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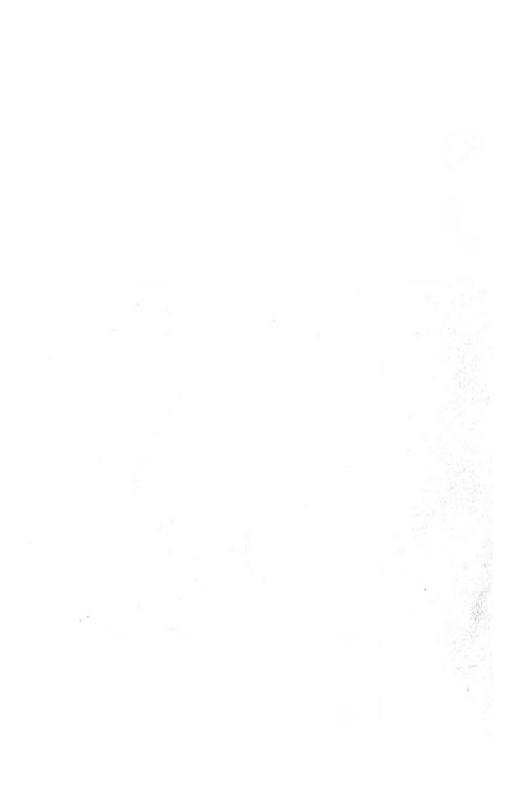

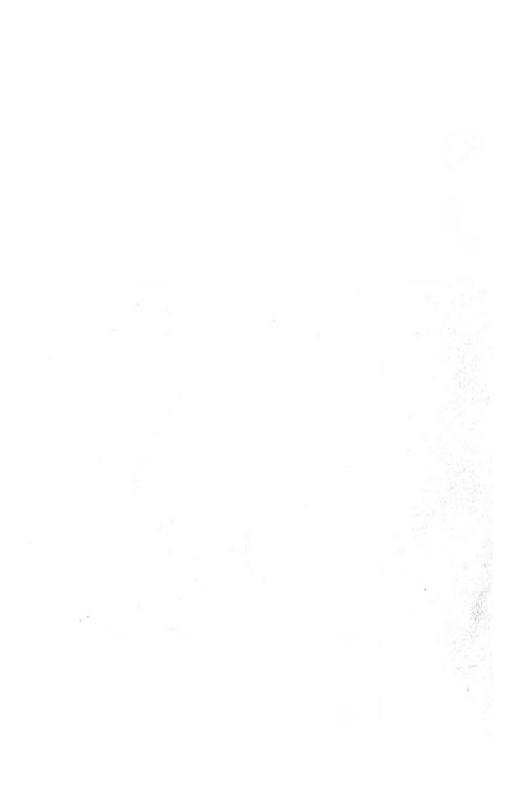

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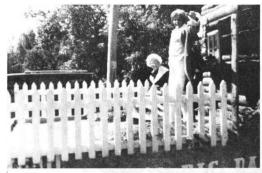

Letter of Transmittal

1986 has had its golden moments.

Assessment changes required by the Bureau of Taxation to bring all buildings and land to 100% full value was the end result of individuals paying higher prices for property in Hartland.

Town Officials had the choice of upgrading values by either hiring a certified appraiser at a cost of between \$50,000 - \$75,000 or upgrading land values and factoring the values on buildings. The assessors opted the second.

After two years of board orders and hearing, in December, The Board of Environmental Protection voted to bring the water level back to the crest of the dam.

Renovations to the dam will take place in late spring — early summer. Daily logs will be kept of water levels and rainfall.

If mother nature cooperates, this spring snow melt should not be a problem. If the sky decides to open up, we can give no guarantees!

Renovations at the treatment facility have taken place and the construction of a secured landfill is near completion.

Trial runs are continuing at the facility to insure proper chemical addition.

To date, we have had some good runs and some bad ones. Much of everyone's time has been spent on this project in 1986.

A listing of salt and sand storage piles has been compiled by the Department of Environmental Protection.

The Department has six lists from priority #1 enforcement to perfection, list #6. Hartland is on list #5.

In 1987 we will start the planning stage to address this problem.

The Planning Board will be very active in 1987 with indication of several subdivisions and planning of various future projects.

One priority will be the town dump. In 1985 the town dump after inspection was 85% in compliance with the laws.

Keeping in mind that solid waste regulations change so frequently and the State's recommendations for solution is regional landfills, this issue must be addressed in the near future.

