1962 - 1963: A year of change . . .

After several years and countless special meetings, our town took a forward step in education by the construction of additional classrooms at the Consolidated School. We hope we have made the proper move to care for our common school needs for some time to come.

This is the first year for some time that excise tax receipts were lower than the previous year. Using this as a measure your Municipal Officers do not feel that the town should add any new projects to the Capital Improvement Program for this year. As soon as notes outstanding are taken care of we should once more get this program going.

The first full year of operation of the town hall is over. The building is in use every day and nearly every evening. The Youth Center Program is working out very well. It is well supervised, but, so far only the age group from 8 to 13 years are accommodated. Later, we hope something can be done for the 14 to 18 age group.

Looking ahead, we can foresee no lower property taxes as long as you as citizens wish to continue the present services. Our hope for future tax reductions lies in development of our industry and lakeside properties.

The examination was conducted in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards applicable in the circumstances and included all procedures which were considered necessary. Insofar as could be ascertained within the scope of the examination, the financial transactions of the Town appear to have been appropriately handled with such exceptions as may be noted in the accompanying comments.

Exhibits and schedules incorporated in this report present the financial position of the Town at January 31, 1963, and the result of its operations for the year then ended.

Recommendations are also offered which are believed to be worthy of your consideration.

TOWN OF HARTLAND

FEBRUARY 1, 1962 to JANUARY 31, 1963

An audit has been completed of the books and records of the Town of Hartland for the year ended January 31, 1963.

The records maintained by the Selectmen, Treasurer, Tax Collector, Assessors and Town Clerk were audited. Accounting records and other supporting evidence were reviewed or tested to the extent deemed necessary under the circumstances.

It is believed that the accompanying balance sheet together with the related financial statements fairly present the financial position of the Town at January 31, 1963, and the result of its operations for the year then ended.

ASSETS

It is still the practice to deposit all monies into a savings account and to transfer from the savings account to the checking account the exact amount of the warrant. Thus, the balance of the checking account should be offset by outstanding checks. In reconciling the checking account at the year end, it was noted that the outstanding checks exceeded the bank balance by \$100. An analysis of warrants and deposits to the checking account indicated that one deposit was \$100 less than the warrant.

An analysis of the deposits with the Treasurer indicates that tax collections should be deposited by the Tax Collector with the Treasurer more frequently.

During the year, unpaid taxes assessed against real estate which totaled \$1,903.18 were secured by tax liens. All liens had been recorded and all paid liens had been discharged. Waivers had been obtained when partial payments were accepted. Unmatured tax liens totaled \$1,242.07 at the year end. Cash collections on tax liens totaled \$1,525.27 and matured liens of \$114.40 were transferred to Tax Acquired Property. Sales of tax acquired property amounted to \$1,511.61 of which \$1,155.41 represented profit on sale.

LIABILITIES

Tax anticipation notes totaling \$126,413.52 were issued and paid during the year.

Notes totaling \$13,163.43 were issued during the year and notes totaling \$26,832.45 were retired. At the year end, notes outstanding totaled \$29,554.93 as compared with \$43,223.95 at the end of the previous year. Notes outstanding were confirmed with the holder.

RESERVES AND SURPLUS

The Cemetery Water Fund amounted to \$911.82 and was invested in a savings account in the First National Bank, Pittsfield. Interest earned amounted to \$28.90. The savings account was verified by examination of the bank pass book.

Unexpended balances in certain appropriation accounts carried forward to the ensuing year for expenditures amounted to \$8,331.13 which represented a decrease of \$2,641.79 from the balance carried forward at the end of the previous year.

As a result of the current year's operations, the unappropriated surplus was increased \$1,319.63 and totaled \$3,345.53 at the year end.

TRUST FUNDS

The investments of the trust funds were verified by examination of the bank pass books and physical inspection of the securities. All investments were found to comply with statutory requirements.

All income received appeared to have been properly recorded and expended in accordance with the terms of the bequests.

New trust funds totaling \$700 were accepted at the last annual meeting and new funds totaling \$400 are now being held pending acceptance at the 1963 Town Meeting.

GENERAL

Excise tax receipts totaling \$6,686.72 were verified by examination of copies of the receipts retained by the Tax Collector.

Supplemental taxes of \$4,810.22 were collected during the year. These had not been committed to the Tax Collector.

RECOMMENDATIONS

The following recommendations appear to be worthy of your consideration:

1. That, tax collections be deposited more promptly with the Treasurer.
2. That, supplemental taxes be committed to the Tax Collector.
3. That, a trial balance be taken of the accounts in the ledger at the end of each month.

