### 1960 - A Year of Accomplishment.

Your municipal officers present for your approval this annual report.

Outlined below is a brief summary of progress made this year:

#### HIGHWAYS:

North Street was finished and a heavy coat of tar cover was applied. Maintenance on this street should be very low for a number of years.

State Aid Construction was started on Pleasant Street. It is hoped to finish a long stretch of this street in 1961 with a sidewalk at curb level.

TRIF funds were used again on the Vigue Road. Construction costs are high in this area and a gain of about 700 feet was realized.

#### **PROTECTION:**

Approximately 2400 feet of various sizes of sewer pipe were installed on Pleasant Street during construction. 1961 should see this project finished.

Cemetery fences were painted this year making a noticeable improvement.

#### EDUCATION:

Several meetings have been held with committees from nearby towns relative to construction of a secondary school unit. It is felt that a six year high school and utilization of the Academy building for two grades from Hartland and nearby towns may solve our crowded elementary situation.

#### A LOOK AT THE FUTURE:

At the annual 1961 town meeting a long term financed, capital improvement program will be presented. This should receive careful study. If our town is to move ahead, this program will provide services that we need. Should employment conditions become too bad, a public works program may be the answer and some sort of Federal assistance may be available.

Your decision at town meeting can shape the course of our town for the next few years. Please attend and present your views.

# Superintendent of Schools' Report

Hartland, Maine

10 February 1961

To the School Committee and Citizens of the Town of Hartland.

It is with pleasure that I submit my annual report to you on the progress being made in your schools. For the most part the progress in the school has been favorable in all areas. There are still, unsatisfactory conditions existing that can only be improved by more rooms and more teachers. Until more elementary classrooms and more elementary teachers are available not much can be done to help the crowded conditions and also help the retarded pupils. A big step forward was taken this past summer, when the school department instituted a four weeks summer course to any and all pupils on a voluntary basis. About 40 pupils took advantage of this school and they gained much help in subject areas that was giving the most trouble. It is planned to conduct a similar program during the summer of 1961.

Following is a brief outline of the school enrollment with teachers listed by grades. You will note there are five new teachers listed for this year. Many of our former teachers moved on to new positions. It is early yet to tell just how successful we have been in replacing those teachers. At present the new teachers seem to be adjusting well and doing good work.

Elsewhere in the town report will be recommendations and suggestions for improvement in school buildings. In the past I have made recommendations for more rooms and more teachers on the elementary level. Whether the additional rooms are from new construction or from buildings already in use, it makes very little difference. The big need is more classrooms.

The need on the secondary level is a matter of numbers as much as anything else. The only way to improve this situation in the near future is to combine secondary schools with nearby communities that face the same problems that we face. The cost of an accredited secondary school can only be justified by an enrollment large enough to warrant the expenditure of funds to have a good school.

In conclusion, may I express my appreciation for your cooperation during the past year.

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# School Physician's Report

Examination of the pupils of Hartland schools showed the general health of this group was excellent. A few correctable disabilities were noted and the parents were notified. The students appeared alert, responded well, for the most part, to psychological observation.

The general health has markedly improved over the period of years and appears much better than in the pre-consolidation period. Cooperation of the Department of Health has been appreciated and this service should be commended for their directives and interest in our children's welfare. The teachers, too, are more versed in recognizing symptoms and signs than in previous years. They also should be congratulated for their interest and concern in the progress and well being of their charges.

Routine examinations have paid off in this improvement of the children's physical and mental conditioning. Nutrition, in general, has markedly been effected by the school lunch programs coupled with a higher standard of living and parental concern.

# Annual Report of Public Health Nursing Services in Hartland for the Year 1960

Public health, in simple terms, is the sum total of the health of individuals and families living in a community. An organized program for public health is one that offers those individuals and families every possible chance of living and enjoying life, free from the handicaps of preventable disease and disability. In more formal terms, the objective of a public health program is to bring to all the people the benefits of modern medical and related sciences including the care and rehabilitation of the sick and disabled, the promotion of healthful living, and the prevention and control of disease.

A number of people are involved in the attaining of this objective. All together they make up a "health team." The public health nurse is an essential member of this team. She shares in planning and action with other workers in the fields of health, education, and welfare; with physicians, hospitals, clinics; with school personnel; with citizen groups. One of her important functions is coordination with the others involved to provide public health services to individuals, families, and community. Citizens of the community are also essential memhers of the health team. Alert to the health needs of their community, taking their share of responsibility to meet these needs, their contribution as health workers is indispensable to the effectiveness of the public health program. A vital, dynamic, working "health team" in the local community strengthens the public health not only of that community, but also of the State and the Nation.

A series of three Child Health Conferences was held at the Scott-Webb Memorial Hospital in Hartland. Physical examinations and immunizations against diphtheria, tetanus, whooping cough, smallpox and polio were offered to all infant and preschool children. School children were offered polio immuizations.

