To the Superintending School Committee and the citizens of the Town of Gouldsboro, I submit my fourth annual report for the year ending February 7, 1923.

I am pleased to say that the work done in our schools during the past year has been very satisfactory. We have been fortunate in the selection of our teachers. They have all labored hard and excellent results have followed. The interest the parents have manifested in the work has been especially helpful and encouraged the teachers. Through the work of the teachers, with the co-operation of the parents, a new victrola was purchased for the schools at West Gouldsboro, Prospect and Birch Harbors. At the beginning of the fall term the Pond school was closed and the scholars transported to West Gouldsboro. Owing to sickness and bad roads it was necessary to close some of our schools during the winter term. They will be re-opened whenever conditions permit.

REPAIRS.

Along the line of repairs made the past year, new slate blackboards have been placed in the room at Prospect Harbor, also a new heater installed. Modern out-buildings with sanitary toilets at Birch Harbor and the lot enlarged. Repairs on all other buildings as were necessary. I feel that considerable appreciation is due the citizens of the town in that they have given their hearty support to the school work and have raised sufficient money for the schools, as would enable us to carry on the work efficiently. The usual appropriation should be made this year to finish the work at Birch Harbor and make the necessary changes at Gouldsboro. In conclusion, I wish to thank the teachers for their faithful work and loyalty; to the citizens for your helpful attitude and the members of the committee for your loyalty and support, I extend my sincere thanks.