Planning of a brief census was completed in December, 1986.

The census will be taking place at the beginning of 1987.

The data gathered from this census will be very beneficial to any future projects or grant monies the town opts to go after.

In 1987 we will be asking citizens to step forward and give their thoughts and ideas on several projects we will be working on.

The Town is fortunate to have the resource of knowledge which so many of you as citizens can share with us.

As proven in the past, when the Community has faced major decisions, you as citizens have come together as a Community to meet the challenge.

For this, each and everyone of you should be very proud.

Road Commissioner's Report

Roadsides were mowed, pot holes were patched, and repairs were made where needed.

Nearly two tenths of new construction and pavement was added to Great Moose Drive.

Whereas new paving or repaving has become so expensive and many areas are showing the stress of traffic and frost damage, I asked the selectmen permission to contract with Commercial Paving to manufacture a stock pile of cold mix. The Paving Company mixed 660 cubic yards at Lloyd Gower's pit in Canaan. This material was placed on road surfaces that showed the most stress. I am aware that riding quality is not like on hot top but a greater area was repaired for less money. I would like to see the practice continued in order to restructure badly cracked areas.

Drainage is always a problem and difficult to keep effective. Some culverts were replaced as funds allowed. More must be done.

Town streets as a rule have remained fairly sound. North Street received a short face lift to strengthen deteriorating conditions.

Commercial Street has inadequate drainage with persistent seepage from back country, and the culverts that have surfaced from frost action, need lowering.

The MDOT survey crew did much surveying in the center of town this past summer. I'm anxious to know the results of their efforts.

Eight foot extensions were added to the culverts at Morrill Pond. The laying of split granite and required amount of gravel to make a twenty-six foot roadway will be done in the spring. This is a joint effort with the Town of Canaan.

I could add many more "could or should do's" but space does not permit.

Revolving Loan Fund

The North Kennebec Valley Regional Planning Commission Revolving Loan Fund is being established for the purpose of creating permanent, good wage jobs in the region which consists of Somerset County, Northern Kennebec County, and Western Waldo County. A business may be eligible for a loan to start a business, expand a business, or maintain a business.

The business should be involved in manufacturing, processing, wholesaling or providing services which are sold outside the region so that the activity contributes strongly to the economic base of the region. In most instances the NKRPC loan will be a small percentage of the total financial package which will normally involve a bank and possibly other financing sources such as the Small Business Administration. Accordingly, it will not duplicate activities of existing programs or private lending institutions. It will supplement them, making loans possible because of shared risk, and in some cases lower interest rates than might otherwise be available. Each loan will be adequately secured to insure payback of principal and interest that will then be available to lend to another business.

The \$666,667 fund comes from a \$500,000 federal grant from the Economic Development Administration matched with \$166,667 of local money contributed by municipalities, banks, and private businesses. It is administered by a nine member committee which includes two bankers, an attorney, an accountant, a real estate appraiser, two private businessmen and two members of the NKRPC Executive Board.

The average loan is expected to be \$50,000 to be paid back within a five (5) year period.

Gentlemen:

In accordance with Title 30, Section 5253 M.R.S.A. 1964 and at your request the records of the Town of Hartland have been audited for the period January 1, 1986 to December 31, 1986, inclusive.

The financial and related statements of the General Fund, Special Revenue Fund, Debt Fund and Trust and Reserve Fund have been examined. The examination was made in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards and accordingly included such tests of accounting records and such other auditing procedures as were considered necessary in the circumstances.

In our opinion, the financial statements referred to above present the assets and liabilities arising from cash transactions of the General Fund, Special Revenue Fund, Debt Fund and Trust and Reserve Fund of the Town of Hartland at December 31, 1986, and the revenues collected and expenditures paid during the year then ended on a basis which has been applied in a manner consistent with that of the preceding year.

The related information appearing on the supporting schedules which are presented as additional supplementary data has been subjected to the tests and other auditing procedures applied in the examination of the financial statements.

In connection with the examination, tests were performed of compliance with the Revenue Sharing and Antirecession Fiscal Assistance Acts and Regulations. The only exception noted was that three entitlement payments were comingled with and are a part of the cash of the General Fund.

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SUMWARY OF POLICIES

The Maine statutes require that every municipality shall have a post audit of its records each year and that the report of aucit shall contain: letter of transmittal, comments, comparative balance sheet, analysis of surplus, statement of departmental operations, statement of valuation, assessment and collection, statement of cash receipts and disbursements and reconciliation of cash balance. Such other statements as the auditor desires may also be included in the report.

