IMPORTANT NOTICE TO TAXPAYERS

All taxpayers should read the following requirements and comply with them.

Section 35 Chapter 81, Revised Statutes of Maine, 1944. "Before making any assessments, the assessors shall give reasonable notice in writing to the inhabitants by posting notifications in some public place in the town, or shall notify them, in such other ways as the town directs, to make and bring in to them true and perfect lists of their polls and their estates real and personal, not by law exempt from taxation, of which they were possessed on the 1st day of April of the same year. If any resident owner after such notice, or any non-resident owner after being reasonably requested thereto by the assessors, does not bring in such list, he is thereby barred of his right to make application to the assessors or the county commissioners for any abatement of his taxes, unless he offers such list with his application and satisfies them he was unable to offer it at the time appointed. The request upon non-resident owners may be proved by a notice sent by mail directed to the last known address of the taxpayer or given by any other method that brings notice home to the taxpayers."

TRAFFIC ORDINANCE

Art. 55. To see if the town will vote to accept the following town or traffic ordinance.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE TOWN OF HARTLAND

- Art. 1. Sections of the town.
- Sec. 1. The business section of the town shall comprise that section of Main Street between Warren Square on the east and the intersection of Pittsfield Avenue on the west; also that section of Commercial Street from Warren Square on the south to C. I. Currie's store on the north.
- Sec. 2. The "built up" or "compact" section of the town shall be as defined in the Revised Statutes of Maine, 1930. Section 69, of Chapter 29, sub-division (d); and shall be properly marked and designated by traffic signs placed by the Municipal Officers of the town.

Art. 2. Speed limits.

No person shall drive or operate any automobile, motorcycle or other vehicle within the limits of the "built up" or "compact" or the business section of the town at a rate of speed in excess of twenty-five miles an hour.

- Art. 3. Local stop signs.
- Sec. 1. The Municipal Officers are hereby authorized and directed to place stop signs at such intersections as they deem proper for the protection and control of traffic; and every vehicle before passing such stop sign or entering such intersection shall come to a full stop, unless otherwise directed by a traffic officer stationed at such intersection.

Art. 4. Parking.

- Sec. 1. All vehicles shall stop, stand or park, only on the right hand side of the street, and as closely as practicable to the edge of the curb or side of the road, and parallel with the side of the street, except that in the business section as defined in Art. 1 of this ordinance and described as follows, "that section of Commercial street, between Warren Square on the south and C. I. Currie's store on the north," vehicles may park at an angle with the curb.
- Sec. 2. No person, except in case of emergency, or when ordered by an authorized officer to do so, shall stop, stand or park, any vehicle in such manner as to obstruct or impede the passage of other vehicles.
- Sec. 3. No person shall stand or park any vehicle in any of the following places.
 - On any sidewalk
 - b. In front of any public or private driveway.
 - c. Within ten feet of a fire hydrant.
 - d. On any cross walk.
 - e. Within fifteen feet of any street intersection.
- f. Within fifteen feet of any stop or traffic sign, installed at the side of the way, or within fifteen feet of any traffic beacon.
- g. On the road-way side of any vehicle which is stopped or parked at the curb or edge of the street, commonly called "double parking".
- Sec. 4. Commercial vehicles for the purpose of loading or unloading, or performing other necessary service, may stop or park in violation of the above laws, but, only in such manner as shall not impede the passage of other vehicles, and shall not compel pedestrians to use the streets by such violations; and such commercial vehicles shall not be parked within the business section, as defined in Sec. 1, of Art. 1, of this ordinance, for any purpose other than the necessary loading or unloading of goods and merchandise.

- Sec. 5. "All night parking", so called, is prohibited on any street designated in these ordinances, during the season when it becomes necessary to remove snow to make said streets passable.
 - Art. 6. Penalty.
- Sec. 1. Whoever violates any of the foregoing ordinances shall upon conviction, be punished by a fine of not more than twenty dollars.
 - Art. 7. Jurisdiction.
- Sec. 1. All courts in the County of Somerset, having jurisdiction over misdemeanors occurring in the town of Hartland, shall have jurisdiction of prosecution for violations of these ordinances.

I, Carl Randlett, Town Clerk of the Town of Hartland, hereby certify that the above ordinances, were adopted by vote of the annual town meeting of the town of Hartland, duly called and held, March 10, 1941.

