
Dear Mr. Fisher:

Superintendent of Schools' Report

Hartland, Maine

February 10, 1959

To the Superintending School Committee and citizens of the town of Hartland:

In my report to you this year, I wish to devote most of the space allotted me to the future of education in Hartland. I will only briefly mention the present teaching force and the enrollment in the schools today.

Please note that our enrollment is still on the increase. In only two grades are there fewer pupils than the recommended teacher load. We have two new teachers in the system this year, namely, Mrs. Salisbury and Mr. Stedman. They have done very well in their respective positions. This year, for the first time, we did departmental teaching in grades six, seven and eight. At this time it seems probable that this procedure will be continued. We feel that it will better prepare the upper grade pupils for secondary school.

LOOKING TO THE FUTURE

For some time we have realized that we need more classroom and storeroom area at the elementary school. The recent inspection by the State Fire Department emphasized this need. As a result of this inspection, and the fact that the town is facing \$400.00 plus per pupil for secondary tuition, I feel that it is time we took care of our elementary school needs. We have delayed needed building on the elementary level in anticipation of some financial assistance, that now seems to be within sight. However, four classroom spaces should be provided as soon as possible. This much space is needed regardless of what may develop in the immediate future.

It was hoped that the people of Hartland would have an opportunity to vote for or against the School Administration District at this annual town meeting. However, progress was slowed down to such an extent that now it will be necessary to hold a special town meeting. I would urge all parents and other interested taxpayers to become familiar with the application of the School Administrative District and what it would mean to the future of education in Hartland. When you have the opportunity to vote on this question, exercise this privilege and right. Your vote may influence the educational program in Hartland for years to come.

May I express my appreciation for your cooperation in the past and ask for your continued interest in the schools in the future.

Report of Public Health Nurse

DIVISION OF PUBLIC HEALTH NURSING January 1 to December 31, 1958

Millions of children throughout the world will grow into adulthood with far better health than did their parents. According to communicable disease statistics the diseases which have declined so markedly, are all ones whose incidences has been affected by immunizations or by improved environmental sanitation. We can be thankful for the advance which science has made in the control of some of our most serious communicable diseases and because it has played an important role in illness and disability spared and lives saved. Improved and more frequent medical attention with the aid of many and varied clinics also helps to make a healthier community.

A series of four Child Health Conferences were held at the Scott-Webb Memorial Hospital in the Spring. We plan to start the conferences during the month of March each year. Infant and preschool children are offered physical examinations and immunizations against diphtheria, tetanus, whooping cough, smallpox and polio.

Polio clinics were held offering polio vaccine to everyone from six months to twenty years of age and expectant mothers.

Orthopedic and Pediatric clinics, sponsored by the State Department of Health and Welfare are held regularly and provide opportunity for medical consultation and care for crippled children and those with cardiac or rheumatic fever complications. There is also a clinic for the Mentally Retarded Preschool Child. Regional x-ray clinics and the services of the State Sanatorium are available to those referred by their family physician for diagnosis, x-ray or medical care.

Your Public Health Nurse wishes to thank everyone who, in any way, helped to promote better living in your community and hopes that every individual and family may realize the enjoyment of a high standard of health during the coming year.

Insofar as could be ascertained within the scope of the examination, the financial transactions of the Town appear to have been appropriately handled with such exceptions as may be noted in the accompanying comments.

Exhibits and schedules incorporated in this report present the financial position of the Town at February 10, 1959, and the result of its operations for the year then ended.

A recommendation is also offered which is believed to be worthy of your consideration.

TOWN OF HARTLAND

FEBRUARY 9, 1958 to FEBRUARY 10, 1959

An audit has been completed of the books and records of the Town of Hartland for the year ended February 10, 1959.

The records maintained by the Selectmen, Treasurer, Tax Collector, Assessors, and Town Clerk were audited. The system of internal control was reviewed. Accounting records and other supporting evidence were reviewed or tested to the extent deemed necessary under the circumstances.

It is believed that the accompanying balance sheet together with the related financial statements fairly present the financial position of the Town at February 10, 1959, and the result of its operations for the year then ended.

