# WARRANT.

To Samuel W. Bridges, one of the constables of the town of Isle au Haut, in the county of Hancock,

## GREETING:

In the name of the State of Maine, you are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants of the said town of Isle au Haut, qualified by law to vote in town affairs, to assemble at the school-house in Dist. No. 1, in said town, on the 10th day of March, A. D., 1902, at 9 o'clock in the forenoon, to act on the following articles to wit:

- 1 To choose a moderator to preside at said meeting.
- 2 To choose a town Clerk for the ensuing year.
- 3 To choose Selectmen and vote their compensation.
- 4 To choose assessors of taxes.
- 5 To choose overseers of the poor.
- 6 To choose a Treasurer and vote his compensation.
- 7 To choose a collector of taxes and vote his compensation.
- 8 To choose a Superintending School Committee, one that goes out.
- 9 To choose an Auditor of accounts.
- 10 To see if the town will vote to join with other towns in employing a superintendent of schools.
- 11 To choose a Superintendent of Schools.
- 12 To choose a road commissioner.
- 13 To choose surveyors of wood and lumber.
- 14 To choose fence viewers.
- 15 To choose a pound keeper.
- 16 To choose a field driver.
- 17 To choose constables.

- 18 To choose truant officers.
  - 19 To see what sum of money the town will vote for the support of poor.
  - 20 To see what sum of money the town will vote for current expenses.
  - 21 To see what sum of money the town will vote for support of schools.
  - 22 To see what sum of money the town will vote for free text books.
  - 23 To see what sum of money the town will vote for repairs of roads and bridges.
  - 24 To see what sum of money the town will vote for clearing roads of snow.
  - 25 To see what sum of money the town will vote for the repairs of school buildings.
  - 26 To see what sum of money the town will vote for Superintendent's salary.
  - 27 To see if the town will vote to have the names of all delinquent tax payers printed in our annual reports.
  - 28 To see if the town will vote to build the road from Duck Harbor to Head Harbor, connecting them, and how much money the town will vote to raise and how it shall be raised.
  - 29 To see what action the town will take in relation to buying a road machine.
  - 30 To see if the town will vote to hire a room in the upper part of the factory building for a town office.
  - 31 To act on any other business that may come before said meeting.

---

### Report of Superintendent of Schools.



To the inhabitants of the Town of Isle au Haut:

Having served as Superintendent of Schools for the year ending March 1902, I would respectfully submit the following report:—

I am pleased to be able to report the schools in a prosperous condition. The schools are well classified and prepared to follow a course of study which should be printed and placed in the hands of each pupil. The reason for not having a printed course of study was the appropriation for text books was not sufficient to place a copy in the hands of each pupil, but the course has been strictly followed by the teachers.

The advantage of a course of study is that each pupil knows what he or she is to study and accomplish before advancing to the next class. The pupils in each class recite together in all the studies; therefore each pupil learns as much from his fellow pupil as from the teacher.

It was thought best to discontinue the school in No 2, for the winter term and give all permission to attend the school in No. 1, as the intention of the voters was to have a High School if the money could be so expended which would be located in No, 1, but as the \$75.00 appropriated was voted under the article for common schools the State Superintendent decided it would have to be expended on the common schools, however the intention of having a

winter term of school in No. 1 has been carried out although it has not been a High School it has answered all purposes desired.

One of the most important points to be considered in a system of schools is that of employing teachers. To the teachers are entrusted the boys and girls of your town, and to them you look for proper training of your children in the schools and as most boys and girls complete their education in the public schools it is very necessary that they obtain a good English education and be thoroughly drilled in morals, obedience, truthfulness, and industry so when they leave the school they will be fitted to become useful citizens and take their places in life with the best of our land.

I wish to very earnestly recommend that your appropriation for public schools be sufficient for thirty weeks in each school, and I am certain you will be well satisfied with the result, as the cost is much less to educate your children at home than it is to send them to a fitting school to pursue the same studies they might take at home.
