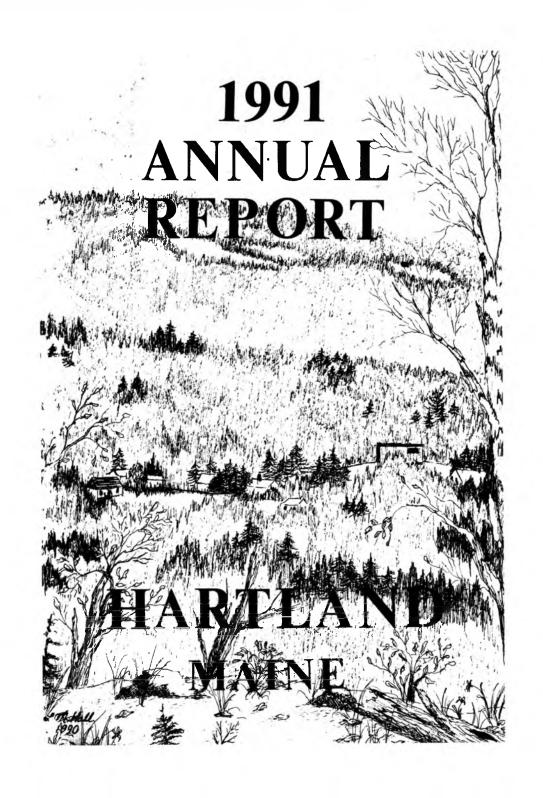

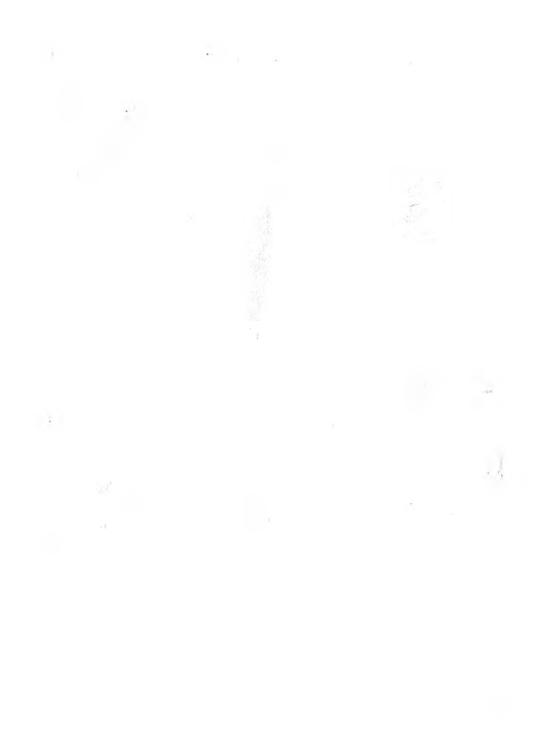

LETTER OF TRANSMITTAL

Many projects were completed for the community in 1991.

The EDA Grant Project which included the closeout of the old sludge landfill was finally completed in November.

Data for another grant application is awaiting increase in production and the work force at Irving Tanning Co. Once the increases occur the second application will be submitted for addition upgrade at the treatment plant.

Irving Tanning Co's renovation project for 1991 was a great success with open home taking place in October.

Under the direction of Richard Larochelle, President of the company and the team work displayed by management and employees, this is certainly a project that the community should look at with pride.

The Road Commissioner, Arland Stedman did an excellent job in 1991, in completing the road work which was designated. We are all very appreciative of the dedication he has shown.

The Community now has less than 5 miles of dirt road that needs to be constructed.

A road program that was put together by 1st Selectman, Ed Laughton, has proved to be very beneficial.

The Comprehensive Planning Committee has moved very slowly and carefully and that has proven to be in the best interest of all of us. Had this plan been put together quickly, the community could have been committed to things in the future that could not have been implemented. A special Town Meeting will be held in June of 1992 to enact the new plan along with upgrade of several of our ordinances.

The CDBG and Beautification Committee continues to do an excellent job in upgrade of the Community. I call this committee our roses along with one flowering crab (Roger Martin)!

A special thank you goes out to our Neighborhood Watch Committee. This committee has certainly been the key to turning around the crime problems in Hartland and certainly is an example of a team working together.

In the hard economical times we have seen in 1991 and what lies ahead in both 1992 and 1993, we should all feel a sense of security as we look at the churches, clubs, organizations and individuals working together in the best interest of all.

The Tri-Town Food Bank, the Baptist Church Food Bank, the youth groups in all three of our churches, the Church Outreach Programs, the Lion's Club, Outlook Club, Couple's Club and the list goes on and on.

I feel very confident that Hartland will emerge from 1992 and 1993 as a very closely knit community.

The resources are there and you are one of those resources.

The financial and related statements of the General Fund, Debt Fund and Trust and Reserve Fund have been examined. The examination was made in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards and accordingly included such tests of accounting records and such other auditing procedures as were considered necessary in the circumstances.