Warrant for Annual Town Meeting

STATE OF MAINE

COUNTY OF SOMERSET

To Claude E. Fisher, a constable in the Town of Hartland, in
the County of Somerset,

GREETINGS:

In the name of the State of Maine, you are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants of the Town of Hartland in said County, qualified by law to vote in town affairs, to meet and assemble at the Hartland Town Hall in said town, Saturday, the sixteenth day of March, A.D. 1963 at ten o'clock in the forenoon, then and there to act upon the following articles.

Article 1. To choose a moderator to preside at said meeting.

Art. 2. To choose a clerk for the ensuing year.

Art. 3. To see if the town will vote to accept the report of the Municipal Officers and other town officials.

Art. 4. To choose all necessary town officers, selectmen, overseers of the poor, assessors, school committee member for 3 years, school district trustee for 3 years, Pine Grove Cemetery Committee Member for 3 years.

Art. 5. To see if the town will vote to elect one or more road commissioners for the ensuing year.

Art. 6. To see if the town will vote to instruct its selectmen to appoint the town manager as road commissioner for the ensuing year.

Art. 7. To see if the town will vote to pay the state rate for laborers, foremen and trucks on any town work, \$300 each for the combined office of selectmen, assessors and overseers of the poor, \$100 for town clerk, \$100 for fire chief and \$100 for registrar of voters.

Art. 8. To see when the town will vote to have their taxes committed, when they will make them payable, what rate of interest shall be charged, and from what dates or anything relating thereto.

June 1, Polls — June 1, Estate — October 1, Interest if unpaid December 1, at 6%.

Art. 9. To see if the town will vote to authorize the tax collector to allow a discount for early payment of taxes, and if so at what rate.

Art. 10. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen and treasurer to procure loans in anticipation of taxes and to issue notes therefor, or renewals thereof, in accordance with Section 109 of Chapter 91, of the Revised Statutes of 1954 as amended.

Art. 11. To see if the town will vote to finish the sidewalk on the East side of Mill Street, as voted at the annual meeting held March 17, 1962, but not constructed due to late completion of the street, and use necessary money from the balance of 1962-1963 excise taxes to pay the cost of same.

Art. 12. To see if the town will vote to continue the Capital Improvement Program for the ensuing year with the following project.

Obtain Fireproof safe for office at an estimated cost of \$1,500.00. This was voted at both the 1961 and 1962 annual meetings but no purchase has been made as the available safes were too small.

Art. 13. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for repairs to village streets and bridges.

Budget Committee recommends \$1,600.00.

Art. 14. To see if the town will vote to employ two traffic guides under the jurisdiction of the school department, one to be stationed in Warren Square, and the other at the intersection

of Pittsfield Ave. and Main Street, and to raise and appropriate the sum of \$850.00 for compensation of the guides for the ensuing year.

Budget Committee recommends \$ 850.00.

Art. 15. To see if the town will vote to employ a special officer under the jurisdiction of the selectmen, to perform such work as they may direct and to raise and appropriate the sum of \$350.00 as compensation for said officer.

Budget Committee recommends \$ 350.00.

Art. 16. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to contract for snow removal and sanding for a period not to exceed five years on such terms as they deem advisable.

Budget Committee made no recommendation.

Art. 17. To see what action the town may wish to take regarding the purchase or lease of snow removal equipment and sander for use by the town instead of contracting as in the past.

Budget Committee recommended that costs be investigated.

Art. 18. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate to be expended on winter roads.

Budget Committee made no recommendation.

Art. 19. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for State Aid Construction, (in addition to the amount regularly raised for the care of ways, highways and bridges,) under the provisions of Section 44 and 49, Chapter 23, Revised Statutes of 1954 as amended.

Budget Committee recommends \$2,664.00.

Art. 20. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for payment of health and welfare services for the ensuing year.

Budget Committee recommends \$3,000.00.

Art. 21. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for care of winter sidewalks.

Budget Committee made no recommendation.

Art. 22. To see if the town will vote to authorize its school committee to contract with the trustees of Hartland Academy to furnish instruction to its school pupils, who shall be qualified for high school work and shall attend said Academy.

Art. 23. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for educational purposes, as follows: instruction, fuel, janitor service, conveyance, supplies, textbooks, board of pupils, health services, administration, secondary tuition and maintenance of plant and equipment.

Budget Committee recommends \$69,000.00.

Art. 24. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen and treasurer to issue renewals of the note held by First National Bank, Pittsfield on Superintendent of Schools Office. The principal and interest on the note to be paid by the School Departments of Athens, Harmony, Hartland, Palmyra and St. Albans.