ASSETS

At the year end, the cash balance amounted to \$11,148.40 as compared with \$17,387.76 at the end of the previous year. Of this amount, \$3,878.09 was on deposit in a savings account in the First National Bank, Pittsfield, and the balance of \$2,270.31 was on deposit in a checking account in the First National Bank, Pittsfield. The savings account was verified by physical inspection of the bank passbook and the checking account was verified by reconciliation with the statement furnished by the bank. The savings account earned interest of \$47.08 during the year. An analysis of receipts and deposits indicated that all cash received had been promptly deposited in the bank.

During the year under review, unpaid real estate taxes on the 1957 tax commitment totaling \$1,185.45 were secured by tax liens. Cash collections on account of tax liens totaled \$643.50 and the balance at the year end was \$823.55 which represented an increase of \$505.85 over the balance at the end of the previous year. Tax acquired property was increased by \$36.10 which represented matured tax liens. The total of tax acquired property was \$364.78.

It was noted that waivers had been obtained when accepting partial payments on tax liens. Outstanding tax liens according to the records were verified by examination of the liens on file which had been properly recorded.

LIABILITIES

Tax anticipation notes totaling \$36,525.13 were issued and paid during the year. A note for \$1,886.11 as authorized at a special Town Meeting on August 11, 1958, was issued. On the issue of January 2, 1958, a payment of \$3,600 was made. The total of notes payable at the year end was \$16,286.11 and these were held by the First National Bank, Pittsfield.

Accounts payable totaled \$28.56 at the year end.

RESERVES AND SURPLUS

During the year, as authorized at the special Town Meeting, the School Bus Fund of \$4,514.91 and the School Building Fund of \$3,000 were transferred to Common Schools. The Cemetery Water Fund amounted to \$807.54 at the year end and was invested in a savings account. The savings account was verified by physical inspection of the bank passbook.

Unexpended balances in certain appropriation accounts which were carried forward to the current year for expenditure totaled \$11,537.88. This represents a net decrease of \$2,929.60 from the balance carried forward at February 8, 1958. A complete analysis of the account comprising this balance appears on Exhibit D of this report.

The unappropriated surplus of \$4,300.16 represented an increase of \$773.82 as a result of the year's operations. The change in this account is analyzed in detail on Exhibit E.

TRUST FUNDS

The investments of the trust funds were verified by physical examination of the securities and bank passbooks. All income received appeared to have been properly recorded and expended in accordance with the terms of the bequests. Included in the trust funds are \$700 which is being held pending acceptance at the annual Town Meeting. Funds totaling \$1,950 were accepted at the last Town Meeting.

GENERAL

Excise tax receipts totaled \$7,029.42. Of this amount, \$5,000 was appropriated for winter roads at the annual Town Meeting and the balance of \$2,029.42 was credited to unappropriated surplus.

Supplemental taxes totaling \$154.80 were collected during the year.

The records maintained by the various municipal officials were found to have been kept in an excellent manner.

Warrant for Annual Town Meeting

STATE OF MAINE

COUNTY OF SOMERSET

To Claude E. Fisher, a constable in the Town of Hartland, in the County of Somerset,

GREETINGS:

In the name of the State of Maine, you are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants of the Town of Hartland in said County, qualified by law to vote in town affairs, to meet and assemble at the Consolidated School Gymnasium in said town, Saturday, the fourteenth day of March, A. D. 1959 at ten o'clock in the forenoon, then and there to act upon the following articles, namely:

Article 1. To choose a moderator to preside at said meeting.

Art. 2. To choose a clerk for the ensuing year.

Art. 3. To see if the town will vote to accept the report of the Municipal Officers and other town officials.

Art. 4. To see if the town will vote to elect it's selectmen, assessors and overseers of the poor on a three year, two year and one year basis at the annual town meeting in March 1960.

Art. 5. To choose all necessary town officers, selectmen,, overseers of the poor, assessors, school committee member for three years, school district trustee for three years, Pine Grove Cemetery Committee member for three years.

Art. 6. To see if the town will vote to elect one or more road commissioners for the ensuing year.

Art. 7. To see if the town will vote to instruct it's selectmen to appoint the town manager as road commissioner for the ensuing year.

Art. 8. To see if the town will vote to pay the State rate for laborers, foremen and trucks on any town work, \$250 each for the combined office of selectman, assessor and overseer of the poor, \$100 for town clerk, \$100 for fire chief.