In our opinion, the financial statements referred to above present the assets and liabilities arising from cash transactions of the General Fund, Debt Fund and Trust and Reserve Fund of the Town of Hartland at December 31, 1991, and the revenues collected and expenditures paid during the year then ended on a basis consistent with that of the preceding year.

The related information on the supporting schedules which are presented as additional supplementary data has been subjected to the tests and other auditing procedures applied in the examination of the financial statements.

Summary of Policies

The Maine Statutes require that every municipality shall have a post audit of its records each year and that the report of audit shall contain: letter of transmittal, comments, comparative balance sheet, analysis of surplus, statement of departmental operations, statement of valuation, assessment and collection, statement of cash receipts and disbursements and reconciliation of cash balance.

It is the policy of the Town of Hartland to print the report of audit in its entirety in its Annual Town Report which is dispensed to all of the voters of the Town at the time of the Annual Town Meeting. Others may obtain copies of the Annual Town Report upon request.

Authority for appropriations for running the municipality and the method by which they are to be funded is given by vote of the voters at the Annual Town Meeting. The warrants for the County Tax and the Town's share of the SAD#48 appropriation are given by the County Commissioners and the Trustees of School Administrative District #48 respectively.

The assessment of taxes resulting from establishing the valuation of both real and personal property and establishing the rate of taxation is the responsibility of the Board of Assessors. The Board of Assessors also has authority to include in the assessment of taxes an amount for overlay in an amount not to exceed 5% of the total appropriations as well as the responsibility for authorizing and approving abatements where warranted. They are autonomous in this respect.

Receipts from State Revenue Sharing are used to reduce the amount necessary to be raised by taxation of real and personal property to finance appropriations made at the Annual Town Meeting.

It is also customary for authority to be given at the Annual Town Meeting to finance in full or in part certain appropriations by transfer from Unappropriated Surplus as well as transfers from Excise Tax receipts.

Authority for disposing of Town owned property is also voted at the Annual Town Meeting.

Basis of Accounting

With the exception of property taxes, revenue is recorded when received in cash. Property taxes are recorded when committed, since they are measurable and are due within the fiscal year. At the year end certain ascertainable items of revenue, such as reimbursable items of expense which are due but have not been received are accrued with the proper accounts being credited.

Expenditures are recorded on a cash basis with the charge being made to the accounts when the warrants are authorized by the Board of Selectmen. At the year end, certain items which are owing and have not been paid are accrued with the appropriate accounts being charged.

There is no record of fixed assets.

General Fund

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The examination of the records of the Treasurer and Tax Collector indicated that all receipts had been deposited promptly and intact to the credit of the Town as required by statute. The balances of several of the accounts for which appropriations had been made, but have not yet been expended were converted to time deposits and/or certificates of deposit in order that interest might be earned for these accounts. The cash balance of \$94,408.72 in General Fund Cash was comprised of the following:

Unpaid taxes amounting to \$43,740.33 which had been assessed in 1990 were secured by self foreclosing tax mortgage liens. These liens if not paid within 18 months mature and become tax acquired property. Payments on unmatured tax liens totaled \$32,120.15 and matured tax liens amounting to \$2,195.04 were transferred to tax acquired property. Sales of tax acquired property amounted to \$3,987.74 during the year and \$8,042.79 was outstanding at the year end.

Collections from excise taxes assessed against motor vehicles totaled \$99,183.57 and those against boats amounted to \$3,152.40. At the annual Town meeting \$75,000 of excise tax monies were allocated to certain appropriation accounts. Unallocated excise taxes were credited to Unappropriated Surplus.

Receipts from State Revenue Sharing totaling \$92,000 were used to reduce the amount necessary to be raised by taxation. The unallocated balance of \$4,272.38 was carried forward to the insuing year for allocation.

Unexpended balances in certain appropriation accounts amounting to \$89,595.14 were carried forward to the ensuing year. This represents an increase of \$20,044.34 over that of the preceding year.

The unappropriated surplus of \$132,734.09 reflects an increase of \$1,366.78 over the balance at the beginning of the year.

Debt Fund

The interest on the bonds and the bonds maturing in the bonds issued under the authority and quarantee of the Maine Industrial Building Authority were paid as they came due. Outstanding bonds in this issue amount ot \$100,000 and will mature in 1992. During the year the Town issued \$400,000 in General Obligation Bonds to finance the costs of expansion of the secure landfill and improvements to the sewage disposal facility. Under the terms of agreement, the Irving Tanning Company agrees to pay 95% of all debt service costs including principal and interest as well as costs of issuance associated with the bonds and any and all bonds issued in renewal, replacement or refunding.

Trust and Reserve Fund

All of the investments of the Trust Funds are carried at cost. One security which matured in 1990 has not yet been redeemed.

The total amount of income received on the Cemetery Perpetual Care, Pine Grove Cemetery and Water Funds was transferred to the Maintenance of Cemeteries account. The income earned by the Ministerial and School Fund was carried forward to the ensuing year for transfer to the SAD #48 account. Comparative Balance Sheet
