

Warrant for Annual Town Meeting

SOMERSET, SS.

STATE OF MAINE

To Ord K. Fuller, Constable of the Town of Hartland:

GREETING:

In the name of the State of Maine you are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants of said town of Hartland qualified by law to vote in town affairs to assemble at the Opera House in said town on Monday the 13th day of March, A. D. 1933, at ten o'clock A. M. to act on the following articles, to wit:

Art. 1. To choose a moderator to preside at said meeting.

Art. 2. To choose a town clerk for the ensuing year.

Art. 3. To hear all reports to be made at said meeting.

Art. 4. To choose three or more selectmen for the year ensuing, and act upon anything relating thereto.

Art. 5. To choose three or more overseers of the poor for the ensuing year, and to act upon anything relating thereto.

Art. 6. To choose three or more assessors for the year ensuing and to act upon anything relating thereto.

Art. 7. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to appoint a road commissioner or act upon anything relating thereto.

Art. 8. To choose all necessary officers for the year ensuing, fix their compensation, and to act upon anything relating thereto.

Art. 9. To choose one or more for the superintending school committee, and to act upon anything relating thereto.

Art. 10. To see what action the town will take in relation to the collection of taxes for the ensuing year, and to act upon anything relating thereto.

Art. 11. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the support of common schools and interest on bond, and to act upon anything relating thereto.

Art. 12. To see if the town will vote to instruct the superintending school committee to arrange with Hartland Academy to furnish instructions to the high school pupils for the year ensuing, and to act upon anything relating thereto, and to raise such sums of money as will be necessary to furnish its pupils with free high school instruction.

Art. 13. To see if the town will vote to authorize the superintending school committee to employ a school physician and to raise a sum of money for the same.

Art. 14. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for music supervisor for the schools.

Art. 15. To see if the town will vote to raise \$1,500.00 as a sinking fund on our school bonds, also \$1,425.00 to pay one year's interest, and to act upon anything relating thereto.

Art. 16. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for town charges, and act upon anything relating thereto.

Art. 17. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the support of the poor for the year ensuing, and to act upon anything relating thereto.

Art. 18. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to be expended on roads and bridges for the ensuing year and to act upon anything relating thereto.

Art. 19. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to be expended on sidewalks for the ensuing year and to act upon anything relating thereto.

Art. 20. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to supply deficiencies in consequences of abatements and discounts for the year ensuing and anything relating thereto.

Art. 21. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for Memorial observances.

Art. 22. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for electric lights for the year ensuing and to act upon anything relating thereto.

Art. 23. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for cemeteries for the year ensuing and to act upon anything relating thereto.

Art. 24. To see if the town will vote "yes" or "no" on the question of appropriating and raising money necessary to entitle the town to state aid and as provided in Section 19 of Chapter 25 of the Revised Statutes of 1916.

Art. 25. To see what sum of money, if any, the town will vote to raise in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 154 of the Public Laws of 1917, as amended by Chapter 157 of the P. L. of 1919; the construction of a state aid highway through the towns of Hartland, Cornville, Athens and Solon; beginning at the Hartland-Pittsfield town line and extending in a general northerly direction by the way of Fuller's Corner to Hartland Village; thence in a general northwesterly direction to the Hartland-Athens town line; thence through the town of Athens to the Athens-Cornville town line; thence through the town of Cornville to the Cornville-Athens town line; thence through the town of Athens by the way of Athens Village to the Athens-Solon town line; thence in a general westerly direction to the state highway in Solon Village.

Art. 26. To see if the town will appropriate and raise the sum of \$600.00 for the improvement of the section of state aid road as outlined in the report of State Highway Commission in addition to amount regularly raised for care of highways and bridges, the above amount being the maximum which the town is allowed to raise under provisions of Section 18 of Chapter 25 of the Revised Statutes of 1916.

Art. 27. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate under the provisions of Section 130 of the Public Laws of 1923 and to act upon anything relating thereto.

Art. 28. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the support of Volunteer Fire Company and act upon anything relating thereto.

Art. 29. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of \$25.00 to be paid as salary to the chief of the Volunteer Fire Company for the year ensuing and act upon anything relating thereto.

Art. 30. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for Hartland Free Library.

Art. 31. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to pay interest on interest-bearing debt.

Art. 32. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for water rental and to act upon anything relating thereto.

Art. 33. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to be expended for cutting bushes in the highway and to act upon anything relating thereto.

Art. 34. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for maintenance of patrol for ensuing year.

Art. 35. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to hire money, in anticipation of taxes, and to pay the town debt.

Art. 36. To see if the town will vote to have the North Hartland school bus go to Corson's Corner for the balance of the North Hartland scholars instead of paying tuition to the town of Athens, and to act upon anything relating thereto.

Art. 37. To see if the town will vote to let the transportation of our rural scholars to the lowest bidder, and to act upon anything relating thereto.

Art. 38. To see if the town will vote to authorize the assessors to rescind any amounts appropriated by the town for state aid highway construction in excess of the amount required to meet state apportionments.

Art. 39. To see what sum of money the town will vote to grant to raise to be expended and used for advertising the natural resources, advantages and attractions of the State of Maine.

Art. 40. To see what sum, if any, the town would recommend to take from the joint state aid account for the purpose of applying bituminous surface treatment to state aid roads built within the past five years in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 271, P. L. 1931.