Art. 9. To see when the town will vote to have their taxes committed, when they will make them payable, what rate of interest shall be charged, and from what dates or anything relating thereto.

June 1, Polls — — June 1, Estate — — October 1, Interest if unpaid December 1 at 6%.

Art. 10. To see if the town will vote to authorize the tax collector to allow a discount for early payment of taxes, and if so at what rate.

Art. 11. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen and treasurer to procure loans in anticipation of taxes and to issue notes therefor, or renewals thereof, in accordance with Sections 109 of Chapter 91 of the Revised Statutes of 1954 as amended.

Art. 12. To see if the town will vote to reconstruct North Street and to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,000.00 to pay the cost of same.

Budget Committee recommends \$3,000.00.

Art. 13. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for repairs to village streets and bridges.

Budget Committee recommends \$1,400.00.

Art. 14. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to employ a special officer to enforce the parking and traffic ordinances of the Town of Hartland and to raise and appropriate the sum of \$350.00 as compensation for said officer.

Budget Committee recommends \$350.00.

Art. 15. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate to be expended on winter roads.

Budget Committee recommends \$7,500.00. \$5,000.00 to be taken from excise tax receipts and \$2,500.00 from taxation. 1000 yards of sand properly salted to be stockpiled next fall.

Art. 16. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for State Aid Construction, (in addition to the amount regularly raised for the care of ways, highways and bridges,) under the provisions of Section 44 and 49, Chapter 23, Revised Statutes of 1954 as amended.

Budget Committee recommends \$1,200.00.

Art. 17. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for care of winter sidewalks.

Budget Committee recommends \$800.00.

Art. 18. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for payment of Health and Welfare services for the ensuing year.

Budget Committee recommends \$2,000.00.

Art. 19. To see what instructions the town wishes to give the Superintending School Committee relative to the paying of secondary tuition charges against the town, which are over and above the legal rate required by law to be paid.

Art. 20. To see if the town will authorize the Hartland School District Committee to borrow money and construct an addition to the consolidated school as follows:

Music room, clinic room, school supply room, janitor supply room, teachers' room and office space. The above being equivalent to four classrooms including 2 small classrooms for special children.

Art. 21. To see if the town will vote to authorize its school committee to contract with the trustees of Hartland Academy to furnish instructions to its school pupils, who shall be qualified for high school work and shall attend said Academy.

Art. 22. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate to furnish instructions to its High School pupils.

Budget Committee recommends \$25,000.00.

Art. 23. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the following sum as recommended by the Department of Education for the ensuing year under 1959 recommendations.

Common Schools including Bus Reserve, Supervision, School Committee, Office and Health Services \$30,000.00

Budget Committee recommends \$30,000.00.

Art. 24. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for Christmas Lighting.

Budget Committee recommends \$300.00.

Art. 25. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for civil defense for the ensuing year.

Budget Committee recommends \$400.00.

Art. 26. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for salaries of town officers.

Budget Committee recommends \$6,050.00.

Art. 27. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for contingent account, formerly called town charge account.

Budget Committee recommends \$4,000.00.

Art. 28. To see if the town will vote to accept as a village street the town way as laid out by the selectmen and described as follows:

Beginning at the westerly end of the present town way leading to the residence of Burton Jones and extending West-ly across the land of Harold Hubbard and ending at the line between the land of Harold Hubbard and A. R. Spaulding, said proposed way to be 2 rods wide with the Northerly line of the proposed way to be the line between the land of Harold Hubbard and A. R. Spaulding, with the width of the proposed way to be on the land of Harold Hubbard, and we allow to the owner of the land over which the way passes no damages.

The name of the street to be Burton Street.

Such laying out, with the bounds and admeasurements, has been filed with the town clerk on the 12th day of February A. D. 1959, and we now hereby report such laying out with the bounds and admeasurements to the town at the town meeting legally called for acceptance of such way.

Art. 29. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to contract with Hartland Water Co. for the instal-lation of a hydrant on Burton St. and to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200.00 for annual rental of the same.

Budget Committee made no recommendation.

Art. 30. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for hydrant rental.

Budget Committee recommends \$560.00.

Art. 31. To see if the town will raise and appropriate for public nursing in Hartland, \$100.00. Said amount to be expended by Maine Department of Health & Welfare, Bureau of Health, for local service.

