This has been a very successful school year. We have been fortunate in securing the services of efficient teachers. They have worked faithfully for the interest of the pupils and the community, and I am pleased to speak words of praise in their behalf. The pupils have formed the habit of doing thorough work, and have come to feel a certain responsibility of making the most of their time and books. The parents have co-operated in every way possible. The attitude they have shown toward the school work finds direct proof in the large gain in attendance.

So far the work of the helping teacher has been very successful. It has tended to increase the interest along some lines of work. Regular visits to all schools have been made and nearly all of the teachers have visited her room.

REPAIRS.

The following permanent improvements have been made during the past year: A new hard wood floor laid in the upper room at Corea, modern outbuildings, with sanitary closets, erected at Prospect Harbor, also a new concrete walk built, and in all of schools, minor repairs were made, as were necessary.

In discussing the repairs for the future, I suggest that proper sheds and toilets be provided at Birch Harbor. I would also suggest that a special appropriation be made to purchase land and enlarge the lot at Birch Harbor. This can be done at a very small expense.

In conclusion, I wish to thank the teachers for their faithful work and co-operation, and to the school committee and citizens for their loyalty and support, I am indeed grateful.