- Art. 40. March 14, 1955 Town Meeting Voted to add to the Town of Hartland Traffic Ordinance an article to be known as Article 8 to read as follows:
 - Art. 8. Parking time limits.
- Sec. 1. The Municipal Officers are hereby authorized and directed to place parking time limit signs at such locations as they deem proper for the control of parking; and all vehicles parked in an area covered by a time limit sign

shall be allowed the parking time granted by the sign.

Sec. 2. Penalty and Jurisdiction for any violation of the above section shall be the same as Article 6 and 7 of Town of Hartland Traffic Ordinance adopted by vote of the town at its annual meeting held March 10, 1941.

1963-64

Art. 45. Amendment to art. 6 and 7 of the Town of Hartland Traffic Ordinance adopted by the vote of the Town of Hartland at its annual meeting held March 10, 1941.

Violators of Article 4 of the Parking Ordinance shall be adjudged to pay to the Town Clerk the sum of one dollar for each and every offense. Upon failure to pay the fine, within 15 days; all courts in the County of Somerset, having jurisdiction over misdemeanors, occurring in the Town of Hartland, shall have jurisdiction over continuation or appeal from such violation.

Annual Report of Public Health Nursing Services in Hartland for the year 1967

Public health nursing has always been interested in the promotion of health and the prevention of disease. Health needs are constantly changing as medical science advances and as new needs occur. It is necessary to continually evaluate and assess the health needs and programs of a community. Services provided are in keeping with broadened functions and new trends. The public health nurse is one member of a team that works to alleviate suffering, restore health, prevent illness, and promote healthful living. Some of her services include health teaching of individuals and families in their homes; nursing care of the sick and rehabilitation of the handicapped under the direction of the family physician; and prevention and control of communicable disease through immunization clinics and health education.

A statistical summary of some of the public health nursing services provided in Hartland is as follows:

CHILD HEALTH CONFERENCE PROGRAM Number Children Examined by Physician 24 Number Immunized: Diphtheria, Tetanus, Whooping Cough 28 Polio 76 Smallpox 1

The State Department of Health and Welfare conducts Orthopedic, Pediatric, Cardiac, Cystic Fibrosis, Hemophilia, Cleft Palate Evaluation, Hard of Hearing and Speech Clinics and the Clinic for Mentally Retarded Preschool Children. Referrals to these clinics have been made at the request of the family physician and home visits made to assist families in carrying out clinic recommendations for treatment.

Your public health nurse wishes to thank everyone who has helped to promote better living in your community.

An audit has been completed of the books and records of the Town of Hartland for the year ended January 31, 1968.

The records maintained by the Selectmen, Tax Collector, Assessors, Town Clerk and Treasurer were audited. The system of internal control was reviewed. Accounting records and other supporting evidence were reviewed or tested to the extent deemed necessary under the circumstances.

It is believed that the accompanying balance sheet together with the related financial statements fairly presents the financial position of the Town at January 31, 1968, and the results of its operations for the year then ended.

An analysis of the deposits with the Treasurer indicates that tax collections were deposited promptly by the Tax Collector with the Treasurer.

During the year, unpaid taxes assessed against real estate which totaled \$2,735.71 were secured by liens. All liens had been recorded and all paid liens had been discharged. Waivers had been obtained when partial payments had been accepted. Unmatured liens totaled \$1,291.45 at the year end. Cash collections on tax liens totaled \$2,559.95.

LIABILITIES

Tax anticipation notes totaling \$64,733.84 were issued and paid during the year. The balance of the State Aid Road Note of \$8,683.84 was retired. A Sewer Note in the amount of \$15,000.00 was issued and the amount of \$11,383.31 was paid, leaving a balance of \$3,616.69, at the year end.

RESERVES AND SURPLUS

The cemetery water fund amounted to \$1,113.36 and was invested in a savings account with the First National Bank of Pittsfield. Interest earned amounted to \$43.08. The savings account was verified by examination of the passbook.

Unexpended balance in the Civil Defense Account of \$200.00 was carried to the 1968-69 year. The Pine Grove Cemetery account amounted to \$2,329.02 at the year end.

As a result of the current year's operations, the surplus was decreased by \$1,765.55 and totaled \$22,269.91 at the year end. At the annual town meeting it was voted to transfer from surplus \$4,000.00 for Fire Department,

\$6,540.00 for Hydrant Rental and \$303.00 for Kennebec Mental Health

TRUST FUNDS

The investments of the trust funds were verified by examination of the passbooks and physical inspection of the securities. All investments were found to comply with statuatory requirements.

All income received appeared to have been properly recorded and expended in accordance with terms of the bequests.

New funds totaling \$450.00 were accepted at the last town meeting and new funds totaling \$100.00 are being held pending acceptance.