The puretone audiometer was used to check the hearing of the school children.

Home visits have been made to assist families in seeking medical core. Referrals to state and local clinics have been made at the request of the family physician.

I wish to thank every one who, in any way, helped to promote better living in your community.

# Auditor's Report

The examination was conducted in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards applicable in the circumstances and included all procedures which were considered necessary. Insofar as could be ascertained within the scope of the examination, the financial transactions of the Town appear to have been appropriately handled with such exceptions as may be noted in the accompanying comments.

Exhibits and schedules incorporated in this report present the financial position of the Town at February 10, 1961, and the result of its operations for the year then ended.

Recommendations are also offered which are believed to be worthy of your consideration.

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## TOWN OF HARTLAND

### FEBRUARY 11, 1960 to FEBRUARY 10, 1961

An audit has been completed of the books and records of the Town of Hartland for the year ended February 10, 1961.

The records maintained by the Selectmen, Treasurer, Tax Collector, Assessors, and Town Clerk were audited. The system of internal control was reviewed. Accounting records and other supporting evidence were reviewed or tested to the extent deemed necessary under the circumstances.

It is believed that the accompanying balance sheet together with the related financial statements fairly present the financial position of the Town at February 10, 1961, and the result of its operations for the year then ended.

#### ASSETS

At the year end, the cash balance amounted to \$5,898.44 as compared with a balance of \$20,044.35 at the end of the previous year. Of the cash balance at the year end, \$2,626.85 was on deposit in a savings account in the First National Bank, Pittsfield, and \$3,271.59 was on hand. The savings account was verified by inspection of the bank passbook and the cash on hand was verified by physical count. A checking account is maintained from which all disbursements are made. The total amount of each warrant is transferred from the savings account to the checking account at the time of the preparation of the warrant. Therefore, any balance in this account is offset by outstanding checks which have not cleared through the bank.

An analysis of the deposits with the Treasurer indicated that tax receipts are not being deposited by the Tax Collector in accordance with statutory requirements. Deposits with the Treasurer are required to be made at least once each month.

During the year, unpaid taxes assessed against real estate on the 1959 commitment totaling \$4,536.56 were secured by tax liens. All liens had been recorded with the Register of Deeds and all paid liens had been discharged. At the year end, unmatured tax liens totaled \$3,996.06.

Matured tax liens totaling \$46.00 were transferred to Tax Acquired Property. One parcel of tax acquired property was sold during the year on which a profit of \$7.37 was realized.

#### LIABILITIES

Tax anticipation notes totaling \$36,638.00 were issued and paid during the year. A sewer note of \$3,600.00 matured and was paid, leaving two more notes of \$3,600.00 each outstanding. One matures in the 1961 municipal year and the other in the 1962 municipal year. A note for \$1,095.43 was issued, the proceeds from which were used for state aid roads. This note matures next year.

#### RESERVES AND SURPLUS

The Cemetery Water Fund amounted to \$857.04 and was invested in a savings account which was verified by physical inspection of the bank passbook.

Unexpended balances in certain appropriation accounts totaling \$6,264.87 were carried forward to the ensuing year for expenditure. Complete detail of these accounts may be found on Exhibit D.

The unappropriated surplus was decreased by \$134.48 as a result of the current year's operations and totaled \$5,787.23 at the year end.

#### TRUST FUNDS

The investments of the trust funds were verified by physical inspection of the securities and bank passbooks. During the year, U.S. Savings Bonds totaling \$3,500.00 matured. These funds were reinvested in bank stock.

All investments were found to comply with statutory provisions for investment of trust funds. All income received appeared to have been properly recorded and expended in accordance with the terms of the bequests. A fund of \$100.00 was received during the year and is held in the General Fund of the Town pending acceptance at the annual meeting.

#### GENERAL

Excise tax receipts totaled \$7,460.05. This was verified by examination of the copies of the receipts retained by the Tax Collector. It was noted that excise tax receipts are not being deposited with the Treasurer as often as required. These receipts should be deposited with the Treasurer at least once in every 30 days.

The following corporate surety bond was on file: Claude E. Fisher — Town Manager, Treasurer, Tax Collector — Aetna Casualty & Surety Co., No. 77S324 \$15,000.00

Supplemental taxes totaling \$328.80 were collected during the year. These had not been committed to the Tax Collector.

3. That, supplemental taxes be committed to the Tax Collector.

## Warrant for Annual Town Meeting

#### STATE OF MAINE

#### COUNTY OF SOMERSET

To Claude E. Fisher, a constable in the Town of Hartland, in the County of Somerset,

#### GREETINGS:

In the name of the State of Maine, you are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants of the Town of Hartland in said County, qualified by law to vote in town affairs, to meet and assemble at the Consolidated School Gymnasium in said town, Saturday, the eleventh day of March, A.D. 1961 at ten o'clock in the forenoon, then and there to act upon the following articles, namely:

Article 1. To choose a moderator to preside at said meeting.

