Warrant for Annual Town Meeting

SOMERSET, SS.

State of Maine

To Forest Baker, Constable of the town of Hartland: GREETING:

In the name of the state of Maine you are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants of said town of Hartland qualified by law to vote in town affairs to assemble at the Opera House in said town on Monday the 17th. day of March A. D. 1930, at ten o'clock A. M. to act on the following articles, to wit:

- Art 1 To choose moderator to preside at said meeting.
- Art 2 To choose a town clerk for the ensuing year.
- Art 3 To hear all reports to be made at said meeting.
- Art 4 To choose three or more selectmen for the year ensuing, and act upon anything relating thereto.
- Art 5 To choose three or more overseers of poor for the ensuing year, and to act upon anything relating thereto.
- Art 6 To choose three or more assessors for the year ensuing, and to act upon anything relating thereto.
- Art 7 To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to appoint a road commissioner instead of electing one

- Art 8 To choose all necessary officers for the year ensuing, fix their compensation, and to act upon anything relating thereto.
- Art 9 To choose one or more superintending school committee, and to act upon anything relating thereto.
- Art 10 To see what action the town will take in relation to the collection of taxes for the ensuing year, and to act upon anything relating thereto.
- Art 11 To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the support of common schools and interest on bond, and to act upon anything relating thereto.
- Art 12 To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the repair of school buildings and to act upon anything relating thereto.
- Art 13 To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the purchase of school books, and to act upon anything relating thereto.
- Art 14 To see if the town will vote in instruct the superintending school committee to arrange with Hartland Academy to furnish instructions to the High School pupils for the year ensuing, and to act upon anything relating thereto, and to raise such sums of money as will be necessary to furnish its pupils with free High School instruction.
- Art 15 To see if the town will vote to authorize the superintending school committee to continue Webber School, should it become automatically closed, if in their judgement it seems best to do so.
- Art 16 To see if the town will vote to authorize the superintending school committee to employ a school physican and to raise a sum of money for the same.

- Art 17 To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for music supervisor for the schools.
- Art 18 To see if the town will vote to raise \$1,500.00 as a sinking fund on our school bonds, also \$1,425.00 to pay one years interest, and to act upon anything relating thereto.
- Art 19 To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for town charges, and act upon anything relating thereto.
- Art 20 To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the support of the poor for the year ensuing, and to act upon anything relating thereto.
- Art 21 To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to pay outstanding debts and to act upon anything relating thereto.
- Art 22 To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to be expended on roads and bridges for the ensuing year and to act upon anything relating thereto.
- Art 23 To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to be expended on sidewalks for the ensuing year and to act upon anything relating thereto.
- Art 24 To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to supply deficiences in consequencies of abatements and discounts for the year ensuing and to act upon anything relating thereto.
- Art 25 To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for Memorial observances.
- Art 26 To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for electric lights for the year ensuing and to act upon anything relating thereto.

- Art 27 To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for cemeteries for the year ensuing and to act upon anything relating thereto.
- Art 28 To see if the town will vote "yes" or "no" on the question of appropriating and raising money necessary to entitle the town to State aid as provided in Section 19 of Chapter 25 of the revised Statutes of 1916.
- To see what sum of money, if any, the town will vote Art to raise in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 154 of the Public Laws of 1917, as amended by Chapter 157 of the P. L. of 1919: the construction of a State Aid highway through the towns of Hartland. Cornville. Athens and Solon: beginning at the Hartland-Pittsfield town line and extending in a general notherly direction by the way of Fuller's Corner to Hartland Village; thence in a general northwesterly direction to the Hartland-Athens town line: thence through the town of Athens to the Athens-Cornville town line; thence through the town of Cornville to the Cornville-Athens town line; thence through the town of Athens by the way of Athens Village to the Athens-Solon town line; thence in a general westerly direction to the state highway in Solon Village. The above mentioned appropriation to be expended in West Hartland.
- Art 30 To see if the town will vote to expend the money appropriated under Article 29 of this warrant in West Hartland and act upon anything relating thereto.
- Art 31 To see if the town will appropriate and raise the sum of \$600.00 for the improvement of the section of State Aid road as outlined in the report of State Highway Commission in addition to amount regularly raised for care of highways and bridges, the above amount being the maximum which the town is allowed to raise under provisions of Section 18 of Chapter 25 of the Revised Statutes of 1916.

