## REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS.

Superintending School Committee:

To the Superintending School Committee and Citizens of Gouldsboro:

I herewith submit my first annual report of the condition of our schools and of the work done during the past year.

As a whole, our schools are progressing satisfactorily under teachers who, without exception, are putting forth their best efforts for the pupils under their instruction. To maintain a high standard in our schools, it is necessary that we have good teachers and retain them as long as possible. Since all teachers differ in personal characteristics and in methods of instruction, it requires several weeks for pupils to become accustomed to new teachers and for new teachers to get to understand their new pupils. These several weeks do not yield maximum returns. Thus, every time we change teachers, it means so much time lost in readjustment. From the records of the past ten years, I find that our teachers remain with us in the same school an average of only about three-fourths of a year.

At a cost somewhat below that estimated, our building committee, George Joy, Nate Young and Lula Strout, chairman, had ready for occupancy on November 2, the new building at Corea. Much credit is due this committee for the excellent work it has done in giving us a building well suited to our needs. In heating arrangement, sanitary provision and every other respect, it meets every requirement.

Due to the fact that last year it was found necessary to hold over the closing of books some of our teachers' pay vouchers, and pay them out of this year's resources, our accounts this year show expenditure for more than the thirty weeks really taught this year. I have thought it advisable to bring the accounts up to date, so as to have all of next year's appropriations to run next year's schools.

Our most pressing problem at the present time is that of supplying our children with sufficient suitable text-books. Due partly to the loss of books occasioned by the burning of our building at Corea last year, we, at present, not only have barely enough books to meet the requirements, but many of them are really unfit for use. By careful selection and careful use of books, it could be arranged so that at the end of three or four years each separate school would have its own supply of up-to-date books. The present system of carrying books from one school to another several times each year, makes confusion in the records and unnecessary wear and tear on the books.

I would recommend that at our annual meeting we make provision for money for the display of the flag at all our school buildings, in order the better to teach our children the principles of patriotism and the object and principles of our government.

In closing, I wish to thank the school board, teachers and citizens of the town for their splendid support and co-operation in providing the educational advantages that our children so well deserve.
