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

LETTER OF TRANSMITTAL

This past summer you, as citizens, voted a comprehensive plan, upgraded your building ordinance, approved a minimum state required Shoreland Zoning Ordinance, enacted a maximum weight limit for secondary raods and passed a requirement for hour restrictions on use of town owned property. You had a busy summer and I think that I got writer's cramp!

A special thank you to the Planning Board, Traffic Committee, Neighborhood Watch Committee and the Comprehensive Planning Committee for their time on each of these projects.

The Hartland Town Employees had their own committee agenda in 1992. Certain days were set aside when employees from all departments joined together and completed a project. The front steps of the Town Hall were repaired, the landscaping at our Treatment plant was completed, the Basketball Court fence was painted and the court was cleaned up, one day was spent to paint and repair at the pool, and the bandstand had a coat of primer to preserve the wood before it is stained this summer.

The employees did a fine job and they all should know that we are very proud of them.

1992 was a quiet year for the community as we prepared for the roller coaster ride in 1993.

The Town of Hartland is again picking on the DEP by refusing to close our town dump. We plan to comply with all State regulations as our time frame permits, as at this point we feel that our time frame is in the best interest of the community.

In 1992, the Town should be looking at some very positive changes.

The Industry is again planning a major project, a 24 unit elderly housing project is in the final paperwork stages, and a large commercial property construction is planned.

In addition to these 3 private development projects, mandatory recycling will come before the voters this summer with plans for a massive recycling project.

The CDBG & Beautification Committee will be working on a rental property ordinance, the Planning Board will be working on a variance procedure for camp owners, the Conservation Committee will be working on a park and the Neighborhood Watch Committee will be setting goals for the future.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank the various committees in the community for the excellent jobs they did in 1992 and also to thank the citizens for the support they have shown over the past and very difficult year.

With the state of the economy, more difficult times are ahead.

In December, I again accepted the appointment as Town Manager for the Town of Hartland for the 1993 term.

I look forward to working with each and every citize in making 1993 a good year for Hartland.