GENERAL

Excise tax receipts totaling \$13,063.16 were verified by examination of the copies of receipts retained by the Tax Collector. At the annual town meeting it was voted to authorize the Selectmen to borrow \$15,000.00 for Sewer construction in anticipation of excise tax receipts. The amount of \$11,383.31 was transferred to the note account and \$1,679.85 to the Sewer account.

To Donald Hollister, a constable in the Town of Hartland, in the County of Somerset.

GREETINGS:

In the name of the State of Maine, you are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants of the Town of Hartland in said County, qualified by law to vote in town affairs, to meet and assemble at the Hartland Town Hall in said town, Saturday, the twenty-third day of March A.D. 1968 at ten o'clock in the forenoon, then and there to act on the following articles:

- Art. 1. To choose a moderator to preside at said meeting.
 - Art. 2. To choose a clerk for the ensuing year.
- Art. 3. To see if the town will vote to accept the report of the Municipal Officers and other town officials.
- Art. 4. To choose necessary officers, selectmen, overseers of the poor and assessors.
- Art. 5. To elect a resident of Hartland to serve on the Board of Directors of School Administrative District No. 48 for a three year term.
- Art. 6. To see if the town will vote to elect one or more road commissioners for the ensuing year.
- Art. 7. To see if the town will vote to instruct its selectmen to appoint a road commissioner for the ensuing year.

- Art. 8. To see if the town will vote to pay the state rate for laborers, foremen and trucks on any town work, \$500.00 each for the combined office of selectmen, assessor and overseer of the poor, \$100.00 for town clerk, \$200.00 for fire chief and \$100.00 for Registrar of Voters.
- Art. 9. To see when the town will vote to have their taxes committed, when they will make them payable, what rate of interest shall be charged, and from what dates or anything relating thereto. June 1, Polls—June 1, Estate—October 1, Interest if unpaid December 1, at 6 per cent.
- Art. 10. To see if the town will vote to authorize the tax collector to allow a discount for early payment of taxes, and if so, at what rate.
- Art. 11. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen and treasurer to procure loans in anticipation of taxes and to issue notes therefor, or renewals thereof in accordance with Section 109 of Chapter 91, of the Revised Statutes of 1954 as amended.
- Art. 12. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for repairs to village streets and bridges. Budget Committee recommends \$2,500.00.
- Art. 13. To see if the town will vote to employ two traffic guides under the jurisdiction of the school directors, one to be stationed in Warren Square and the other at the intersection of Pittsfield Avenue and Main Street, and to raise and appropriate the sum of \$850.00 for compensation of the guides for the ensuing year.

Budget Committee recommends \$850.00.

Art. 14. To see if the town will vote to employ a special officer under the jurisdiction of the selectmen, to perform such work as they may direct and to raise and

appropriate the sum of \$700.00 as compensation for said officer.

Budget Committee recommends \$700.00.

Art. 15. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate to be expended on winter roads, including clearing snow from Pittsfield Avenue sidewalk.

Budget Committee recommends \$13,000.00.

Art. 16. To see what sum of money the town will raise and appropriate for State Aid Road Construction (in addition to the amounts regularly raised for the care of ways, highways and bridges) under the provisions of Title 23, M.R.S.A. Sections 1101, 1103 or 1104.

Budget Committee recommends \$2,928.00.

Art. 17. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for payment of Health and Welfare services for the ensuing year.

Budget Committee recommends \$5,000.00.

Art. 18. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Christmas lighting.

Budget Committee recommends \$250.00.

Art. 19. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for civil defense for the ensuing year.

Budget Committee recommends carry the \$200.00 balance

- Art. 20. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for salaries of town officers.

 Budget Committee recommends \$9,650.00.
- Art. 21. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for insurance, heat and maintenance of the Town Hall.

Budget Committee made no recommendation.

Art. 22. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for contingent account, formerly called town charge account.

Budget Committee recommends \$5,500.00.

Art. 23. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Workman's Compensation Insurance for ensuing year.

Budget Committee recommends \$400.00.

Art. 24. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for hydrant rental.

Budget Committee recommends \$6,540.00 from surplus.

Art. 25. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate for public nursing in Hartland \$250.00. Said Amount to be expended by Maine Department of Health and Welfare, Bureau of Health for local service.

Budget Committee recommends \$250.00.

Art. 26. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for street lighting for the ensuing year.

Budget Committee made no recommendation.

- Art. 27. To see if the town will authorize the selectmen to contract with the Central Maine Power Co. to make the first year changes suggested in a three-year plan offered by them after a survey of the town's existing facilities.
- Art. 28. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for maintenance and improvement of the town dump.