- Art 32 To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate under the provision of Section 130 of the Public Laws of 1923 and to act upon anything relating thereto.
- Art 33 To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the support of the Volunteer Fire Company, and act upon anything relating thereto.
- Art 34 To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of \$25.00 to be paid as salary to the chief of the Volunteer Fire Company for the year ensuing and act upon anything relating thereto.
- Art 35 To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for Hartland Free Library.
- Art 36 To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to pay interest on interest bearing debt.
- Art 37 To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of \$1000. for water rental.
- Art 38 To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to be expended for cutting bushes in the highway and to act upon anything relating thereto.
- Art 39 To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of \$550.00 to purchase a road machine, or act upon anything relating thereto.
- Art 40 To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for maintenance of patrol for ensuing year.
- Art 41 To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to hire money, in anticipation of taxes and to pay the town debt.
- Art 42 To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to be expended for advertising the natural resources, advantages and attractions of the State of Maine.

- Art 43 To see if the town will vote to raise money to provide for the services of a public health nurse, or take any action thereon.
- Art 44 To see if the town will vote to unite with Palmyra and St. Albans to employ a music teacher.
- Art 45 To see if the town will vote to give the M. E. Church free abuttal to the sewer for the Parsonage.
- Art 46 To see what action the town will take in regard to putting a sewer in on Water Street so-called, or act upon anything relating thereto.
- Art 47 To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of \$200. to remove the stone from the surface of highway from A. E. Ladd's house to Pine Grove cemetery road.
- Art 48 To see if the town will vote to instruct its selectmen to pay its town treasurer the sum of \$200.00 as salary for the year ensuing and give him two per cent for collecting excise taxes on automobiles, or act upon anything relating thereto.
- Art 49 To see if the town will vote to improve the village streets by putting calcium chloride on them and raise the sum of one hundred dollars for that purpose, said amount to be placed in the hands of the Chamber of Commerce and expended under its direction.
- Art 50 To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money to screen the school buildings in town and act upon anything relating thereto.
- Art 51 To see if the town will vote to accept the sum of \$100. from Willis Briggs, as a trust fund, the income from same to be used to defray expense of perpetual care of his lot in Pine Grove Cemetery.

- Art 52 To see if the town will vote to accept the sum of \$100. from Mrs. Blanch Thomas, as a trust fund, the income from same to be used to defray expense of perpetual care of her lot in the Village Cemetery.
- Art 53 To see if the town of Hartland will vote to appropriate and raise the sum of \$150.00 or more to be used in cooperation with State and Federal aid, for the purpose of controlling the White Pine Blister Rust disease now located and established in pine areas in said town. The appropriation to be used for the purpose of assisting the inhabitants of said town only, in this work. And at all times to be under the direct supervision of the board of selectmen of said town.
- Art 54 To see if the town will vote to discontinue the highway from the White Road, so-called, to the Alfred Stafford farm in North Hartland.

The Selectmen will be in session at the above named Opera House, one hour before said meeting for the purpose of correcting the list of voters.

Report of Superintendent of Schools

To the Members of the S. S. Committee and Citizens of the town of Hartland, I submit for your approval, the following report of your schools for the municipal year, 1929-30.

The school census last April was 326, 167 boys and 159 girls. Of this number 201 are enrolled in the elementary schools. With 2 tuition pupils attending the Union school at Colson's corner and 58 students attending the Academy, we have a total 261 attending elementary and secondary schools.

The attendance in the schools has been very satisfactory. Mumps were reported in Mrs. Connelly's room about the fifth week of the winter term, but due to a complete exposure of practically all pupils, it was thought best to continue schools as long as the number out continue small. The winter term will close March 21. There will be a vacation of one week and the spring term will close Thursday, May 29.

The teachers and pupils have worked very hard and a very good grade of work is being done in our schools. We note that pupils entering from other school systems in the state find the work quite difficult and in many cases beyond the grade of work they have been doing. I believe that the ruling made by the S. S. Committee asking that children be 5 years old the 1st of April, prior to entering school the following September, is going

to give a great advantage to both schools and pupils. This makes the youngest child that would enter 5½ years of age, and in most cases he will be stronger and capable of doing a better grade of work, the first year. This tends to give confidence to the child and his interest in school work will be greater. On the other hand the labor from the 16 year old H. S. graduate is not needed as much today as it was 20 years ago. Too, we can expect and do get better work from older and more mature students. I thank the parents for their cooperation with this ruling in the past and solicit it from others in the future.

We have had 239 visits from parents and citizens during the first 24 weeks of the present school year. While we are more than pleased for this many, we would like still more. This is less than one visit per student enrolled. The teachers and pupils need and solicit that cooperation, which comes from visiting. The parents need to know more about the work that is being done in the schools, and the grade of work that their children are doing. In behalf of the S. S. Committee, teachers and pupils, I invite the parents and citizens of the town to visit the schools. Why not plan to visit once a month or twice each term? You will find a visit most enjoyable and interesting.