Art. 41. To see if the town will vote to accept the list of Jurors as prepared by the Selectmen.

Art. 42. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to fix the valuation of the Hartland Mills, now belonging to the American Woolen Company, at such sum as they in their discretion may determine.

Art. 43. To see if the town will vote that all amounts due for labor shall first apply as payment on taxes, should the tax collector so demand.

Art. 44. To see if the town will vote to have the line between the town of Hartland and the adjoining towns perambulated.

The selectmen will be in session at the above named Opera House one hour before said meeting for the purpose of correcting the list of voters.

Report of Superintendent of Schools

To the Superintending School Committee and Citizens of Hartland:

I herewith submit my report of the condition and progress of your schools.

My service covers the period from July 1 to date. This time has been largely spent in becoming acquainted with the school situation. I have found the schools up to grade with a group of well-trained, experienced teachers who are doing efficient work. This speaks well for the support given by the town and the previous administration of the schools. Good schools do not just happen. They are the product of adequate financial support and wise and careful administration over a long period of years.

The following table shows the schools maintained during the current year, names of teachers, wages per week, and enrollments.

In addition to the above there are six pupils attending the Coston's Corner school in Athens for whom we pay proportionate cost.

Music has been under the supervision of Mr. Merle Walker. I wonder if the citizens really understand and appreciate the very remarkable work which is being done in music especially the work with the orchestras. The work of the grade orchestra is excellent considering the ages of the pupils and the Academy orchestra is remarkable for a school of its size. I trust the citizens will feel that they cannot afford to do without this very desirable feature of our school work.

No matter how good teachers may be they still may become better by study and training. Your teachers have sought to improve themselves by attendance at the county and state

teachers' meetings and also by study in their own local meetings. The Sebasticook Teachers' Club which includes the elementary teachers of this school union has been active. Outside speakers have been secured for lectures and demonstrations in addition to contributions by the local teachers and superintendent. The club has also made a special study of Character Education and its application to school work.

Janitor service is efficient and conveyance to the village is modern, comfortable and satisfactory. The town is fortunate in owning a motor bus which has already paid for itself and saved considerable conveyance expense besides.

The work of Dr. Moulton, the school physician, is to be highly commended. He is interested in his work and keeps very careful records of the examinations. These routine examinations are very important and their cumulative value is very great. In times like these a town cannot afford, it seems to me, to be without a school physician.

The Academy has had a successful year. There has been an enrollment of 104 of whom 56 were Hartland residents. The per capita cost to the town of Hartland has been less than \$50 per pupil while the tuition charge to other towns has been \$75 per pupil and this charge has been \$7 less than could have legally been charged and collected.

The chief interest of the public in the schools at this time seems to be a financial one. An examination of the financial situation of the schools reveals that the elementary schools have cost \$1,585.51 less than last year, a saving of over 16% and although the appropriation from the town was \$500 less and the amount received from the state school fund was \$165.17 less, yet the balance on hand at the closing of the books instead of being reduced has been increased slightly. The largest savings have been made in conveyance, \$663.52; teachers' wages, \$472.50; fuel, \$291.54; and supplies, \$193.47. The saving in high school tuition was \$810.00.

The committee and superintendent are agreed that costs must be less next year. Fuel, books and supplies and our share of the cost of Coston's Corner school are virtually fixed charges and we can hope to save but little in these items over the very low cost of the present year. Our janitor and conveyance charges have been reasonable but it is probable that some cut can be made in these items. The teachers, as always, are willing to make sacrifices and will accept reasonable cuts. I am convinced, however, that unreasonable cuts would result in the loss of some of our best teachers and our schools cannot afford this loss.

We are faced on the one hand by a demand for lower school appropriations and on the other by a heavy loss in income from the state school fund. We are informed that there will be a probable loss in this fund of at least 20%. This year we received \$2,133.43 from this source. Twenty per cent would mean a loss of over \$425.00.

It has been customary for some years to carry a substantial balance in the school fund so that there might be funds with which to run the schools immediately after town meeting. At one time, I understand, this balance was sufficient to run the schools until June. The balance this year is a little over \$1,200. The schools can be run on an appropriation of \$4,500 or \$600 less than was appropriated last year. The decrease in the state school fund of over \$400 would make an income of \$1,000 less than the year just closed and would necessitate the use of a substantial amount of the balance which, it seems to me, would be poor financial policy.

The Commissioner of Education has pointed out that the loss in the state school fund to towns is largely made up by decreased state tax and he urges that towns appropriate this amount in addition to the amount which would otherwise be appropriated. On this basis the amount which the town **should** raise would be \$4,900. This sum would run the schools efficiently, I believe, and not seriously impair the usual balance.

It is well for us to remember in these times the words of Lady Astor addressed to the people of her native America. "Don't forget your children! Time and again in England we have had to watch carefully so that when we make economies we didn't economize on our children. They must not suffer in this economic crisis. You can always build your roads and bridges. If you neglect your chidren, you can't build them again."

If in these trying times we lower the efficiency of our schools for a few years we are taking something from the children which can never be replaced. A CHILD CANNOT GROW UP TWICE! I am confident the citizens of this town will want to be fair to their children.

In closing I wish to acknowledge my appreciation of the helpful cooperation of the school committee, teachers, pupils, parents and of the former superintendent, Mr. Perry F. Shibles.