Art. 2. To choose a clerk for the ensuing year.

Art. 3. To see if the town will vote to accept the report of the Municipal Officers and other town officials.

Art. 4. To choose all necessary town officers, selectmen, overseers of the poor, assessors, school committee member for three years, school district trustee for three years, Pine Grove Cemetery Committee member for three years.

Art. 5. To see if the town will vote to elect one or more road commissioners for the ensuing year. Art. 6. To see if the town will vote to instruct its selectmen to appoint the town manager as road commissioner for the ensuing year.

Art. 7. To see if the town will vote to pay the State rate for laborers, foremen and trucks on any town work, \$250.00 each for the combined office of selectmen, assessors and overseers of the poor, \$100.00 for town clerk, \$100.00 for fire chief.

Art. 8. To see when the town will vote to have their taxes committed, when they will make them payable, what rate of interest shall be charged, and from what date or anything relating thereto.

June 1, Polls — June 1, Estate — October 1, Interest if unpaid December 1, at 6%.

Art. 9. To see if the town will vote to authorize the tax collector to allow a discount for early payment of taxes, and if so, at what rate.

Art. 10. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen and treasurer to procure loans in anticipation of taxes and to issue notes therefor, or renewals thereof, in accordance with Sections 109 of Chapter 91, of the Revised Statutes of 1954 as amended.

Art. 11. To see if the town will vote to change the date of closing its books from February 10 to January 31 of each year.

Art. 12. To see if the town will vote to change the date of the annual town meeting from the second Saturday in March to the Third Saturday in March.

Art. 13. To see if the town will vote to use excise tax monies collected during the ensuing year to complete Pleasant Street sewer, build sidewalk at curb level on Pleasant Street and concrete steps to Hospital and residences of Joseph Connell and Jean Moore.

Art. 14. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for repairs to village streets and bridges.

Budget Committee recommends \$1,500.00.

Art. 15. To see if the town will vote to employ a special officer under the jurisdiction of the selectmen, to perform such work as they may direct; and to employ two lady traffic guides, under the jurisdiction of the school department, one to be stationed is Warren Square, and the other at the intersection of Pittsfield Avenue and Main Street, during the periods that school children are passing to and from school.

Budget Committee recommends \$350.00 for special officer and \$600.00 for pay of traffic guides and uniforms.

Art. 16. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate to be expended on winter roads.

Budget Committee recommends \$7,300.00.

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Art. 17. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for State Aid Construction, (in addition to the amount regularly raised for the care of ways, highways and bridges,) under the provisions of Section 44 and 49, Chapter 23 Revised Statutes of 1954 as amended.

Budget Committee recommends \$2,664.00.

Art. 18. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen and treasurer to anticipate 1962 and 1963 State Aid funds, provided, special funds are granted by the State equal to the amount of the anticipated funds for the reconstruction of Pleasant Street. And that the Selectmen and Treasurer be authorized to issue notes and renewals thereof in an amount up to the amount of anticipated funds if needed.

Budget Committee recommends yes.

Art. 19. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the care of winter sidewalks.

Budget Committee recommends \$1,000.00.

Art. 20. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for payment of health and welfare services for the ensuing year.

Budget Committee recommends \$2,500.00.

Art. 21 To see if the town will vote to authorize the Hartland School District Trustees to borrow money and construct 4 classrooms, combination gymnasium-cafeteria with outside boiler room and janitor room and remodel present gymnasium into library and music room.

Budget Committee made no recommendations.

Art. 22. To see what action the town may wish to take regarding construction of a secondary education building.

Budget Committee made no recommendations.

Art. 23. To see if the town will vote to authorize its school Committee to contract with the trustees of Hartland Academy to furnish instruction to its school pupils, who shall be qualified for high school work and shall attend said Academy.

Art. 24. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for educational purposes, as follows; Instruction, fuel, janitor service, conveyance, supplies, textbooks, board of pupils, health services, administration, secondary tuition and maintenance of plant and equipment.

Budget Committee recommends \$44,000.00.

Art. 25. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Ohristmas lighting.

Budget Committee recommends carry balance of \$97.54 and raise and appropriate \$200.00.

Art. 26. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for civil defense for the ensuing year.

Budget Committee recommends carry balance of \$374.50.

Art. 27. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for salaries of town officers.

Budget Committee recommends \$6,200.00.

Art. 28. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for payment of liability and fire insurance on town hall.

Budget Committee recommends \$1,100.00.

Art. 29. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for contingent account, formerly called town charge account.

