IMPORTANT NOTICE TO TAXPAYERS

All taxpayers should read the following requirements and comply with them.

Section 35 Chapter 81, Revised Statutes of Maine, 1944. "Before making any assessments, the assessors shall give reasonable notice in writing to the inhabitants by posting in some public place in the town, or shall notify them, in such other ways as the town directs, to make and bring in to them true and perfect lists of their polls and their estates real and personal, not by law exempt from taxation, of which they were possessed on the 1st day of April of the same year. If any resident owner after such notice, or any non-resident owner after being reasonably requested thereto by the assessors, does not bring in such list, he is thereby barred of his right to make application to the assessors or the county commissioners for any abatement of his taxes, unless he offers such list with his application and satisfies them he was unable to offer it at the time appointed. The request upon non-resident owners may be proved by a notice sent by mail directed to the last known address of the taxpayer or given by any other method that brings notice home to the taxpayers".

REPORT OF PUBLIC HEALTH NURSE

Maine Department of Health and Welfare
Division of Public Health Nursing, Bureau of Health
Annual Report of Public Health Nursing Services in
Hartland in the year 1968

As a member of the health team, the public health nurse is concerned with the prevention of disease, care of the sick, restoration of the disabled and maintenance and promotion of health in well individuals. It is necessary to continually evaluate and assess the health needs and programs of a community.

The public health nurse planned with school personnel in organizing a tuberculin skin testing program which was offered to all school personnel and children in grades 1 and 7. Sixty-nine participants had negative tuberculin skin tests.

Nurse/teacher conferences were held to share information regarding the health of individual pupils. Home visits were made when indicated.

Your nurse held conferences with community volunteers to plan and organize three child health conferences which were held at the Scott Webb Memorial Hospital. Paul R. Briggs, M. D. was the attending physician. The doctor gave medical examinations to fifty-five preschool age children who attended with their parents. The parents received health counseling by the doctor and the public health nurse as needed.

The following table presents the number of completed immunizations received by preschool children by type of immunization.

TOWN OF HARTLAND

FEBRUARY 1, 1968 TO JANUARY 31, 1969

An audit has been completed of the books and records of the Town of Hartland for the year ended January 31, 1969.

The records maintained by the Selectmen, Tax Collector, Assessors, Town Clerk and Treasurer were audited. The system of internal control was reviewed. Accounting records and other supporting evidence were reviewed or tested to the extent deemed necessary under the circumstances.

It is believed the accompanying balance sheet together with the related financial statements fairly present the financial position of the Town at January 31, 1969 and the results of its operations for the year then ended.

ASSETS

The cash balance of \$16,999.19 was reconciled as follows:

A comparison of receipts with deposits indicated that all monies received had been properly and promptly deposited in the bank.

The tax commitment for the year amounted to \$191,061.72

and to this was added supplemental taxes amounting to \$1,128.15. Cash collections of \$181,969.40 together with abatements of \$429.60 accounted for 95% of the assessment charged to the Collector. A concerted effort was made during the year to collect the outstanding taxes for prior years and to abate or charge off those which were considered uncollectable. As a result, \$5,587.59 was collected, unpaid 1967 taxes assessed against real estate of \$2,232.95 were secured by tax liens, and \$308.90 was either abated or written off. This left \$754.92 outstanding for prior years. It was noted that tax collections had been promptly deposited with the Treasurer.

The Treasurer collected \$2,201.96 on tax liens. Waivers had been issued where partial payments were received and paid liens were found to have been discharged. One matured tax lien of \$8.40 was transferred to Tax Acquired Property.

LIABILITIES

Tax anticipation notes totaling \$78,000.00 were issued and paid during the year. The balance of \$3,616.69 on the Sewer note issued last year was paid. A new note for \$25,671.73 was issued and a payment of \$12,000.00 was made during the year leaving a balance of \$13,671.73 outstanding at the year end.

RESERVES AND SURPLUS

The Cemetery Water Fund totaled \$1,158.18 at the year end. This included interest of \$44.82 which was earned during the year. The entire proceeds of this fund were deposited in a savings account in the First National Bank of Pittsfield which was verified by physical inspection of the bank passbook.

At the last annual meeting, it was voted to appropriate \$1,500.00 for a fund to be used to celebrate the anniversary of the Town. Of this amount, \$1,200 was deposited in a savings account in the First National Bank of Pittsfield and this earned interest of \$17.50 which was credited to the fund. The balance of \$300.00 was deposited in a separate checking account.

Unexpended balances in certain of the operating accounts which were carried forward to the ensuing year for expenditure totaled \$5,717.02. The two principal accounts were State Aid Roads and Pine Grove Cemetery.

As a result of the current year's operations, the unappropriated surplus was increased by \$810.53 and totaled \$23,080.44 at the year end. At the last annual meeting appropriations totaling \$11,643.00 were made from surplus.

TRUST FUNDS

During the year securities with a market value of \$8,333.50 were sold at a gain of \$2,343.50. New securities at a market value of \$14,900.00 were purchased. The investments of the trust funds were verified by physical inspection of the securities and by examination of the bank passbooks.