Art. 25. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Christmas lighting.

Budget Committee recommends \$ 150.00.

Art. 26. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Civil Defense for the ensuing year.

Budget Committee recommends that balance of \$358.55 be carried.

Art. 27. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for salaries of town officers.

Budget Committee recommends \$6,500.00.

Art. 28. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for maintenance of Town Hall.

Budget Committee recommends \$3,000.00.

Art. 29. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Contingent Account, formerly called town charge account.

Budget Committee recommends \$4,000.00.

Art. 30. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Workman's Compensation Insurance for the ensuing year.

Budget Committee recommends \$ 500.00.

Art. 31. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for hydrant rental.

Budget Committee recommends \$4,600.00.

Art. 32. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate for public health nursing in Hartland \$250.00. Said amount to be expended by Maine Department of Health and Welfare, Bureau of Health, for local service.

Budget Committee made no recommendation.

Art. 33. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for maintenance of the town dump.

Budget Committee recommends \$1,000.00.

Art. 34. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for street lighting for the ensuing year.

Budget Committee recommends \$2,800.00.

Art. 35. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for maintenance of Fire Department for the ensuing year.

Budget Committee recommends \$3,000.00.

Art. 36. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate to be paid to Hartland Volunteer Fire Department for service on Red Network Fire Alarm.

Budget Committee recommends \$ 100.00.

Art. 37. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for repairing roads and bridges in summer and cutting bushes other than village streets.

Budget Committee recommends \$3,000.00.

Art. 38. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for care and improvement of cemeteries.

Budget Committee recommends \$1,500.00.

Art. 39. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for support of Hartland Free Library.

Budget Committee recommends \$1,600.00.

Art. 40. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the payment of interest on debt and tax notes in addition to any amount of interest collected on taxes and tax liens.

Budget Committee recommends \$1,200.00.

Art. 41. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$75.00 to be paid to the State of Maine Publicity Bureau to be expended and used for advertising the natural resources, advantages, and attractions of the State of Maine in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 80, Section 95 of the Revised Statutes of Maine.

Budget Committee recommends \$ 75.00.

Art. 42. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,000.00 to be expended in conjunction with T. R. I. F. funds received from the State on the Vigue Road.

Budget Committee recommends \$2,000.00.

Art. 43. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$4,775.00 as payment on the principal and interest on Moore Dam Note.

Budget Committee recommends \$4,775.00.

Art. 44. To see if the town will vote to use the balance of \$197.50 in the skating rink account for the improvement of the rink during the ensuing year.

Art. 45. To see if the town will vote to accept the town way as laid out by the selectmen and described as follows:

Beginning at a point where the Vigue Road now ends near the cottage now owned by Juliette Veilleux and extending southerly on the westerly side of the Central Maine Power Co. right of way to pole no. 13; thence in a direct line to the property line between land now owned by Merle Hall and Gerald Martin; thence southerly and easterly and following the present private way to a point 100 feet from the west side of the Maine Central Right of Way; thence southerly parallel with the Maine Central Railroad right of way and 100 feet therefrom until the proposed way intersects Route 43 leading from Hartland to Athens and ending there. Said town way to be 50 feet wide and we allow the owners of the land over which the way passes no damages.

Such laying out, with the bounds and admeasurements, has been filed with the Town Clerk on the 21st. day of February, A. D. 1963, and we hereby report such laying out with the bounds and admeasurements to a town meeting legally called for acceptance of said way.

Art. 46. To see if the Town will vote to accept the following sums to be invested, and the interest therefrom only to be expended on the cemetery lots as follows:

Art. 47. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to sell and convey property acquired by town tax process, and on such terms as they deem advisable and execute quitclaim deeds for such property after properly advertising such property.

Art. 48. To see if the town will vote to have the names printed in the annual report of persons receiving assistance from town health and welfare funds, provided such persons are not exempt by law.

Art. 49. To see if the town will vote to have a committee of 12 citizens appointed to cooperate with the school committee and selectmen in preparing a recommended budget for the next annual meeting.

Art. 50. To see if the town will vote to direct the selectmen to appoint a tax collector and treasurer for the ensuing year and authorize them to fix his salary.

Art. 51. To see if the town will vote to ask the assessors to abate taxes on new homes for 1 year after beginning of construction with a tax value of not less than \$1,000.00; and industries maintaining a payroll of not less than 15 persons.

Art. 52. To act upon any other matters that may legally come before any town meeting.
