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To the inhabitants of the Town of Rome I beg leave to submit this report:---

It is my purpose at this time to make mention of only a few of the facts that deserve more than passing notice by the citizens of Rome. The first fact I would mention is that the success of the public schools depends largely upon the co-operation of the parent with the school officials and the teacher. There is nothing that gives a teacher so much courage as the feeling that the parents are working in unison with her, and interested in the work she is doing. Now there is no way a parent can show their interest in the school as by visiting the school as often as opportunity offers; and many are the differences that would be better understood, if parents would make it a point to visit the school at least twice each term.

Another thing, if parents would teach their children to understand that the teacher is the governing power in the school room and that all differences must be settled with her at the school, and not at home by the parent. I believe that many of the pupils would have a much greater respect for the ability of the teacher both as a teacher and as a disciplinarian. The demand for an education to-day is greater than ever before; and when we stop to think that the greater part of the education which the average boy and girl is to have, must be secured between the ages of six and fifteen years, we should get some idea of the incalculable value of this period of time known as the "school days." The town of Rome this year has endeavored to maintain a school year of twenty-eight weeks. In the Whittier and Long Pond schools, owing to local conditions, it was deemed expedient to close the Winter terms at the end of eight weeks, hence these schools are entitled to two extra weeks each in 1912. The system of school books in town should be entirely revised as many of the books have outlived their usefulness as a text-book. The schoolhouses should in many instances have permanent repairs. We should pay more for teachers and have a better class of teachers, for we certainly can not expect to hire a first-class lot of teachers when they can get more pay in other places. During

the last year two of our pupils have entered New Sharon High school and we have others that should follow this present year. I believe that the pupil should be encouraged in this particular line and have this idea of entering High School kept before them as a stimulus for better work in the lower grades.

Now I trust these few suggestions will be received in the same kindly spirit which they are given and that future years may see a greater advancement in our town schools. Thanking all who assisted in the last years' work, I remain as ever.

TOWN MEETING WARRANT

To George G. Downs, a Constable in the Town of Rome, in the County of Kennebec, Greeting in the name of the State of Maine:

You are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants of the said Town of Rome qualified by law to vote in town affairs, to assemble at the Town House in said Town, on the fourth day of March, at 10 o'clock in the forenoon, to act on the following articles, to wit:---

Article 1-To choose a Moderator to preside in said meeting.

- Article 2—To choose all necessary Town Officers for ensuing year.
- Article 3—To see if the Town will vote to have a Road Commissioner, and elect the same.
- Article 4—To see if the Town will grant and raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the maintenance and support of school and poor and repairs of roads and bridges, and to defray all other Town charges for the ensuing year.
- Article 5-To vote Yes or No to entitle the Town to State aid, and for highways.
- Article 6-To see if the Town will vote to raise a sum of money for building State Road.
- Article 7—To see if the Town will vote to raise a sum of money for repairs on schoolhouses.
- Article 8—To see if the Town will vote to raise a sum of money for the tuition of High School scholars.
- Article 9—To see if the Town will vote to raise a sum of money to finish fencing the cemetery.
- Article 10—To see if the Town will vote to raise a sum of money for care of cemetery.
- Article 11—To see if the Town will vote to raise a sum of money to be expended on the right of way for Ralph French, as laid out by the Selectmen across land of Edson Thurston.
- Article 12—To see what action the Town will take in regard to the case of Ruby Mosher.

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- Article 13—To see what action the Town will take in regard to the disputed line between Rome and Mercer.
- Article 14—To see what sum of money the Town will vote to grant and raise to destroy the browntail moth.
- Article 15—To see if the Town will vote to instruct the Selectmen to abate the balance of the tax of John Bromily for the year 1911.
- Article 16—To see if the Town will vote to have the Collector turn in to the Town Treasurer at the end of each month all taxes collected.
- Article 17—To see if the Town will vote to establish a school in the Long Pond district, so-called, also in the Hersom district, so-called.
- Article 18—To see what price the Town will vote to establish per hour, on the highway for manual, horse, and ox labor. Also to see what price they will pay for breaking snow.

Article 19—To see if the Town will vote to allow Daniel Watson five dollars for use of watering tub, for the year 1911.

- Article 20-To see where the Town will vote to establish public watering tubs.
- Article 21—To see what compensation the Town will vote to pay for collection of taxes for the ensuing year.
- Article 22—To see if the Town will vote to instruct the Selectmen to hire money for any deficiencies which may occur in Town Liabilities for the ensuing year.
- Article 23—To transact any other necessary business that may legally come before said meeting.

The Selectmen hereby give notice that they will be in session at the Town House in said Town of Rome, at nine o'clock in the forenoon on the day of said meeting, for the purpose of correcting and revising the check list.