It is the policy of the Town of Hartland to print the report of audit in its entirety in its Annual Town Report which is dispensed to all of the voters of the Town at the time of the Annual Town Meeting. Others may obtain copies of the Annual Town Report upon request.

Authority for appropriations for the running of the municipality and the method by which they are to be funded is given by vote of the voters at the Annual Town Meeting. The warrants for the County Tax and the Town's share of the S.A.D.#48 appropriation are given by the County Commissioners and the Trustees of School Administrative District #48 respectively.

The assessment of taxes resulting from establishing the valuation of both real and personal property and establishing the rate is the responsibility of the Board of Assessors. The Board of Assessors also has the authority to include in the assessment of taxes an amount for overlay of an amount not to exceed 5% of the total appropriations as well as the responsibility for authorizing and approving abatements where warranted. They are autonomous in these respects.

Receipts from State Revenue Sharing are used to reduce the amount necessary to raise by taxation of real and personal property to finance appropriations made at the Annual Town Meeting.

It also is customary to finance certain specific appropriations as determined by the voters through transfer from Excise Tax Receipts and from entitlement payments received from Federal Revenue Sharing.

Authority for selling tax acquired property is given the Selectmen at the Annual Town Meeting.

BASIS OF ACCOUNTING

With the exception of property taxes, revenue is recorded when received in cash. Property taxes are recorded when committed, since they are measurable and are due within the fiscal year. At the year end certain ascertainable items of revenue, such as reimbursable items of expense which are due but have not been received, are accrued with the proper accounts being credited.

Expenditures are recorded on a cash basis with the charge being made to the accounts when the warrants are authorized by the Board of Selectmen. At the year end, certain items which are owing and have not been paid are accrued with the appropriate accounts being charged.

No record is made of fixed assets.

GENERAL FUND

An examination of the records of the Tax Collector indicated that of the total Assessment charged to the Tax Collector of \$474,879.90 collections of \$409,066.98 or 86.14% were realized. With respect to prior years taxes receivable, \$30,664.86 or 55.6% was collected and \$21,265.37 or 38.59% was secured by tax liens. Abatements and taxes charged off amounted to \$2,799.32.

It should be noted that the valuation of real property has been brought up to the standard set by the State Bureau of Taxation.

The tax liens which are self foreclosing were increased by \$2,500.26 and totaled \$12,922.94 at the year end.

In accordance with authority received at the Annual Town Meeting three parcels of tax acquired property were sold on which a profit of \$287.75 was realized.

The actual amount received plus the beginning balance of State Revenue Sharing totaled \$62,533.01. Of this amount \$57,000 was used to reduce the amount necessary to be raised through taxation leaving a balance of \$5,533.01 to be carried forward to the ensuing year.

Excise tax receipts of \$45,000 were appropriated to Winter Roads. The actual receipts totaled \$70,850.50 leaving an unallocated balance of \$25,850.50 which was transferred to Unappropriated Surplus together with \$2,396.40 which was received from the Boat Excise Tax.

Unexpended balances in certain appropriation accounts totaling \$13,489.42 were carried forward to the ensuing year for expenditure.

Unappropriated Surplus was increased by \$27,433.37 as a result of the years operations and totaled \$70,041.93 at the year end.

SPECIAL REVENUE FUND

This fund is wholly comprised of Federal Revenue Sharing accounts.

One entitlement payment was converted to a Certificate of Deposit immediately upon receipt. The other three payments were deposited to and are a part of the General Fund Cash.

Appropriations totaling \$35,712 were authorized at the Annual Meeting to be taken from this account.

DEBT FUND

The payment of \$100,000 on bonds maturing was made as well as the interest owing on the bond issue.

Bonds outstanding at the year end totaled \$600,000 and mature at the rate of \$100,000 per year. These bonds were issued under the authority of the Maine Industrial Building Authority and under the terms of the agreement are to be paid by the Irving Tanning Company.

TRUST AND RESERVE FUND

All investments of the trust funds are carried at cost.

The total amount of the interest earned on the Cemetery Perpetual Care and Water Funds as well as the proceeds from the sale of lots was transferred to the Maintenance of Cemeteries account.

Interest earned on the Ministerial and School Fund was not transferred to the school account and is available for transfer in the ensuing year.
