GOLDER SCHOOL.

The money to be expended in the school at Belgrade Village.

WHITTIER SCHOOL.

Spring term was conducted by Mrs. Alice E. Farnham of this town, whose unwearied zeal carried the school successfully through a term of eight weeks. This teacher believes in doing her work well. Good progress was made under Mrs. Farnham's instruction. Whole number, 21; average 19.

Winter term taught by Mr. Fred W. Sanders of New Sharon. Mr. Sanders commenced his duties in earnest, and was eminently successful. Scholars made very good progress. Whole number, 20; average, 17.

BLAISDELL SCHOOL.

School for the year taught by Miss Rilla M. Hersom of Belgrade. Miss Hersom exerted a good moral influence, was devoted to the interests of the school and the scholars made good improvement. Whole number, 21; average, 18.

ROBINS SCHOOL.

School for the year under the instruction of Mr. John E. Downs of Smithfield. Mr. Downs has taught this school several successive terms with success. The closing exercises showed that the classes had been well drilled, the teacher believing in doing everything in the best and most thorough manner. This was a very very profitable school. Whole number, 21; average, 15.

DUDLEY SCHOOL.

Spring term, Mrs. Lilla M. Tuttle of Smithfield, teacher. This teacher labored with her usual zeal and with good results. The order was very good, and the scholars made good progress. Whole number, 16; average, 15.

Winter term under the charge of Mr. John E. Downs of Smithfield. What was said of Mr. Downs in the Robins school can well be applied here. All were earnestly at work when the school was visited.