Budget Committee recommends \$100.00.

Art. 32. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for maintenance and improvement of the town dump.

Budget Committee recommends \$2,500.00.

Art. 33. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to contract with the Central Maine Power Co. for the installation of a street light on the pole near the residence of Ernest Hughes on the Athens road. Said light to be a 1000 lumen light.

Art. 34. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for street lighting for the ensuing year.

Budget Committee recommends \$2,600.00.

Art. 35. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for maintenance of fire department for the ensuing year.

Budget Committee recommends \$2,500.00.

Art. 36. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for payment of spare operators of the Red Network Fire Alarm in the absence of the regular members of the Fire Department.

Budget Committee recommends \$100.00.

Art. 37. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for repairing roads and bridges in summer, and cutting bushes other than village streets.

Budget Committee recommends \$2,600.00.

Art. 38. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for care of cemeteries, such sum to be expended under the supervision of the selectmen.

Budget Committee recommends \$1,600.00.

Art. 39. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for support of Hartland Free Library.

Budget Committee recommends \$1,500.00.

Art. 40. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for payment of interest on debt and tax notes in addition to any amount of interest collected on taxes and tax liens.

Budget Committee recommends \$600.00.

Art. 41. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,600.00 as payment on principal and \$576.00 as interest on sewer notes, payable to First National Bank of Pittsfield.

Budget Committee recommends \$4,176.00.

Art. 42. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$75.00 to be paid to the State of Maine Publicity Bureau to be expended and used for advertising the natural resources, advantages and attractions of the State of Maine in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 80, Section 95, of the revised Statutes of Maine.

Budget Committee recommends \$75.00.

Art. 43. To see if the town will vote to expend a portion of the Town Road Improvement Fund on the Moody road, so called, in North Hartland.

Art. 44. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 to be expended on the Moody road, so called, in North Hartland.

Budget Committee recommends \$500.00.

Art. 45. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,886.11 in payment of notes at the First National Bank of Pittsfield. Said notes were authorized at a special town meeting August 11, 1958, and are called highway damage notes.

Budget Committee recommends \$1,886.11.

Art. 46. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000.00 to be applied to the cost of extending the Main Street sewer from the bridge to low water mark.

Budget Committee recommends \$1,000.00.

Art. 47. To see what sum, if any, the town will vote to raise and appropriate to reimburse Blanche Pierce for damage caused by highway construction near her store.

Budget Committee made no recommendation.

Art. 48. To see what sum, if any, the town will vote to raise and appropriate to reimburse Keith Tapley for damage caused by highway construction near his grain storehouse.

Budget Committee made no recommendation.

Art. 49. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$750.00 annually for surfacing and tarring of that part of the Ford Hill Road in Hartland, until said road is completed.

This article received too late for budget committee consideration.

Art. 50. To see if the town will vote to accept the town way as laid out by the selectmen and described as follows:

Beginning on the Hartland-Athens highway near the residence of Harold Hubbard and following the same course as the present private way leading to the cottages on the shore of Great Moose Lake owned by Clifton Sprague and others and ending at the turn in the present private way at the bottom of the hill near the cottage of Thomas Shatney. The width of the above way is to be the same as that right of way width given the cottage lot owners in their deeds to the lots, and we allow to the owners of the land over which the way passes no damages.

Such laying out, with the bounds and admeasurements, has been filed with the town clerk on the 12th day of February A. D. 1959, and we now hereby report such laying out with the bounds and admeasurements to the town at the town meeting legally called for acceptance of such way.

Art. 51. To see if the town will vote to accept the following sums to be invested, and the interest therefrom only to be expended on the cemetery lots as follows:

Art. 53. To see if the town will vote to have the names printed in the annual report of persons receiving assistance from town health and welfare funds, providing such person's name is not exempt by law.

Art. 54. To see if the town will vote to have a committee of twelve citizens appointed to cooperate with the school committee and selectmen in preparing and presenting at the next annual meeting a recommended budget for said meeting.

Art. 55. To see if the town will vote to direct the selectmen to appoint a tax collector and treasurer for the ensuing year and authorize them to fix his salary.

Art. 56. To see if the town will vote to ask the assessors to abate taxes on new houses for one year after occupancy with a tax value of not less than \$1,000.00; and new industries maintaining a payroll of not less than 15 people.

