TOWN MEETING WARRANT

To Geo. G. Downs, a constable in the town of Rome in the county of Kennebec, greeting in the name of the State of Maine you are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants of the said town of Rome qualified by law to vote in town affairs to assemble at the Town House in said town on the seventh day of March at 10 o'clock in the forenoon to act on the following articles to wit:

Article 1. To choose a moderator to preside in said meeting.

- Article 2. To choose all necessary town officers for the year ensuing.
- Article 3. To see if the town will grant and raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the maintenance and support of schools and the poor and repair of roads and bridges and to defray all other town charges for the ensuing year.
- Article 4. To see if the town will vote to have a road commissioner and elect the same.
- Article 5. To see if the town will vote to instruct the selectmen to hire money for any deficiencies which may occur in town liabilities for the ensuing year.
- Article 6. To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money for building State road.
- Article 7. To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money for the repairs on schoolhouses.
- Article 8. To see how taxes shall be collected and when made payable.
- Article 9. To vote yes or no to entitle the town to State aid for highways.
- Article 10. To see if the town will vote to establish a school in the Robbins district, so called.
- Article 11. To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money to purchase a piece of land to enlarge the cemetery or purchase a new site.
- Article 12. To see if the town will vote to build a town hall and raise a sum of money to build the same.
- Article 13. To see if the town will vote to instruct the Superintendent of Schools or School board to contract for the admission of our High School scholars in some High school in some adjoining town.
- Article 14. To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money for the tuition of High School scholars.
- Article 15. To see if the town will vote to accept the list of jurors as prepared by the revising board.

Article 16. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.