'Time' has been, and is today, the cry of the rural school teacher, with so many grades to teach. 1 She has not the time to give to each pupil the individual help needed. periods are only 8 to 10 minutes, which does not allow time to check the work and give proper assignments. order to hear each class during the day, the teacher becomes not a teacher, but a hearer of lessons. In order to overcome this condition we are slowly introducing a program of supervised study, where instead of having classes every day, in arithmetic, for example, the teacher takes the periods for arithmetic classes and gives to each pupil individual help and checks the work for understanding and application of the rules in the lesson. By this method the pupil receives help when it is most desired, instead of after one, two or three other classes have recited and his interest in the problem has ceased.

The music in the grades has progressed very well, also the vocal work in the Academy. Due to irregular attendance at orchestra rehearsals the members of the H. S. Orchestra have not done as well as they might. The G. S. orchestra has done very good work.

Janitor work has been done very efficiently, both, in the village and outside schools.

- C. W. Salisbury, Bean's Corner to Fuller's Corner \$10. per week, fall, \$6. per week, spring, \$7. per week, winter.
- Alton MacPherson, Palmyra line to Fuller's Corner \$6. per week, fall and spring, \$7. per week, winter.
- Chas. Walker, North Hartland to Webber, \$7. per week.
- Carroll Ford, Bruce Hillman's to Fuller's Corner, winter term, \$7. per week.

All necessary supplies and books have been furnished. I recommend that a change in arithmetics and geographies be made next year.

The Academy enrollment Sept. 1st was 97 and is above 90 at the present time. In all rooms that I have visited the instruction has been very good. A percentage of the students had their lessons well prepared, while others showed very little preparation. In High School the average student needs to do from 2 to 3 hours preparation on their work each evening in order to get the most out of the subjects they are pursuing. Teachers are always ready to give assistance when needed.

There was a marked improvement in the health of our school children from that of last year. We have 85 with a rank of 100%. Let us try and bring this number to 185 next year. Dr. Moulton is doing a splendid piece of work in our schools and his suggestions should be carried out as far as possible. I trust

that Miss Robinson's work was beneficial to those whom she visited. Miss Robinson is County Health Nurse of Somerset County. She spent two days in Hartland.

The Fuller's Corner schoolhouse has been painted inside and out. The Pleasant St. building has been painted outside. The cost for painting both buildings outside was \$200.00. New seats will be bought for Fuller's Corner school and installed during the spring term.

My work of the past year has been very interesting and enjoyable. I thank the citizens, S. S. Committee, teachers and pupils for their splendid cooperation.

MUSIC REPORT

Grade Schools

A few changes have been made since my last report. The large number of pupils in grades three and four, made it advisable to form an extra class in singing. This room has a Toy Symphony Orchestra and so has the Fuller's Corner school.

Many children who begin this rhythmic work, develope later into real orchestra players. The rural schools are taught in two classes. Grade IV are beginning two part singing. Much has been done with part singing in grades V, VI, VII, and VIII.

The grammar school orchestra has twenty players. Attendance at rehearsals and interest has been splendid. Much real musical ability has developed among the children in these grades. A course in music appreciation is being introduced this year.

High School Music

The High School chorus is taught in two classes. Chorus is elective in Junior and Senior years and required in the Freshman and Sophmore classes.

The elective chorus are studying short chorus numbers, the Cantata "Columbus" and also the Cantata "The Rose Maiden". The first and second year chorus are studying four part music of a select type.

The High School Orchestra has never been large. When we took up the work we found it a mixed orchestra of high and grammar school pupils. Now the two are separate. Most members of the High School Orchestra are loyal. A very small number who contracted the Jazz Craze outside of school have not contributed to the success of the orchestra.

Your director of music has taken the stand that if music is to be really the cultural subject it is supposed to be, cheap music has no more place in the school orchestra than cheap literature has in the English classes and has and will exclude it from school work feeling that if a few members are lost on this account, it is no great loss. Music should have no place in the schools if high standards cannot be maintained.

Prin. Murray has given our efforts hearty support. Miss Turkington of the faculty has given valuable aid as accompanist for the Senior chorus.

Walter Habenicht, eniment New York violinist gave a splendid concert at Academy Hall in Jan. which deserved large patronage. More concerts of a select type should be brought to towns people and students. For few are the opportunities a small town has of hearing such.

If further efforts are made along this line, we hope for a hearty response.