Budget Committee recommends \$4,000.00.

Art. 30. To see if the town will vote to adopt the provisions of the Workmen's Compensation Act according to Chapter 31, Sections 1 to 47 inclusive of Revised Statutes of 1954 as amended. And to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 to pay the cost of the same for the ensuing year.

Budget Committee recommends adopt and raise \$500.00.

Art. 31. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for hydrant rental.

Budget Committee recommends \$4,600.00.

Art. 32. To see if the town will raise and appropriate for public nursing in Hartland \$100.00. Said amount to be expended by Maine Department of Health and Welfare, Burcau of Health, for local service.

Budget Committee recommends \$100.00.

Art. 33. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for maintenance and improvement of the town dump.

Budget Committee recommends \$2,500.00.

Art. 34. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to contract with the Central Maine Power Co. for the installation of a 1000 lumen street light on Crosby St. near the residence of Dr. Southworth and a 1000 lumen street light near the rear entrance of the Consolidated School.

Art. 35. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for street lighting for the ensuing year.

Budget Committee recommends \$2,700.00.

Art. 36. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for maintenance of Fire Department for the ensuing year.

Budget Committee recommends \$3,500.00.

Art. 37. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate to be paid to Hartland Volunteer Fire Department for service on the Red Network Fire Alarm.

Budget Committee recommends \$100.00.

Art. 38. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for repairing roads and bridges in summer and cutting bushes other than village streets.

Budget Committee recommends \$3,000.00.

Art. 39. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for care and improvement of cemeteries.

Budget Committee recommends \$1,700.00.

Art. 40. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for support of Hartland Free Library.

Budget Committee recommends \$1,600.00.

Art. 41. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for payment of interest on debt and tax notes in addition to any amount of interest collected on taxes and tax liens.

Budget Committee recommends \$1,250.00.

Art. 42. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,600.00 as payment on principal and \$288.00 as interest on sewer notes, payable to First National Bank of Pittsfield.

Budget Committee recommends \$3,888.00.

Art. 43. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$75.00 to be paid to the State of Maine Publicity Bureau to be expended and used for advertising the natural resources, advantages and attractions of the State of Maine in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 80, Section 95 of the Revised Statutes of Maine.

Budget Committee recommends \$75.00.

Art. 44. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,000.00 to be expended, in conjunction with TRIF funds received from the State, on the Vigue Road.

Budget Committee recommends \$2,000.00.

Art. 45. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 to be expended for the development of the town owned lot on Great Moose Lake.

Budget Committee recommends \$500.00.

Art. 46. To see if the town will vote to accept the following sum to be invested, and the interest therefrom only to be expended on the cemetery lot as follows:

Dorothy Deering Lot No. 239 — Pine Grove Cemetery \$ 100.00

Art. 47. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to sell and convey property acquired by town tax process, and on such terms as they deem advisable and execute quitclaim deeds for such property after properly advertising such property.

Art. 48. To see if the town will vote to have the names printed in the annual report of persons receiving assistance from town health and welfare funds, providing such persons is not exempt by law. Art. 49. To see if the town will vote to have a committee of 12 citizens appointed to cooperate with the school committee and selectmen in preparing a recommended **budget** for the next annual meeting.

Art. 50. To see if the town will vote to direct the selectmen to appoint a tax collector and treasurer for the ensuing year and authorize them to fix his salary.

Art. 51. To see if the town will vote to ask the assessers to abate taxes on new houses for one year after occupancy with a tax value of not less than \$1,000.00; and new industries maintaining a payroll of not less than 15 people.

Art. 52. To see if the town will vote to exercise its option to repurchase the Legion Hall from Steeves-McCormack Post No. 141, American Legion, and if repurchased how it shall be financed.

Art. 55. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to acquire on a rental purchase plan a heavy duty front end loader. This machine to be used on clean-up work at the dump and snow removal in the compact village section and such other work as the selectmen may direct. The design of this Institution is to afford young persons of both sexes the means of acquiring a good English education; to prepare young men for College; to communicate a practical knowledge of modern languages; and especially to qualify teachers for their calling.

In all the different departments, the mode of instruction is designed to be systematic and thorough; to train the student to think; to teach him principles and their application; and to assist and direct him in the acquisition of knowledge.

#### GENERAL EXERCISES

Weekly exercises, alternately in Composition and Declamation, are required of the young men; and in Composition and Reading, of the young ladies. From these exercises none are excused, but for the most satisfactory reasons.

The Scriptures are read daily, and a prayer offered as an opening exercise.

There are daily exercises in Reading, Spelling and English Grammar.

#### REQUIREMENTS

All are expected to be punctual in their attendance upon required exercises; to be quiet and orderly in and about the school room; to be kind and respectful in their demeanor, and studious and exemplary in their habits.
