The Town of Hartland was awarded six new CETA slots for 1979.

Two men are being used at the Town Dump for 90 days for clearing brush, two men are being used for 1 year to assist all Senior Citizens in any handy work they might need to have done, and 2 men for Police Patrol are being used for one year.

I would like to suggest that hot top be applied to Huff Hill Road from Rte. 23 to the corner at Lewis Elliot's now that the ditching has been done and with some more gravel applied. The same should be done to Morrill Pond Road and Great Moose Drive according to the amount approved at Town Meeting.

The Town Dump was completely covered and seeded last summer and some dirt was stock piled for cover to be used next summer. There will have to be new rules and regulations made this year as to recycling and separation of garbage at the home level. This is in preparation for no more burning which we will have to be ready for by January 1, 1980.

The Hartland Pollution Control Facility has been in operation for two years and has done a tremendous job of cleaning up the Sebasticook river. We have come a long way at cleaning up the air pollution. This has required many tough decisions in the past and I am sure there will be many more in the future.

It has been a pleasure to serve you for the past 3 1/2 years, but I would like to announce at this time that I will not be seeking appointment as of the March Town Meeting.

The following is a brief report showing the status of white pine blister rust control in Hartland.

Control of the disease has been established on all of the white pine growing land in Hartland. The problem from now on will be one of maintaining control of the present area and protecting new stands as they develop.

During 1978 we examined 965 acres in Hartland. 965 acres were mapped on aerial photographs and 1,217 currant and gooseberry bushes were destroyed. The job cost \$300.00 (Town of Hartland, \$150.00; State of Maine, \$150.00).

I am pleased to report we were able to complete all work scheduled for 1978. Thank you for your cooperation.

The examination was conducted in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards applicable in the circumstances and included all procedures which were deemed necessary. Insofar as could be determined within the scope of the examination, the financial transactions of the Town appear to have been appropriately handled.

Exhibits and schedules incorporated in this report present the financial position of the Town at December 31, 1978, and the result of its operations for the year then ended.

TOWN OF HARTLAND

Ar audit has been completed of the books and records of the Town of Hartland for the year ended December 31, 1978.

The records maintained by the Town Manager, Tax Collector, Assessors and Town Clerk were audited. The system of internal control was reviewed. Accounting records and other supporting evidence were examined or tested to the extent deemed necessary under the circumstances.

It is believed that the accompanying balance sheet together with the related financial statements fairly present the financial position of the Town at December 31, 1978, and the result of its operations for the year then ended.

It was voted to close the books at December 31, instead of January 31 as had been the custom in the past. Thus the past year included only eleven months. This is a one time occurrence only and subsequent years will reflect a full twelve months unless it is voted to change the closing date again.

ASSETS

A review of the Treasurer's receipts issued indicated that all such monies had been promptly and properly deposited in the bank in the manner prescribed by statute and the balance at the year end totaled \$68,504.92. This was reconciled as follows:

The savings account in the Skowhegan Savings Bank was closed out during the year. The interest earned prior to its being closed out was credited to interest. A certificate of deposit of \$2,800 bearing interest of 5.5% and maturing May 7, 1979, was purchased from a portion of the unexpended balance of the Tennis Court account.

The assessment charged to the Tax Collector was accounted for as follows:

Undoubtedly, the eleven month year was partially responsible for the increase in Taxes Receivable at the year end as compared with last years results.

Cash collections of \$17,264.41 were made on account of prior years taxes with all collections being promptly deposited in the bank. Prior years taxes receivables were reviewed with the Town Manager and those being deemed to be uncollectible totaling \$580.80 were written off. Uncollected 1977 taxes assessed against real estate totaling \$10,037.03 were secured by tax liens. The abatements had been approved by a majority of the Assessors.

Cash collections on unmatured tax liens totaled \$8,904.88 and matured tax liens amounting to \$106.45 were transferred to tax acquired property. Waivers had been obtained when partial payments had been accepted on unmatured tax liens.

One piece of tax acquired property was sold on which a profit of \$5,307.95 was realized. This profit was credited to surplus.

State revenue sharing funds totaling \$18,958.74 as were receipts from Business Inventory amounting to \$1,830.01 were used to reduce the amount necessary to be raised by taxation. Since receipts exceeded the amount allocated, \$1,224.39 of state revenue sharing funds have been carried forward to the ensuing year for allocation.

LIABILITIES

Tax anticipation notes totaling \$80,000 were issued and paid during the year.

The ascent owing the trust funds was reduced by \$400 during the year and at the year end \$604.84 was included in General Fund cash and is owing the Trust Funds.

