SAGADAHOC, SS.

To Collingwood C. Shea constable of the town of Arrowsic, County of Sagadahoc:

Greetings:

In the name of the State of Maine, you are hereby requested to notify and warn the inhabitants of the said town of Arrowsic, qualified by law to vote in town affairs, to assemble in the Town Hall in said town on the fifth day of March, A. D. 1934, at 10 o'clock in the forenoon to act on the following articles to wit:

- Art. 1 To choose by ballot a moderator to preside at said meeting.
- Art. 2 To choose by ballot a town clerk for the ensuing year.
- Art. 3 To see if the town will vote to accept the report of the town officers.
- Art. 4 To choose by ballot selectmen, assessors and overseers of the poor and all other necessary town officers.
- Art. 5 To see if the town will vote to allow the use of the schoolhouse for religious meetings for the ensuing year.
- Art. 6 To fix the date when taxes for the ensuing year

shall become due and payable.

- Art. 7 To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the support of poor.
- Art. 8 To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for contingent expenses for the ensuing year.
- Art. 9 To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the support of schools for the ensuing year.
- Art. 10 To see if the town will vote yes or no on the question of appropriating and raising money necessary to entitle the town to State Aid as provided in sec. 20. chapter 28 revised statutes of 1930.
- Art. 11 To see what sum the town will appropriate and raise for the improvement of the section of State Aid road as outlined in the report of the State Highway Commission, in addition to the amounts regularly raised for the care of ways, highways and bridges, under the provisions of sec. 19, chapter 28, revised statutes of 1930 or under the provisions of sec. 3, chapter 175, public laws of 1933.
- Art. 12 To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the repair of highways and bridges for the ensuing year.
- Art. 13 To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for maintenance of State Aid highways during the ensuing year.
- Art. 14 To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to pay for cutting bushes to comply

with Sec. 3, Chap. 145 from any unexpended money in the treasury.

- Art. 15 To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the repairs of schoolhouse for the ensuing year.
- Art. 16 To see if the town will authorize the treasurer with the approval of the Selectmen to procure the loan of money as may be necessary for the ensuing year.
- Art. 17 To see if the town will vote to accept the list of jurors as prepared by the town officers.
- Art. 18 To see what salary the town will vote for the Tax Collector and Treasurer.
- Art. 19 To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to sell part or all of any property in its possession during the year.
- Art. 20 To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the maintenance of third class road during the ensuing year.
- Art. 21 To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise toward the support of public County Health Nursing under the State Dept. of Health to continue work with mothers and children.
- Art. 22 To see what sum of money the town will vote for Mother's Aid.
- Art. 23 To see if the town will vote to use the excise tax from automobiles for the care of snow.
- Art. 24 To see if the town will vote to authorize the Assessors to ^{Reserve} ~~receive~~ any amount appropriated by the town for State Aid highway construction in excess of the amount required to meet State apportionments.

The Selectmen will be in session at the town hall one-half hour before the time of said meeting for the purpose of correcting the list of voters.

Hereof fail not and make due returns of this Warrant with your doings thereon to the town clerk at the time and place of holding said meeting.

Am pleased to note that milk is being served each noon during the winter term.

The Bureau of Health of the State Department of Health and Welfare has asked the town for an appropriation for school nursing.

The meetings of the School Committee have been very cordial. I have enjoyed the visits at the school, also the League entertainments.