Art. 57. To see what sum, if any, the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the operation of a safe, supervised place or places for winter sports, with all snow removal, supervision and construction costs to be paid by the town.

This article received too late for budget committee action.

Art. 58. To see what action the town may wish to take in regards to acquiring the outstanding stock in the Hartland Hall Association, so that the building formerly known as the Hartland Opera House will become town owned and used for town and school functions.

This article received favorable comment from the budget committee.

Art. 59. To see what sum of money, if any, the town will vote to raise and appropriate to develop the town owned lot on Great Moose Lake.

This article received too late for budget committee action.

Art. 60. To see if the town will vote to reconstruct Hubbard Ave., and to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,000.00 to pay the cost of same.

This article received too late for budget committee action.

Art. 61. To see what action the town may wish to take regarding repairing or removing the band stand in Warren Square, and what sum of money, if any, to be raised and appropriated to pay the cost of same.

This article received too late for budget committee action.

Art. 62. To see if the town will vote to accept the following town ordinance.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE TOWN OF HARTLAND

Art. 1. Sec. 1. Curfew. No person under the age of 16 years shall be on the streets in Hartland after the hour of 9:00 P. M., unless accompanied by a parent or guardian.

Art. 2. Sec. 1. Loitering. No person shall stand idling or loitering upon any sidewalk, or in or about the entrance to any public place of business or amusement or opposite or in front of any premises on either side of any street, alley or lane to the annoyance of the passerby or the owners or occupants of such places or premises.

Art. 3. Sec. 1. Penalty. Whoever violates any of the foregoing ordinances shall upon conviction, be punished by a fine of not more than twenty dollars.

Art. 3. Sec. 1. Jurisdiction. All courts in the County of Somerset, having jurisdiction over misdemeanors occurring in the Town of Hartland, shall have jurisdiction of prosecution for violation of these ordinances.

Art. 63. To act upon any other matters that may legally come before any town meeting.

The Selectmen hereby give notice that they will be in session for the purpose of correcting and revising the list of voters Wednesday, Thursday and Friday forenoon, March 11th, 12th and 13th from 9 to 11:30 A. M.

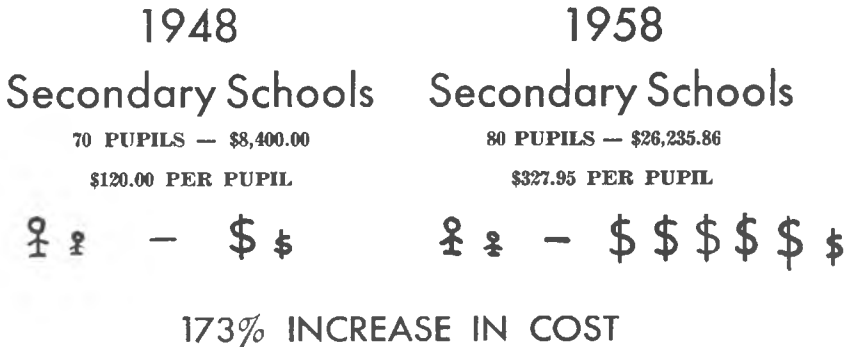
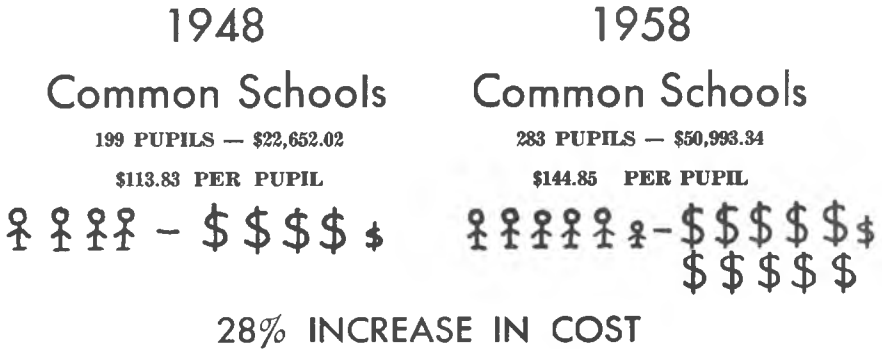
