SCHOOL REPORT FOR THE YEAR 1896.

At our annual meeting last March the town voted to raise four hundred dollars for the support of schools. The state school fund amounted to three hundred fifty-five dollars and thirty-nine cents making our total school fund seven hundred fifty-five dollars and thirty-nine cents.

There were one hundred and forty-six scholars in town the first day of last April. We have six schoolhouses in town and we have had two terms of school in each. The school money in the union district expended there amounting to twenty dollars and seventy cents. Total number of weeks of school kept in town one hundred and twenty, or twenty weeks for each school.

The school in district No. 1 was taught by Mrs. Alice E. Farnham.

The school in district No. 3, the spring term was taught by Mrs. Alida LeBaron; fall term taught by Ernest L. Blaisdell.

The school in district No. 4 was taught by Mrs. Myrtle M. Blaisdell.

The school in district No. 5 was taught by Miss Addie Mosher.

The school in district No. 6 was taught by Mr. John E. Downs.

The school in district No. 7 was taught by Miss Josie Clement.

In relation to the work done in our schools during the past year we can truly say that in most of them the advancement made by the scholars was entirely satisfactory. The rural school problem is occupying more of the attention of educators at the present time than any other subject connected with the education of the young, and we think the time is not far distant when scholars living in rural districts will have the advantage of longer schools.
