# Town Warrant

---

STATE OF MAINE

SOMERSET, SS.

*To Carl Randlett, constable of the town of Hartland:*

*GREETING:*

In the name of the State of Maine you are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants of the said town of Hartland qualified by law to vote in town affairs to assemble at the Opera House in said town on the ninth day of March, A. D. 1908 at nine o'clock in the forenoon to act on the following articles, to wit:

- Art. 1 To choose a Moderator to preside at said meeting.
- Art. 2 To choose a Town Clerk for the year ensuing.
- Art. 3 To hear all reports to be made at said meeting.
- Art. 4 To choose three or more Selectmen for the year ensuing.
- Art. 5 To choose three or more Assessors for the ensuing year.
- Art. 6 To choose all the necessary officers for the ensuing year and fix their compensation.
- Art. 7 To see if the town will vote to elect a Road Commissioner or act upon anything relating thereto.
- Art. 8 To choose one or more Superintending School Committee.
- Art. 9 To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for town charges.
- Art. 10 To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the support of common schools and interest on bond.
- Art. 11 To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the purchase of school books.
- Art. 12 To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the repair of school buildings, the purchase of school supplies and rent of Academy for the ensuing year.
- Art. 13 To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the support of a Free High School.
- Art. 14 To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the support of poor for the ensuing year.
- Art. 15 To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to pay town debts for the ensuing year.
- Art. 16 To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to be expended on roads, bridges and sidewalks, and to act upon anything relating thereto.

Art. 17 To see if the town will vote 'yes' or 'no' upon the adoption of the provision of Chapter 112 of the public laws of Maine for the year 1907, relating to the appropriation of money necessary to entitle the town to the State aid for highways for the year 1908 and raise \$160.00 in addition to any amount already provided for in article 16 of this warrant.

Art. 18 To see if the town will raise, appropriate and set apart, for the permanent improvement of the main highways within the town, such sums of money as is contemplated and directed by Section 5 of Chapter 112 of the public laws of Maine for the year 1907, being the sum of \$80.00.

Art. 19 To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to supply deficiencies in consequence of abatements and discounts.

Art. 20 To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for Memorial Day observances.

Art. 21 To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for electric lights and act upon anything relating thereto.

Art. 22 To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for care of cemetaries.

Art. 23 To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for Fire Department.

Art. 24 To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for Hartland Free Library.

Art. 25 To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to pay on interest bearing debt.

Art. 26 To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to refund the interest bearing debt of the town, when the same can be done at a lower rate of interest.

Art. 27 To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to hire money with which to pay town debts.

Art. 28 To see what action the town will take in relation to the collection of taxes for the ensuing year and act upon anything relating thereto.

Art. 29 To see if the town will vote to accept sums of money in trust from any parties, the interest on same to be expended annually in caring for the graves of deceased friends and relatives.

Art. 30 To see what direction the town will vote to give the Selectmen in handling the Tucker farm or Buzzell place, so called, and act upon anything relating thereto.

Art. 31 To see what action the town will take in reference to a highway or private way, extending southerly from or near the southern outlet of the John Jepson road, so called, across the land of Wayne Sprague and land of Charles Goodwin and land of Viallie Stedman to the Viallie Stedman road, so called.

Art. 32. To see if town will vote to authorize its superintending school committee to join with either or any of the following towns, to wit, St. Albans, Palmyra or three towns for the purpose of employing a superintendent of schools in accordance with the provisions of Sections 40 to 45, inclusive, of Chapter 15, of the Revised Statutes.

Art. 33 To see what action the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to take to defend the town from the claim of parties for the support and care of George Soule.

Art. 34 To act upon any other matter that may properly come before said meeting.

The Selectmen will be in session at the above named Opera House one hour before said meeting for the purpose of correcting the list of voters.