The amount of \$55.41 owing the Escrow Account at the end of the previous year and explained in the report for the year ended January 31, 1978, was not paid and is still outstanding.

TESALVES AND SURPLUS

neceipts from Federal Levenue Sharing, account number 20 3 012 015, totaled \$39,050 for the year under review. This represents only 3 payments as opposed to the normal number of 4, since the books were closed on December 31 instead of January 31. The fourth payment was received in January and will be reflected in the transactions for the next fiscal year.

The following allocations from 1977 Pederal Revenue Sharing receipts were authorized at the annual meeting.

The above allocations represent the receipts from four quarters in 1977 plus the interest earned from investing the receipts in certificates of deposit.

A review of the expenditures from the amounts allocated indicated that all funds had been expended for the purposes authorized with the exception of \$167 in Hydrant Bental. The amount of \$1,917 was authorized for this purpose, but only \$11,750 was expended. This left an unexpended amount of \$157 which has been carried forward to the ensuing year for expenditure.

An analysis of expenditures made from these allocations was made and it appears on Schedule A-8 of this report.

The receipts for three quarters of 1978 totaling \$39,050 have been invested in certificates of deposit and are available for allocation in 1979.

None of the funds allocated were used to obtain additional federal or state matching funds. All of the 1973 funds received have been segregated and have been immediately invested in certificates of deposit so that none of these receipts have been used in financing current operations. This policy has been consistently followed in the past.

Receipts from the Pederal Bovernment for Anti-Recessional Funds totaled \$9,313. This amount plus the interest earned of \$176.28 from investing the receipts in a certificate of deposit was allocated to the Boads and Bridger account as authorized at the annual meeting. All of these funds were expended for the purpose authorized.

No interest was added to the bank book repretenting the savings account for the Cometery Water Fund, but confirmation from the bank, Maine Mational Bank, indicated that \$92.23 had been earned in interest.

The Pine Grove Semetery Fund received \$105 from the sale of lots. The bank book representing the investment of this fund did not have the interest earned credited to it. However, confirmation from the bank indicated that \$92.37 had been earned. Since \$450 of this savings account represents investment of Cemetery Perpetual Care funds, \$71.69 is applicable to the Pine Grove Cemetery Fund and the balance of \$70.63 is applicable to Cemetery Perpetual Care funds. \$105 of the corpus of this fund is included in General Aund cash and has not been invested.

Unexpended balances of \$24,026.10 in certain of the operating accounts were carried forward to the ensuing year for expenditure. This includes the \$167 of unexpended Federal Revenue Sharing funds allocated to Hydrant Lental.

The unapporpriated surplus was increased by \$11,594.54 as a result of current years operations and totaled \$82,581.47 at the year end. A complete analysis of the change in this account may be found on Exhibit E of this report.

TRUST FUNDS

The investments of the trust funds were verified by physical inspection of the securities and bank passbooks. All interest received, with the exception of that referred to under Pine Grove Cemetery Fund had been properly accounted for and all expenditures appear to have been made in accordance with the terms of the bequests.

The 753 shares of Keyes Fibre stock were cashed with a profit of \$12,338.65 being realized. This has been added to the Appreciation of Principals account. The proceeds from the sale were invested in certificates of deposit. New funds totaling \$550 are being held pending acceptance at the next town meeting and funds totaling \$950 were accepted at the last meeting and were invested in certificates of deposit.

GENERAL

Excise tax receipts totaled \$28,467.97. Of this amount \$23,000 was allocated to Winter Roads and Sidewalks at the annual meeting. This left an unallocated balance of \$5,467.97 which was credited to surplus.

The receipts from snowmobile registrations of \$960 were allocated to Smokeys' Angels Snowmobile Club in accordance with the authorization at the annual town meeting.

Section 706, Title 36, M.R.S.A. of the Revised Statutes states that before making an assessment, the assessors shall give reasonable notice in writing to all persons liable to taxation in the municipality to furnish the assessors true and perfect lists of their polls and all their estates not by law exempt from taxation of which were possessed on the 1st day of April of the same year. This section has been amended to read: The notice to owners may be by mail directed to the last known address of the taxpayer or by any other method that provides reasonable notice to the taxpayer.

Section 5 says that if the assessors fail to give this notice as required, the taxpayer is not barred of his right to make application for abatement

The taxpayer should make out this list in writing and send it to the assessors or bring it in to them on or before April 1 of this year.

Any taxpayer receiving a town report with the above printed in it or receives a copy of the above section by mail is considered to have had a proper notice.

The selectmen hereby notify all taxpayers that they will be in session on the 1st day of April at the Town Office from 9:00 a.m. to 12:00 a.m. to receive above mentioned lists.