All income received appeared to have been properly recorded and expended in accordance with the terms of the bequests.

A fund of \$100.00 was accepted at the last annual meeting and a new fund of \$100.00 has been received during the year and is being held pending acceptance at the next annual meeting.

GENERAL

A review of the records of the Assessors indicated that supplemental taxes as well as the regular 1968 tax commitment had been committed to the Tax Collector. All abatements were found to have been signed by a majority of the Board of Assessors.

Excise tax receipts totaling \$10,020.69 were verified by examination of copies of the receipts retained by the Tax Collector.

WARRANT FOR ANNUAL TOWN MEETING

STATE OF MAINE

COUNTY OF SOMERSET

To Edgar R. Woodman, a constable in the Town of Hartland, in the County of Somerset.

GREETINGS:

In the name of the State of Maine, you are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants of the Town of Hartland in said County, qualified by law to vote in town affairs, to meet and assemble at the Hartland Town Hall in said town, Saturday, the fifteenth day of March A. D. 1969 at ten o'clock in the forenoon, then and there to act on the following articles:

Art. 1. To choose a moderator to preside at said meeting.

Art. 2. To choose a clerk for the ensuing year.

Art. 3. To see if the town will vote to accept the report of the Municipal Officers and other town officials.

Art. 4. To choose necessary town officers, selectmen, overseers of the poor and assessors.

Art. 5. To elect a resident of Hartland to serve on the Board of Directors of School Administrative District 48 for a three year term.

Art. 6. To see if the town will vote to elect one or more road commissioners for the ensuing year.

Art. 7. To see if the town will vote to instruct its selectmen to appoint a road commissioner for the ensuing year.

Art. 8. To see if the town will vote to pay the state rate for laborers, foremen and trucks on any town work, \$500.00 each for the combined office of selectman, assessor and overseer of the poor, \$100.00 for town clerk, \$200.00 for fire chief and \$100.0 for Registrar of Voters.

Art. 9. To see when the town will vote to have their taxes committed, when they will make them payable, what rate of interest shall be charged, and from what dates or anything relating thereto. June 1, Polls—June 1, Estate—October 1, interest if unpaid December 1, at 6 per cent.

Art. 10. To see if the town will vote to authorize the tax collector to allow a discount for early payment of taxes, and if so, at what rate.

Art. 11. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen and treasurer to procure loans in anticipation of taxes and to issue notes therefor, or renewals thereof in accordance with Section 109 of Chapter 91, of the Revised Statutes of 1954 as amended.

Art. 12. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for repairs to village streets and bridges.

Budget Committee recommends \$2,500.00.

Art. 13. To see if the town will vote to employ two traffic guides under the jurisdiction of the school directors, one to be stationed in Warren Square and the other at the intersection of Pittsfield Avenue and Main Street, and to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,150.00 for compensation of the guides for the ensuing year.

Budget Committee made no recommendation.

Art. 14. To see if the town will vote to employ a special officer under the jurisdiction of the selectmen, to perform such work as they may direct and to raise and appropriate the sum of \$700.00 as compensation for said officer.

Budget Committee recommends \$700.00.

Art. 15. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate to be expended on winter roads.

Budget Committee recommends \$13,000.00.

Art. 16. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for payment of Health and Welfare services for the ensuing year.

Budget Committee recommends \$5,000.00.

Art. 17. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Christmas Lighting.

Budget Committee recommends \$250.00.

Art. 18. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for civil defense for the ensuing year.

Budget Committee recommends carry the \$200.00 Balance.

Art. 19. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for salaries of town officers.

Budget Committee recommends \$10,130.00.

Art. 20. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for insurance, heat and maintenance of the Town Hall.

Budget Committee recommends \$2,000.00.

Art. 21. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for contingent account, formerly called town charge account.

Budget Committee recommends raise and appropriate \$2,500.00 and take \$3,000.00 from surplus.

Art. 22. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Workmen's Compensation Insurance for the ensuing year.

Budget Committee recommends \$500.00.

Art. 23. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for hydrant rental.

Budget Committee recommends \$6,540.00 from surplus.

Art. 24. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate for public nursing in Hartland \$250.00. Said amount to be expended by Maine Department of Health and Welfare, Bureau of Health for local service.

Budget Committee recommends \$250.00.

Art. 25. To see if the town will vote to have two street lights installed. No. 1 to be installed at the boat landing above the upper dam. No. 2 to be installed at the Town public landing on Great Moose Lake.

Budget Committee recommends Yes.

Art. 26. To see if the town will vote to install a light at the intersection of Moore Street and Main Street by the Scott Webb Hospital.

Budget Committee recommends Yes.

Art. 27. To see if the town will authorize the selectmen to contract with the Central Maine Power Co. to make the second year changes suggested in a three-year plan offered by them after a survey of the town's existing facilities.

Budget Committee recommends Yes.

Art. 28. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for street lighting for the ensuing year.
Budget Committee recommends \$3,500.00.

Art. 29. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for maintenance and improvement of the town dump.
Budget Committee recommends \$2,500.00.

Art. 30. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for maintenance of the Fire Department for the ensuing year.
Budget Committee recommends \$4,300.00 from surplus.

