To Collingwood C. Shea, Constable of the Town of Arrowsic, County of Sagadahoc,

GREETINGS:

In the name of the State of Maine, you are hereby requested to notify and warn the inhabitants of the said Town of Arrowsic, qualified by law to vote in town affairs, to assemble in Town Hall in said town on the seventh day of March, A. D. 1938, at ten o'clock in the forenoon, to act on the following articles, to wit:—

ARTICLE 1—To choose by ballot a Moderator to preside at said meeting.

ART. 2—To choose by ballot a Town Clerk for the ensuing year.

ART. 3—To see if the town will vote to accept the report of town officers.

ART. 4—To choose by ballot Selectmen, Assessors, Overseers of Poor and all other necessary town officers.

ART. 5—To see if the town will vote to allow the use of the schoolhouse for religious meetings for the ensuing year.

ART. 6—To fix the date when taxes for the ensuing year shall become due and payable.

ART. 7—To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for contingent expenses for the ensuing year.

ART. 8—To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the support of schools for the ensuing year.

ART. 9—To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the repair of highways and bridges for the ensuing year.

ART. 10—To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the maintenance of State Aid Highways during ensuing year.

ART. 11—To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to cut bushes to comply with Sec. 3, Chap. 145, Public Laws.

ART. 12—To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the repairs of schoolhouses for ensuing year.

ART. 13—To see if the town will authorize the Treasurer, with the approval of the Selectmen, to procure the loan of money as may be necessary for the ensuing year.

ART. 14—To see what salary the town will vote for the Tax Collector and Treasurer.

ART. 15—To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to sell part or all of any property in its possession during the year.

ART. 16—To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the maintenance of Third Class Road during the ensuing year.

ART. 17—To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise toward the support of Public County Health Nursing under the State Department of Health to continue work with mothers and children.

ART. 18—To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for snow removal,

ART. 19—To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for interest for the ensuing year.

ART. 20—To see what sum of money the town may charge for identification cards on the Carlton Bridge.

ART. 21—To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of \$450.00 with the understanding that the State shall tar all or as much of State Aid Road No. 1 as is fit for such treatment.

ART. 22—To see what sum the town will appropriate for State Aid Road construction (in addition to the amount regularly raised for the care of ways, highways and bridges) under the provisions of Section 19, Chapter 28, Revised Statutes of 1930 or under the provisions of Section 3, Chapter 229, Public Laws of 1937.

ART. 23—To see if the town will vote to authorize the Assessors to rescind the amount voted for State Aid Road if the plan to tar State Aid Road No. 1 should be carried out.

ART. 24—To see if the town will vote that the Assessors may rescind part or all of the amount voted for tar surface on State Aid Road No. 1 if the proposed plan for the State Highway Commission to tar the road should not be carried out.

ART. 25—To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the repairs of the Town Hall.

The Selectmen will be in session at the Town Hall one-half hour before the time of said meeting for the purpose of correcting the list of voters.

Hereof fail not and make due returns of this warrant with your doings thereon to the Town Clerk at the time and place of holding said meeting.

The State Bureau of Health and Child Welfare has asked the town for an appropriation for School Nursing.

Health work in the school is an important objective nowadays.
