We would respectfully recommend that the town raise for the ensuing year—for schools \$2500—for the poor and other expenses \$3000—and for the roads and bridges \$2500 in money.

REPORT

—OF THE—

SUPERVISOR F SCHOOLS, FOR THE YEAR ENDING MARCH 12, 1883.

District No. 1.

The Spring Term commenced April 24, and closed June 30—a term of 10 weeks, taught by Miss Essie H. Park. Miss Park never taught before, but we hope she may continue; she has qualities for a good teacher.

The Fall Term commenced September 4, and closed November 10—a term of 10 weeks, taught by Miss Mame E. Park. Miss Mame Park has taught this school before. Teachers generally do not get a school the second time at the same place, unless satisfaction is given the first time.

The Winter Term commenced December 11, and closed February 22, '83,—a term of 10 weeks, taught by your Supervisor.

District No. 2.

The Spring Terms commenced April 24, and closed June 30—terms of ten weeks. The High School was taught by Mrs. Mary R. Perkins; Mrs. Perkins is an old teacher, and has had much experience. The Primary was taught by Miss Annie M. Gould; Miss Gould is a good teacher for young scholars, and had she remained in that school, good results might have been seen from her teaching.

The Fall Terms commenced September 4, and closed November 10—terms of 10 weeks. The High was taught by Miss Annie M. Gould; the Primary by Miss Mary E. Pierce.

The Winter Terms commenced December 4, and closed February 23, '83,—terms of 12 weeks, by the same teachers. Miss Gould for the High and Miss Pierce for the Primary.

Had Miss Gould remained a primary teacher and a male been employed for the High, an advancement in scholarship might have been seen. Some think it a saving to hire cheap teachers, and it is, as far as money is concerned. As long as agents hire cheap teachers or try to run schools cheaply, no good results will come from the teaching.

Union Districts Nos. 3, 4 and 5.

The Spring Terms commenced April 24, and closed June 30—terms of 10 weeks. High taught by Mr. Frederick C. Stevens; Grammar by Miss Emma A. Morrow; Intermediate by Miss Hattie S. Nickerson; Primary No. 1 was taught by Miss Ella S. Morrow; Primary No. 2 by Miss Anna E. Colson; Primary No. 3 by Miss Lida J. Curtis.

The Fall Terms commenced September 4, and closed Nov. 10—terms of 10 weeks—with the exception of Primary No. 3, which commenced September 11, and closed December 1—a term of 12 weeks.

No Winter Term in *this* district.

The Winter Terms commenced December 4, all but the High, which commenced Dec. 5, and closed February 9, '83; Primary No. 2 closed February 2, '83; Primary No. 1 closed February 16, '83. The schools for the year were taught by the same teachers, with the exception of Primary No. 1.

At the close of the Spring Term, Miss Morrow resigned, and Miss Emma F. Mortland took the remaining two terms of the year, and did good work with the little ones. The High and Grammar Schools are quite small, and one good teacher could teach both as well as two.

District No. 6.

The Spring Term in this district commenced May 1, and closed June 23—an 8 weeks term, taught by Miss Hattie M. Royal. There are but a few scholars in this school, but those few need such instruction that some improvement can be seen in that time.

The Fall and Winter Term as one, commenced September 18 and closed December 22—a term of 13 weeks. This term was taught by Miss Annette F. Nickerson. It is better to employ good teachers, even if more wages have to be given.

District No. 7.

The Spring Term in this district commenced May 1, and closed June 23—an 8 weeks term, taught by Miss Kate C.

Towle; Miss Towle has taught this school before, and good work follows her.

The Fall Term commenced August 14, and closed Oct. 6, an 8 weeks term.

The Winter Term commenced November 14, and closed February 1, '83,—a term of 12 weeks. The Fall and Winter Terms were taught by the same teacher, Mrs. Mary R. Perkins; Mrs. Perkins has had a good deal of experience, and has been for many years a good instructor.

District No. 8.

The Spring Term commenced May 8, and closed June 30—an 8 weeks term. This term was taught by Miss Estelle L. Treat; Miss Treat is young, and never having taught before, did not do so well as an older teacher with more experience; but as she advances in years and knowledge, perhaps will do better.

The Fall Term commenced August 28, and closed November 7—a term of 10 weeks—taught by Miss Alice G. Kane; Miss Kane is an old teacher, and a little behind the times.

The Winter Term commenced November 27, and closed February 23, '83,—a term of 13 weeks, taught by Mr. Daniel W. Billings; Mr. Billings has taught this school a number of Winter Terms: some are satisfied, others dissatisfied. Experienced teachers, if they keep posting themselves, give better satisfaction; but if they do not, it would be better for the scholars not to attend their schools.

District No. 9.

The Spring Term in this district commenced May 8, and closed July 1—an 8 weeks term; then a vacation, after which the school commenced August 14, and continued four weeks more, making 12. The term was taught by Miss Estelle A. Thompson. Miss Thompson was a good teacher, and did well with the scholars; but some of the parents were dissatisfied.

In this district there was no Fall Term.

The Winter Term commenced December 11, and closed Mar. 9, '83,—a term of 13 weeks, taught by Mr. Henry E. Greeley. Mr. Greeley is a good teacher, and has done well wherever he has been.

District No. 10.

The Spring Term commenced April 10, and closed May 31. The teacher having taught 7 weeks and 2 days and not

suiting members of the district, the agent, unbeknown to me, thought best to have the school stop. The teacher was Miss Georgietta J. Nickerson.

The Fall and Winter Term as one, commenced September 11, and closed December 8—a term of 13 weeks, taught by Miss Velzora J. West; Miss West, I think, suited one and all.

District No. 11.

The Spring Term in this district commenced April 24, and closed June 30—a term of 10 weeks, taught by the same teacher who taught the previous year, Mrs. F. E. Roulstone. After quite a vacation, there not being any Fall Term, the Winter Term commenced December 18, and closed Feb. 16, '83—a term of 9 weeks, taught by Mr. A. E. Nickerson; Mr. Nickerson taught this school last winter, but the scholars have made more improvement the past term, and others beside the teacher could see it.

District No. 12.

This school still continues under the charge of the Belfast officials.

The schools in town the year that is past, have been longer, and the average attendance of all away from the village better than in previous years.

The town voted to raise for the support of the schools last year, \$2500. I would respectfully recommend that the same be raised this year.