Art. 31. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate to be paid to the Hartland Volunteer Fire Department for service on Red Network Fire Alarm.
Budget Committee recommends \$100.00.

Art. 32. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for repairing roads and bridges in summer and cutting bushes other than village streets.
Budget Committee recommends \$3,500.00.

Art. 33. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for care and improvement of cemeteries.
Budget Committee recommends \$1,500.00.

Art. 34. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for support of Hartland Free Library.
Budget Committee made no recommendation.

Art. 35. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 to be paid to the State of Maine Publicity Bureau to be expended and used for advertising the natural resources, advantages and attractions of the State of Maine in accordance with the provisions of

Chapter 91, Section 108, of the Revised Statutes of 1954.

Budget Committee recommends No.

Art. 36. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$25.00 to be paid to the Somerset County Soil Conservation District to assist them in their program.

Budget Committee recommends \$25.00.

Art. 37. To see if the town will vote to accept the following sum to be invested and the interest therefrom only to be expended on the cemetery lot as follows:

Alfred Baird Lot (Emily Baird)

Pine Grove Cemetery Lot No. 4 \$100.00

Art. 38. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate to pay the balance of the Crosby Street Sewer Note.

Budget Committee recommends \$13,671.73 from Excise Taxes.

Art. 39. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to sell and convey property acquired by town tax process and on such terms as they deem advisable and execute quit-claim deeds for such property after properly advertising such property.

Art. 40 To see if the town will vote to have the names printed in the annual report of persons receiving assistance from town health and welfare funds, provided such persons are not exempt by law.

Art. 41. To see if the town will vote to have a committee of 12 citizens appointed to cooperate with the selectmen in preparing a recommended budget for the next annual meeting.

Art. 42 To see if the town will direct the selectmen to appoint a tax collector and treasurer for the ensuing year and authorize them to fix his salary.

Art. 43. To see what sum of money the town will raise and appropriate for State Aid Construction (in addition to the amounts regularly raised for the care of ways, highways and bridges) under the provisions of Title 23, M.R. S.A. Sections 1101, 1103, or 1104.

Budget Committee recommends \$3,192.00.

Art. 44. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to carry out the following State Aid Road Program:

Use 4 units 1968 State Aid Money, carried over

Use 4 units 1969 State Aid Money

Anticipate 4 units 1970 State Aid Money

Anticipate 4 units 1971 State Aid Money

Said selectmen to be authorized to borrow funds to pay anticipated amounts and issue notes for the same.

Budget Committee recommends Yes.

Art. 45. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the payment on debt and tax notes in addition to any amount of interest collected on taxes and tax liens.

Budget Committee recommends \$1,000.00.

Art. 46. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,000.00 to be expended under the direction of the P.T.C.C. Swimming Pool Corp. for a supervised recreation program for children.

Budget Committee recommends \$2,000.00

Art. 47. To see what sum of money the inhabitants of the town will raise and appropriate to the Kennebec Men-

tal Health Clinic. (The sum of \$303.00 is requested.)

Budget Committee recommends \$303.00 from surplus.

Art. 48. To see if the town will appropriate the sum of \$400.00 to cooperate with the Maine Forest Service and Federal Government in the control of White Pine Blister Rust in accordance with Title 12, M.R.S.A. Chapter 213. Sub-chapter 4.

Budget Committee recommends \$400.00.

Art. 49. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,500.00. The same to be deposited in a bank at interest and to be used in conjunction with other funds to celebrate the 150th anniversary of the town in 1970.

Budget Committee recommends \$1,500.00.

Art. 50. To see what sum of money the inhabitants of the Town of Hartland will vote to raise and appropriate for the Town's share of Social Security coverage.

Budget Committee recommends \$750.00.

Art. 51. To see if the town will vote to instruct the Selectmen to recommend to the Somerset County Commissioners that a Surplus Food Program be instituted in Somerset County at a cost of \$26,125.00, to be financed from the Somerset County Budget.

Art. 52. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to appoint a planning board as set forth in Title 30, Sec. 4952 M.R.S.

which was annexed to the Town of Pittsfield by an act of the Maine Legislature March 11, 1852.

Art. 54. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$300.00 to be used toward making a public picnic area on land belonging to the Town, situated on the North side of the Sebasticook River.

Budget Committee made no recommendation.

Art. 55. To see if the Town will vote to set up the Pine Grove Cemetery fund as a capital reserve fund, as set forth under the provisions of Title 30, Section 5201 1 A. Capital Improvement M.R.S.A. All monies from the fund to be used only for enlargement of the Pine Grove Cemetery.

Budget Committee recommends Yes.

Art. 56. To see what action the Town will vote to take in regards to construction of a sewer on North Street, and if approved, issue notes to cover cost of same.

Budget Committee made no recommendation.

Art. 57. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate, the same to be set aside towards the purchase of a new fire truck.

Budget Committee made no recommendation.

Art. 58. To see what action the town wishes to take in regards to the Band Stand and to see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate to cover cost of same.

Budget Committee made no recommendation.

Art. 59. To act upon any matters that may legally come before any town meeting.
