



S. S. COMMITTEE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Rome, We the S. S. Committee beg to submit the following report.

During the year just passed we have endeavored to make a start towards permanent repairs on our schoolhouses. After looking over the situation we decided to repair the Long Pond schoolhouse, the Whittier schoolhouse and the Robbins schoolhouse.

The amount of appropriation for repairs of schoolhouses was one hundred and fifty dollars (\$150.). Which gave to each of your Committee the amount of fifty dollars (\$50.). The Long Pond schoolhouse has had a hard pine ceiling put in, windows repaired and the buildings painted. With a little extra expense this can be made a very comfortable and respectable school building.

The Robbins schoolhouse has been partially clapboarded, one side of the roof and the woodshed roof has been shingled. The school building has been partially painted but on account of the cold weather it was impossible to finish the work. But it is the intention of your Committee that the work be completed this present year.

We especially recommend that the question of putting in new seats be seriously considered as these seats are very hard and uncomfortable for our pupils.

TOWN MEETING WARRANT

To George G. Downs, a Constable in the Town of Rome, in the County of Kennebec, Greeting, in the name of the State of Maine: You are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants of the said Town of Rome, qualified by law to vote in town affairs to assemble at the Town House in said Town, on the sixth day of March at 10 o'clock in the forenoon, to act on the following articles, to wit:

Article 1—

To choose a Moderator to preside in said meeting.

Article 2-

To choose all necessary Town Officers for the ensuing year.

Article 3—

To see if the Town will vote to have a Road Commissioner and elect the same.

Article 4-

To see if the Town will grant and raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the maintenance and support of Schools and the Poor, and repair of Roads and Bridges, and to defray all other town charges for the ensuing year.

Article 5—

To see if the Town will vote to instruct the Selectmen to hire money for any deficiences which may occur in Town liabilities for the ensuing year.

Article 6—

To see if the Town will vote to raise a sum of money for Building State Road.

Article 7—

To see if the Town will vote to raise a sum of money for the repairs on Schoolhouses.

Article 8—

To see how taxes shall be collected, and when made payable.

Article 9—

To vote Yes or No to entitle the Town to State aid for Highways.

Article 10-

To see if the Town will vote to raise a sum of money for the grading and fencing of the Cemetery lot, bought by the Selectmen.

Article 11-

To see if the Town will vote to raise a sum of money for the Tuition of High School Scholars.

Article 12-

To see if the Town will vote to raise a sum of money to set aside as a Town Hall Fund.

Article 13—

To see if the Town will vote to instruct the school officers for married women of said town that has scholars of their own not to teach in said town.

Article 14-

To see if the Town will vote to accept the doings of the Selectmen in laying out the private closed right of way across the land of J. H. Littlefield, David Perkins and Jay Burgess.

Article 15—

To see if the Town will vote to discontinue the Town road from the Hilside Camps road to the north line of land of Mary or David Perkins.

Article 16-

To see if the Town will vote to accept the doings of the Selectmen in laying out a right of way for Ralph French across land of Edison Thurston.

Article 17—

To see if the Town will vote to establish a school in the Long Pond district so called, also in district No. 6.

Article 18-

To see if the Town will vote to instruct the Selectmen to purchase a safe for the use of the Town.

Article 19—

To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.
