STATE OF MAINE.

Somerset ss.

To C. E. Pratt, Constable of the Town of Hartland:

GREETING:

In the name of the State of Maine you are hereby requested to notify and warn the inhabitants of said town of Hartland, qualified by law to vote in town affairs, to assemble at Association Hall in said town on the twelfth day of March, 1906, at nine o'clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following articles, to wit:—

ART. 1—To choose a Moderator to preside at said meeting.

ART. 2—To choose a Clerk for the year ensuing.

ART. 3—To hear all reports to be made at said meeting.

ART. 4—To choose three or more Selectmen.

ART. 5—To choose three or more Assessors.

ART. 6—To choose all other town officers for the ensuing year and fix their compensation.

ART. 7—To see if the town will vote to have a Road Commissioner.

ART. 8—To choose one or more Superintending school Committee.

ART. 9—To see how much money the town will vote to raise for town charges.

ART. 10—To see how much money the town will vote to raise for the support of common schools and interest on bond.

ART. 11—To see how much money the town will vote to raise for the purchase of school books.

ART. 12—To see how much money the town will vote

to raise for the repair of school buildings and the purchase of school supplies for the ensuing year.

ART. 13—To see how much money the town will vote to raise for the support of a Free High School.

ART. 14—To see how much money the town will vote to raise for the support of the poor for the year ensuing.

ART. 15—To see how much money the town will vote to raise to pay the town's debt for the year ensuing.

ART. 16—To see how much money the town will vote to raise to be expended on roads and bridges, or act upon anything relating thereto.

ART. 17—To see how much money the town will vote to raise to be expended on the sidewalks.

ART. 18—To see how much money the town will vote to raise to supply deficiencies in consequence of abatements and discounts.

ART. 19—To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for Memorial day sevices.

ART. 20—To see how much money the town will vote to pay for electric lights and to act upon anything relating thereto.

ART. 21—To see what amount the town will vote to raise for the care of Cemeteries.

ART. 22—To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the extension of the hydrant system.

ART. 23—To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the Fire Department or to act upon anything relating thereto.

ART. 24—To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for Hartland Free Library.

ART. 25—To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to purchase a road machine.

ART. 26—To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to pay on the interest bearing debt.

ART. 27—To see if the town will raise a sum of money sufficient to purchase an industrial cabinet for use in the schools.

ART. 28—To see if the town will authorize the Selectmen to refund the interest bearing debt of the town when the same can be done at a lower rate of interest.

ART. 29—To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to hire money with which to pay town debts.

ART. 30—To see what action the town will vote to take in relation to the collection of taxes for the year ensuing.

ART. 31—To see if the town will vote to authorize the S. S. Committee to make arrangements with the Trustees of Hartland Academy for the instruction of our Free High and Grammar School pupils.

ART. 32—To see if the town will vote to accept the additional property acquired by Hartland Library Association in the past year.

ART. 33—To see if the town will vote to establish the village limits.

ART. 34—To see if the town will vote to adopt the provisions of Chapter 148 of the Public Laws of 1905 of the State of Maine, entitled "An act to amend Section 22 of Chapter 6 on the Revised Statutes, relating to regulating and conduct of elections," and which provides in substance that the voting shelves or compartments used at all elections shall be provided with wooden swing doors.

ART. 35—To see what action the town will vote to take if any, in regard to purchasing the Mortgage Deed held by Sade Sawyer against Ida Staples, et al.

ART. 36—To see what sum of money the town will raise to expend on State road.

The Selectmen will be in session at the above named Hall one hour before the time of said meeting for the purpose of correcting the list of voters.

Condition of Library.

No. volumes in library March 1, 1905, 1200; 194 volumes have been added during the year, making present number 1394. No. of borrowers during the year 570. No. of volumes loaned 4464.

From July 15 to Sept. 1, the library was closed; every book was accounted for and 63 books were rebound. Several year's subscriptions of Magazines have been given to the

library and as they were considered especially helpful reading were bound. We realize that the books of today especially fiction are bound cheaply and therefore we urge patrons to be careful in handling them. It is very gratifying to see so many children coming to the library. A taste for good reading acquired in youth is a great factor in forming the characters of our citizens. The teachers in our schools are doing much to instil into their pupils a taste for good reading, by reading during the session from the books on the children's stack; this method interests them in the books and they then want to read the books. We would urge those having the care of children to be very particular and place good reading before them. The reading table is supplied with good reading for old and young. The library is open every Wednesday from 2 to 5 P. M. and every Friday from 2 to 5 and 7 to 9 P. M.
