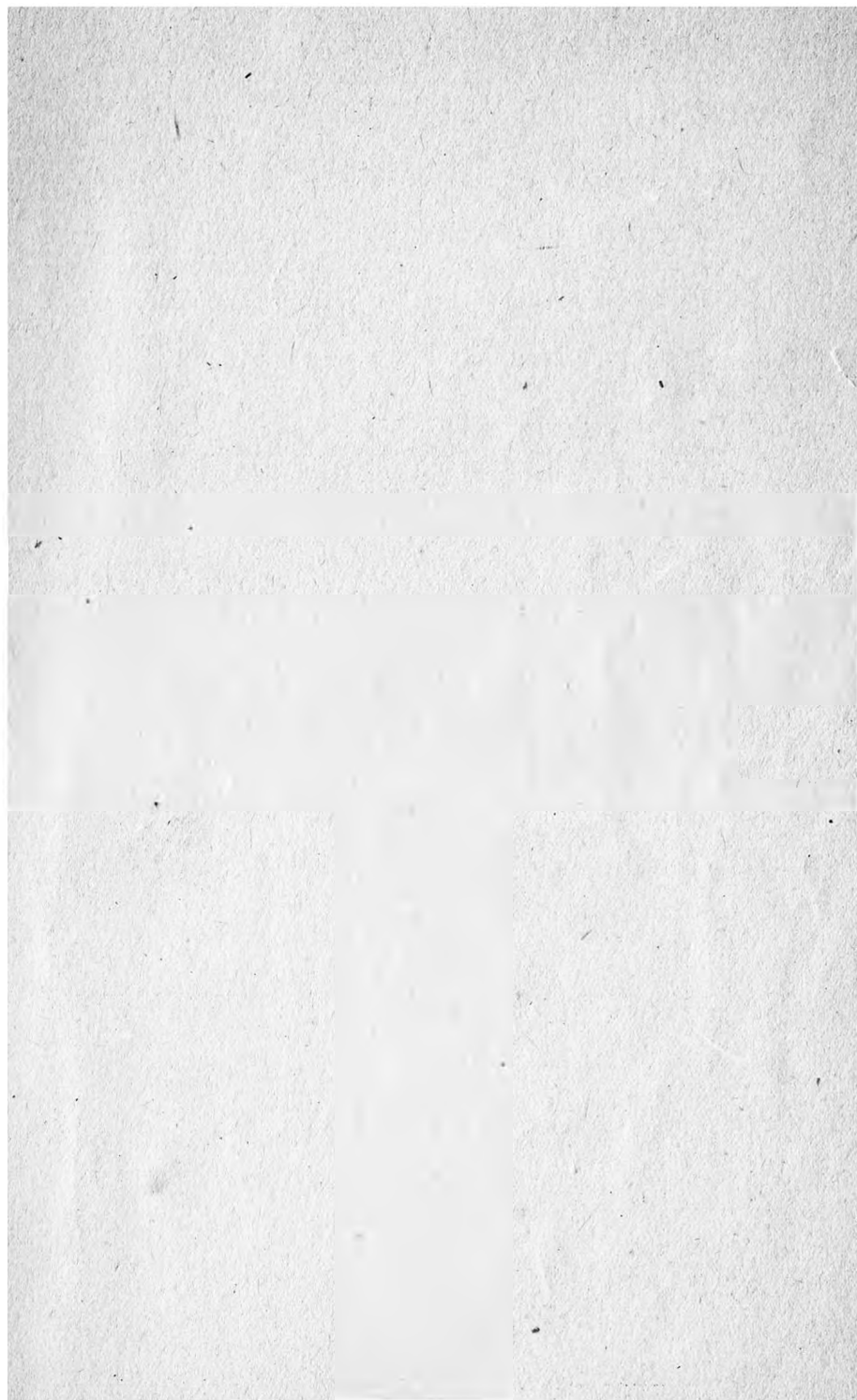