Budget Committee recommends \$2,500.00.

Art. 29. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for maintenance of the Fire Department for the ensuing year.

Budget Committee recommends \$4,800.00 from surplus.

Art. 30. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate to be paid to the Hartland Volunteer Fire Department for service on Red Network Fire Alarm.

Budget Committee recommends \$100.00.

Art. 31. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for repairing roads and bridges in summer and cutting bushes other than village streets.

Budget Committee recommends \$3.500.00.

- Art. 32. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for care and improvement of cemeteries. Budget Committee recommends \$1,500.00.
- Art. 33. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for support of Hartland Free Library.

 Budget Committee made no recommendation.
- Art. 34. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the payment on debt and tax notes in addition to any amount on interest collected on taxes and tax liens.

Budget Committee recommends \$1,500.00.

Art. 35. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 to be paid to the State of Maine Publicity Bureau to be expended and used for advertising the natural resources, advantages and attractions of the State of Maine in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 91, Section 108, of the Revised Statutes of 1954.

Budget Committee recommends \$100.00.

Art. 36. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$25.00 to be paid to the Somerset County Soil Conservation District to assist them in their program.

Budget Committee recommends \$25.00.

Art. 37. To see if the town will vote to accept the following sum to be invested and the interest therefrom only to be expended on the cemetery lot as follows:

Roger Coolen

Pine Grove Cemetery Lot No. 329 \$100.00

Art. 38. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate to pay off the balance of the Commercial Street Sewer Note.

Budget Committee recommends \$3,616.69 from excise taxes.

- Art. 39. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to sell and convey property acquired by town tax process and on such terms as they deem advisable and execute quit-claim deeds for such property after properly advertising such property.
- Art. 40. To see if the town will vote to have the names printed in the annual report of persons receiving assistance from town health and welfare funds, provided such persons are not exempt by law.
- Art. 41. To see if the town will vote to have a committee of 12 citizens appointed to cooperate with the selectmen in preparing a recommended budget for the next annual meeting.
- Art. 42. To see if the town will direct the selectmen to appoint a tax collector and treasurer for the ensuing year and authorize them to fix his salary.

- Art. 43. To see if the town will vote to ask the assessors to abate taxes on new homes for one year after beginning construction with a tax value of not less than \$1,000.00; and industries maintaining a payroll of not less than 15 persons.
- Art. 44. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,000.00 to be expended under the direction of the P.T.C.C. Swimming Pool Corp. for a supervised recreation program for children.

Budget Committee recommends \$1,500.00.

Art. 45. To see what sum of money the inhabitants of the Town of Hartland will raise and appropriate to the Kennebec Mental Health Clinic. (The sum of \$303.00 is requested.)

Budget Committee recommends \$303.00 from surplus.

Art. 46. To see if the town will appropriate the sum of \$400.00 to cooperate with the Maine Forest Service and Federal Government in the control of White Pine Blister Rust in accordance with Title 12, M.R.S.A. Chapter 213, Sub-chapter 4.

Budget Committee recommends \$400.00

- Art. 47. To see if the town will authorize the selectmen to contract for snow removal and sanding for a period not to exceed five years on such terms as they deem advisable.
- Art. 48. To see if the town will authorize the selectmen to contract with James Murphy Co., to place a monument to replace the present honor roll at Warren Square. This monument would be dedicated to all Hartland Citizens who serve or will serve during time of war.
- Art. 49. To see what sum of money the town will raise and appropriate for a veterans monument at Warren

Square.

Budget Committee made no recommendation.

- Art. 50. To see if the town will vote to allow the Outlook Club to remodel the second floor of the Library building into clubroom-kitchen. The same to be done at no expense to the town.
- Art. 51. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,500.00 The same to be deposited in a bank at interest and to be used in conjunction with other funds to celebrate the 150th anniversary of the Town in 1970.

Budget Committee recommends \$1,500.00.

- Art. 52. To see if the town will vote to construct a sewer to serve the residents of Crosby Street. Money to defray cost of this to be transferred from excise taxes.
- Art. 53. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,500.00 to be expended under the direction of the P.T.C.C. Swimming Pool Corp. on the former Grange Hall. Certain renovations being necessary before the building can be put to use.

Budget Committee recommends pass this article.

Art. 54. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$450.00 for the Town's share of Social Security coverage.

Budget Committee recommends \$450.00.

Art. 55. To act upon any matters that may legally come before any town meeting.
